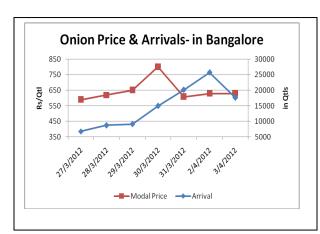
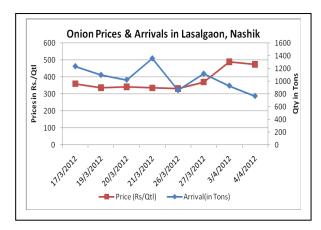
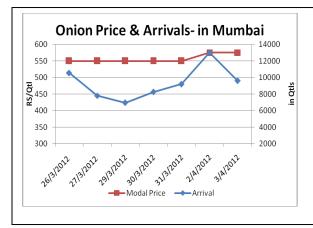
Onion Fundamentals:

- Auction at Lasalgaon, Nashik market has started after a week long March end closing. The average wholesale prices of onions, which were priced around Rs 375 a quintal on Tuesday March 27, increased to Rs 470 a quintal on 3rd April due to low arrival of the crop in the market.
- Arrivals in Lasalgaon have almost halved in last two week leading to price rise. As harvesting of late kharif crop is almost over and summer crop has started but with low volumes. Since summer crop has long shelf life of 6 -8 months, farmers and traders can hold if there is any major price fall.
- Potato & onion prices could increase further due to its availability at cheaper rates when compared to
 other vegetables. Retail prices of other vegetables like tomato, brinjal and bitter gourd etc have
 reached to Rs 30-40/ Kg in metro cities like Delhi and Mumbai.
- The productivity of onion this year was more due to favorable weather prevailed, prolonged winter and no rains damage unlike last year.
- Traders & Farmers are waiting for decision on MEP and MSP. Commerce ministry is in favor of removing MEP but the Price support operation system (MSP) is undecided (due to subsidy involved and how it will be shared between State & Central Govt).

Outlook:

Onion prices are likely to be in range bound due to higher arrivals in producing region and stocking interest for Rabi crop from both farmers and traders. Export demand is expected to pick up in this month which will give support to prices.
