

Domestic Fundamentals:

Market Outlook: Cotton spot market noticed mixed tone on Wednesday.

In The News: The Southern India Mills' Association (SIMA) has urged minister of state for textile Santosh Kumar Gangwar to look into the e-auction policy of Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) of selling cotton and instruct CCI to offer at least 50,000 bales - in varied lot sizes and in multiples of 100 bales. It also requested that CCI should offer cotton for sale in each center and each variety in order to help small industry.

Around 60.16 lakh hectares of cotton has been sown so far throughout the country, as on 03 July this year, which is around 69.85% higher when compared to the sowing progress of last season during the corresponding period which was 35.42 lakh hectares, according to Ministry of Agriculture.

Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) has sold around 30 lakh bales of cotton so far from the stock of 86.9 lakh bales which it procured during the current season under the procurement operation. CCI sold 29 lakh bales to domestic buyers and 1 lakh bale to Bangladesh. On daily basis it is releasing around 2 lakh bales of cotton for sale.

Around 54.31% of the cotton sowing has been completed in Gujarat, according to State Agriculture Department. Area sown under cotton as on 29 June 2015 stood 14.80 lakh hectares in Gujarat against the total normal area of 27.26 lakh hectares.

India exported 0.439 lakh bales of cotton last week (15-21 June 2015), which was 0.449 lakh bales previous to last week (08-14 June 2015), according to the data released by IBIS and compiled by Agriwatch. Imports on the other hand stood 0.297 lakh bales last week, which was 0.259 lakh bales previous to last week.

According to Investment Information and Credit Rating Agency of India (ICRA), cotton prices in year 2016 is likely to remain range bound despite the expectation of fall in production by 10-15%. ICRA in its report said that in the last four year (CY 2011-12 to 2014-15), the global cotton prices and trade were majorly driven by government policies in various producing and consuming countries, despite the increasing supply and negligible growth in demand.

Cotton sowing has been started in almost every cotton growing region including Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra and Karnataka following the arrival of good rainfall in the states. Cumulative rainfall during 01 June to 22 June in the current monsoon season (starting form 01 June) stood 126.1 mm, around 21% higher than the normal rainfall of 103.8 mm for the same period.

Central Institute for Cotton Research (CICR) has issued the district specific advisory for sowing cotton across the country, considering the difference in the status of monsoon in different states. CICR has suggested the immediate sowing in Maharashtra in the coming week particularly in Jalgaon, yavatmal, Nanded, Amravati, Buldana and Aurangabad districts as dry situation is expected in the period of July 03-16.

Minimum Support Price (MSP) of cotton has been revised upwardly for the year 2015-16 by Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CACP) by Rs 50 for each of Medium and Long staple. The MSP of Medium staple cotton has been revised to Rs 3800 per quintal for 2015-16 which was Rs. 3750 in 2014-15. Similarly, the MSP for Long staple has been revised to Rs. 4100 for the upcoming season 2015-16, which was Rs 4050 in the current season.



International Fundamentals:

Agriculture Ministry of Egypt said it would stop cotton imports from all origins to protect local production. The country aims to protect the local growers and resolve marketing issues of cotton by restricting the fiber imports.

The world biggest cotton consumer, China would sell the initial volume of 1 million tonnes of cotton from its state reserve during July and August in the current year, according to country's top planner. 330000 tonnes of domestic cotton from the 2011 crop with the floor price of 13,200 Yuan per tonne, 470,000 tonnes of domestic cotton from 2012 at 14,200 Yuan per tonne, and 200,000 tonnes of imported cotton from the 2012 crop at 15,500 Yuan per tonne would be offered at Beijing for the sale.

The International Cotton Advisory Committee (ICAC) has revised the world cotton ending stocks estimates for season 2015-16 upwardly. According to ICAC July estimates, cotton ending stocks is likely to be around 20.90 million tonnes as compared to 20.79 million tonnes, which was earlier estimated in June.

Outlook

We expect domestic prices to remain range bound in near term.
