

Domestic Fundamentals:

Market Outlook: Cotton spot market noticed mixed tone on Monday.

In The News: In Andhra Pradesh, around 60% of the cotton planting has been completed so far. Around 3.529 lakh hectares of cotton has been planted as on 05 August 2015 which is around 26.3% lower when compared to the area sown for cotton during the same period last year which was 4.79 lakh hectares.

Around 91.7% of the cotton sowing has been completed in Gujarat, according to State Agriculture Department. Area sown under cotton as on 03 August this year stood 25.01 lakh hectares in Gujarat against the total normal area of 27.26 lakh hectares. The cotton area in the state is approximately 11.3% lower when compared to the previous year area as on date, which was 28.20 lakh hectares.

Around 105.68 lakh hectares of cotton has been sown so far throughout the country, as on 07 August this year. This is around 5.84% lower than the corresponding sowing progress of last season which was 112.24 lakh hectares, according to Ministry of Agriculture.

According to International Cotton Advisory Committee (ICAC), India is likely to produce 6.4 million tones of cotton in 2015-16, 2% lower as compared to the previous year. Cotton stock in the country by the end of current season (Oct'14-Sept'15) is likely to be around 2.2 million tones. By the end of July, CCI has sold around 650,000 tonnes of cotton from the total procured amount of 1.5mt. ICAC believes that the cotton export during the season 2014-15 would stand 51% lower year on year basis at 980,000 tonnes.

Cotton Association of India (CAI) kept its cotton production estimates for season 2014-15 at 382.75 lakh bales in June, unchanged from the previous month estimates. According to the association, total cotton supply would be around 453.65 lakh bales and the consumption would stand around 315 lakh bales. Total available surplus including exports would be around 138.56 lakh bales.

The inability of Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) to sell the cotton, which it procured under MSP operation is likely to lead to the bulged cotton stock in the country. According to Cotton Association of India (CAI) cotton inventory are likely to increase by around 25% to 7.39 million bales in 2014-15 as compared to 5.89 million bales a year ago. Following the situation cotton prices are likely to go southwards further.

Cotton export to China from India has declined by 56.72 per cent in 2014-15, which has caused cotton prices in domestic market to fall drastically. In year 2014-15 India exported only 26 lakh bales of cotton to China in 2014-15 against 61 lakh bales in 2013-14. Citing the situation, Commerce and Industry Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said in the written reply to Rajya Sabha that due to this reason cotton domestic prices are ruling weaker as compared to the previous year and cotton policy adopted by China is the major cause for less imports.

According to the officials, India is likely to sell its cotton to Thailand too, after succeeding in selling cotton to Bangladesh. One of the biggest mills in Thailand has shown interest in buying cotton from India. According to the CCI officials, samples of cotton from India have approved and CCI is all set to get buyers from Thailand, besides Bangladesh.

Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) is getting good response for its e-auctions, said India Cotton Federation (ICF). Miller, traders and exporters are buying cotton from CCI according to their current and future requirements. Currently CCI is holding the unsold stock of approximately 62 lakh bales out of approximately 87 lakh, which it procured in the current season under the MSP operation.



International Fundamentals:

According to International Cotton Advisory Committee (ICAC), cotton output on the global is likely to be around 23.83 million tonnes in 2015-16, around 9% lower than the production of 26.2 million tonnes in previous season.

USDA estimated cotton imports to be around 7.41 million tones in 2015-16, around 1.5% lower when compared to the imports in the current season i.e. 2014-15. It should be noted the net fall in the cotton imports is caused by the lower cotton imports by China, otherwise all the major importing nation are expected to import higher in 2015-16.

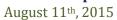
In its July estimates, USDA estimated world cotton export to be around 7.413 million tones in season 2015-16, around 1.6% lower when compared to export in the current season that is 2014-15. Except India and Uzbekistan, where exports would be on higher side and Burkina where export would remain steady, all the major exporting countries are likely to face fall in exports.

Outlook

We expect domestic prices to remain range bound to firm in the near -term.

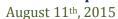
