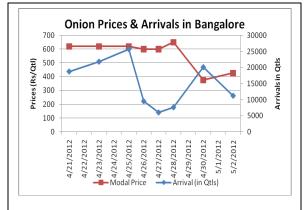
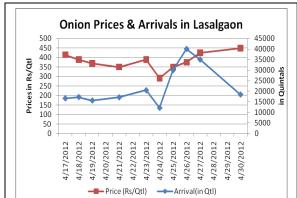

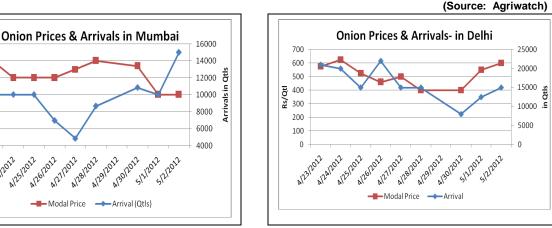
Onion Fundamentals:

- The Govt has scrapped the Minimum Export Price (MEP) on Onion in High-level meeting. It will be reviewed in every two months to see its impact on market. MEP prior to this decision on Onion was \$125/Ton FOB.
- Earlier in February this year, the government had lowered minimum export price (MEP) of all varieties • of onions, except Bangalore Rose onions and Krishnapuram onions to USD 125/Ton FOB from USD 150/Ton FOB.
- Traders expect price could increase Rs 50-100/Qtl in short term due to removal of MEP in near term and give competitive edge against China and Pakistan in International trade of Onion.
- Prices in Delhi, Mumbai have increased Rs. 100-150/Qtl in last two days despite higher arrivals due to • good demand reported in Mandis.
- Meanwhile, retail prices are hovering in between Rs. 500-1500/Qtl. The highest prices of Rs. 1500/Qtl • was recorded in Shimla, Trivendrum and Srinagar.
