## **Executive Summary:**

- Rabi crop onion arrivals have started in Maharashtra and other producing regions and are expected to increase in the next two weeks.
- Quality of Rabi onions is considered to be superior due its long shelf life which allows it to be stored for 6-8 months. Farmers and traders generally prefer to hold these onions in anticipation of better price realization due to export & domestic demand in the lean season.
- Export demand has started from Indonesia, Gulf and Far East countries. According to exporters, Philippines will begin importing Indian onions in a month's time.
- Currently, prices in Nashik district are rulling above Rs 400/Qtl. A month ago, prices were trading in the range of Rs 200-300/Qtl due to higher arrivals of late kharif season crop which cannot be stored for more than 2 months.
- The trading and farming communities are demanding that the government should remove current Minimum Export Price (MEP) of \$125 FOB and set up Minimum Support Price (MSP) for onions. Maharashtra Govt. is reportedly also considering a proposal to compensate onion growers.
- Estimates by trade and industry sources point towards onion production of around 15.1 million tonnes during 2011-12 as compared to 14.6 million tonnes in the previous year. The productivity of onion this year was higher due to favorable weather, prolonged winter and no rain damage, unlike last year.
- As per NAFED, India has exported around 13.4 lakh metric tonnes of Onion between April 2011 and February 2012. It is likely that we will end up the 2011-12 financial year with a figure of 15-16 lakh tonnes of onion export.

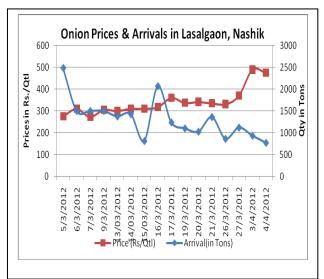

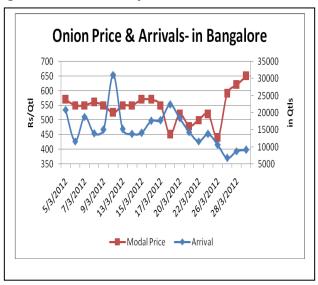




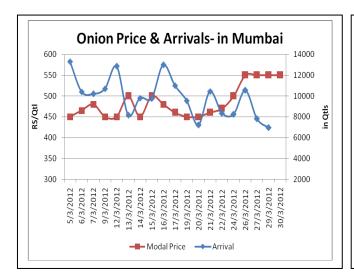
As seen in above table, retail and wholesale onion prices are mostly down by 10-20% as compared to same month last year due to higher supplies from late kharif season crop from producing regions like Maharashtra, Gujarat. But in Bhopal and Hyderabad prices have increased despite higher arrivals.

Market Outlook: Onion prices in major producing regions are steady to higher. With the increased arrivals of rabi crop, prices could soften initially but we do not see any sharp drop in onion prices as other vegetables are also getting Therefore, looking at (i) the export demand during April, (ii) stocking interest from higher traders and (iii) consumption demand ahead, major fall in prices is unlikely.
