Domestic Fundamentals:

Market Outlook: Cotton market noticed mostly weak tone. Several markets remain closed on the eve of 'Basant Panchmi'.

In The News: USA Weekly Cooton Export Up 7%-According to the USDA,USA weekly cotton net upland sales for shipment this season remained robust during the week ended Jan. 15, rising to 470,300 running bales(RB), up 7% from the previous week and 89% from the prior four-week average.Increases were reported for China (174,500 RB), Vietnam (158,200 RB, including 2,500 RB switched from South Korea, and 2,200 RB switched from China), Turkey (38,100 RB), Indonesia (33,000 RB), and Mexico (21,000 RB). Decreases were reported for Uruguay (2,200 RB).Net sales of 2,400 RB for 2015/2016 were reported primarily for Thailand (1,300 RB) and Mexico (500 RB). Exports of 226,200 RB were down 1 percent from the previous week, but up 12 percent from the prior 4-week average.The primary destinations were China (37,200 RB), Vietnam (36,800 RB), Turkey (35,600 RB), Indonesia (30,600 RB), and Mexico (15,800 RB). Net American Pima sales of 15,000 RB for 2014/2015--a marketing-year high--were up noticeably from the previous week and from the prior 4-week average. Increases were reported for China (12,600 RB), Peru (400 RB), Egypt (400 RB), and Japan (400 RB). Exports of 2,700 RB were down 62 percent from the previous week and 51 percent from the prior 4-week average. The primary destinations were India (400 RB), Pakistan (400 RB), Thailand (300 RB), and China (300 RB).

India is trying to explore new cooton markets aiming towards high cotton exports-Govt. Official.China is the top cotton export market for India, followed by Bangladesh and Pakistan

The district administration Perambalur, Tamilanadu has urged the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) to ensure that cotton cultivators of the district get remunerative price for their crop.

The Cotton Association of India (CAI) has revised the estimate of cotton production at 400.25 lakh bales for season 2014-15, slightly lower than previous year's production caused by yield loss in the central region of the country. According to CAI, cotton production stood 407.25 lakh bales in 2013-14. For the current season association estimated supply of 472.5 lakh bales, domestic consumption of 306 lakh bales and available surplus of 166.15 lakh bales.

Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) has procured around 4.82 million bales (of 170 kg each) of cotton this season so far. CCI is targeted to buy 10 million bales of cotton during this season with the cost of Rs. 12000 crores. If we see the procurements in previous years, it would be highest procurement, if CCI achieves the target. The highest procurement till date was recorded in 2008-09 when it was 8.9 million bales. Around Rs 9600 crores has been spent by CCI to buy cotton from the various region including Gujarat, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh.

Tamil Nadu based Southern India Mills Association (SIMA), the largest spinning mills association in India, has requested the centre to instruct Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) to commence procurement and commercial operation in the state. Since last 20 years, CCI has not executed any MSP operation as the state was among the lowest cotton producing region, but this season Tamil Nadu is likely to five lakh bales of cotton in winter and one lakh bale in continuing summer season. To sell their produce at genuine prices, state want CCI to procure cotton at MSP.

According to Indian Cotton Federation (ICF), cotton output in India in the current season would stand around 406 lakh bales, same what was estimated earlier in November last year. Gujarat is likely to contribute 120 lakh bales while Maharashtra will produce 90 lakh bales and 45 lakh bales and 33 lakh bales are expected to be produced by Telangana and Karnataka respectively.

India is likely to export 1.023 million tonnes of cotton this season, around 49.2% lower when compared to exports of previous season, which stood 2.015 million tonnes, according to USDA.

Cotton production is likely to be around 6.641 million tonnes, slightly lower than the production of previous season, which was 6.750 million tonnes, according to United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). In its previous estimate, USDA projected cotton output in India to be around 6.750 million tonnes during the current season, but the same has lowered the output estimate considering the unfavorable weather conditions, which could still impact the cotton crop.

The International Cotton Advisory Committee (ICAC) see the growth in cotton consumption this season 2014-15, with a estimated surplus of 1.7 million tons in world output of cotton. Ending stocks would stand around 21.3 million tonnes by the end of current season, around 9% higher from the previous season. Cotton output in India would remain stable at 6.8 million tonnes due to unfavorable situation of monsoon.

International Fundamentals:

Cotton price plunged five year low on Tuesday following the Chinese data and revised global economic forecasts. China recorded 7.4% growth in the economy, the slowest growth rate in nearly a quarter of a century, according to National Bureau of Statistics. Also International Monetary Fund (IMF) lowered its global growth forecast for 2015 to 3.5% which was estimated 3.8% earlier. Following the wave, World Bank also reduced its forecast for global economic expansion to 3%, around 0.4% lower than the previous estimate. March contract, most active contract on ICE, settled at 57.79 cents a pound, the lowest price recorded since August 27, 2009.

China cotton import during December noted a fall of 57 percent, when compared to corresponding month during the previous year. China imported 264,500 tons of cotton in December and 2.4 million tons during the year 2014, around 41 percent lower when compared to previous year.

United state department of agriculture (USDA) has given its final approval to herbicide-tolerant GMO crops (Cotton and Soybean) to be used with new herbicide, developed by Monsanto Co. According to Monsanto the same combination of crop and herbicide will help growers to control weed invasion in crop field that will ultimately boost the yield. Although Monsanto got approval from USDA, it still needs final approval from Environmental Protection Agency for the herbicide it has developed to be used by crops.

<u>Outlook</u>

We expect domestic prices to remain weak in near term.
