### Oil meals:

Indian soy meal prices witnessed gains on expected overseas demand in Indian soy meal after Japan purchased a considerable amount during the period.

- ✓ Japan imported about 60,000 tonnes soy meal from India during the fortnight, the demand eased after earthquake and tsunami and nuclear disaster. Japan bought 4-5 vessels of Indian soy meal at \$435-\$439 per tonne, including cost and freight, said a top exporter. This will lend support to the local soybean price.
- ✓ Overall, slow down in Indian soy meal exports restricted any aggressive gains in the same. This is due to the demand shift of traditional buyers to South America owing to the competitive and attractive price offer in the same. Currently, the spread between Indian soy meal quotes (FAS Kandla USD/MT) and FOB Argentina is ruling higher at USD 50/MT compared to USD 15/MT a fortnight back.
- ✓ Currently, the solvent extractors are not keen in aggressive crushing in the beans due to disparity in soybean crushing, currently at Rs -158/MT compared to Rs 16/MT. This translates to lower crushing in April.
- ✓ In domestic front the soy meal demand remains normal. The major local buyers of the meal are poultry feed industry. India's monthly soy meal consumption stands at 2.5 lakh tonnes.
- ✓ Association of India, the export data of mustard seed DOC for the month of March 2010 is reported to 1.28 lakh tonnes compared to 0.40 lakh tonnes in the corresponding period of the previous year. In April Indian is expected to export about 1.5 lakh tones in view of improved crushing as reported by the market sources.
- ✓ India exported about 5218 MT of GN meal in March 2011. The demand is expected to rise in April, as per trade sources. The GN Cake prices are likely to remain steady to weak in near to medium term on steady demand.
- ✓ Increased old-crop carry-over stocks and better than expected production are seen raising soybean supplies of Brazil, Argentina, Paraguay, Uruguay and Bolivia by 1.9 Mn T from last year. The scenario is expected to limit the gains in soy meal price.
- ✓ Brazil's soybean harvesting has made good progress in the past two weeks and is almost complete in Mato Grosso and Mato Grosso do Sul.
- ✓ Soybean harvesting in Argentina is running behind schedule with only 4.0 Mn ha or 21% of the area done.

Sluggish demand in Indian soy meal due to the demand shift to Latin America followed by competitive price offer, weak local buying from poultry feed industry and disparity on crushing the beans will continue to weigh on the Indian soy meal price in days ahead. However, any shipment in oilmeal will push up the meal prices.




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# FAS/FOB Monthly Average Rates of Soybean Meal 2008-09/2010-11 (Oct-Sep):





## Soybean Crush Margin Status:




Soy meal Price Trend at Indore Market:
