Cotton Domestic Fundamentals:

- Cotton prices remained mixed on Saturday with Kadi remaining steady, Abohar and Muktsar ending in the green, Amravati ending in the red.
- Sentiments remained weak after acreage is expected to increase 5-10% in 2011-12 from 11.16 million • hectares in 2010-11.
- Acreage in 3 major producing states Punjab, Rajasthan and Haryana has increased by 200,000 hectares to 1.50-1.55 million hectares as on date, up from 1.35 million hectares in the previous year.
- Official added that area increased this year due to higher returns for farmers compared to other crops • like paddy in Punjab and Haryana guar in Rajasthan.

Cotton International Fundamentals:

- ICAC said in their report that cotton stocks could see a rebound in 2011-12 as world cotton production is expected to rise in 2011-12.
- Acreage is forecast to improve by 8% to 36.3 million hectares in 2011/12. This in turn will lead to higher global production at 27.3 million tons, higher by 9% comped to last year figure at 25.1 million tons.

Outlook:

- In the short term, cotton prices may trade weak on higher acreage anticipations this year.
- Cotton futures may trade weaker after ICAC report that carry-out stock may be higher.
- In the long term price trend may depend on global production in U.S and India and demand from China.
