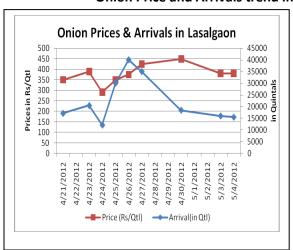
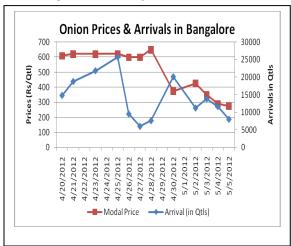
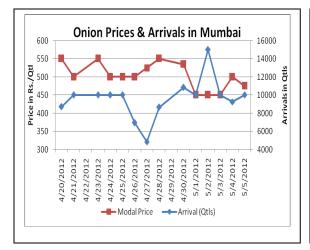
Executive Summary:

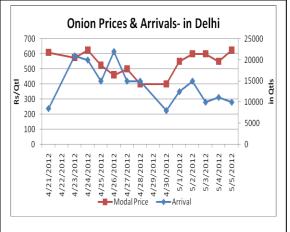
- The Central Govt. decided to abolish Minimum Export Price (MEP) for two months on 2nd May 2012. Traders and exporters have welcomed this but said the decision is late. The Government intends to boost onion exports amid sufficient availability domestically.
- In the year ended 2011-12, India had exported 15.34 lakh metric tonnes of onion valued at Rs. 1,715 crores. (Source: APEDA).
- In Lasalgaon, traders expect prices to increase by Rs 50-100/Qtl in the coming weeks due to export and storage demand.
- Local arrivals have increased in Orissa, Haryana, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- In the benchmark Lasalgaon market, a large proportion of onion arrivals are going into storage as stockists feel that prices are lucrative at current levels. Traders expect Rabi onions, which are available currently in the range of Rs 350-400/Qtl in various Maharashtra APMC mandis, to fetch around Rs. 600-700/Qtl during the lean season.

Onion Prices in most of the states have decreased except in a few like Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and West Bengal. In states like Orissa, Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand, local arrivals have increased which has put further pressure on prices. Prices are decreasing in these states for the last two weeks due to higher arrivals, indicating good production this year. Prices were higher in these states as compared to the same period last year.

Onion Arrivals (in MT) in important markets across India:

Arrivals which had fallen two weeks ago in major mandis of Maharastra, have increased in the previous week. But prices, as seen in the table above, have increased marginally despite higher arrivals. This indicates

good demand in the spot market for storage and export after the abolishment of MEP for two months. Domestic demand is also reported to be good from other states. In Gondal and Rajkot, which are major producing regions of Gujarat, arrivals have started decreasing and this is contributing to an increase in prices in Gujarat as seen in the table above.

However, arrivals are considerably higher as compared to the same week last year in almost all markets of Maharashtra, indicating a bumper Rabi production in the state.
