

#### **Domestic Fundamentals:**

Market Outlook: Cotton spot prices noticed steady to firm tone on Saturday.

**In The News**: Drought in parts of Southern States is likely to affect the production of cotton. According to official sources, the production of cotton is likely to decline by 40% in Tamil Nadu compared to 5-6 lakh bales during previous year.

The government has decided to promote the cultivation of indigenous varieties of cotton this year as in the crop year 2015 -16 (July-June), cotton crop was affected in Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh amid whitefly and pink bollworm pest attack. Bt Cotton was introduced in 2002 and around 90 per cent of the crop area is under Bt Cotton. The productivity of native varieties is lower by 10-15 per cent as compared to Bt Cotton, but expenditure on pesticides and sprays would be less and farmers can reuse the seeds for next sowing.

According to a recent forecast by the weather office, summer planting of cotton is likely to be delayed as above normal heat wave conditions is likely to prevail over central and northwest India from April to June this year.

The Cotton Association of India (CAI) has estimated cotton production at 345 lakh bales (of 170 kg each) in the 2015/16 season that started on October 01, 2015 lower by 37.75 lakh bales from earlier estimate. With carryover stock of about 73.60 lakh bales and imports of about 14 lakh bales, the total availability is estimated at around 432.60 lakh bales. However, CAI has pegged the total consumption at around 304 lakh bales, of which 270 lakh bales is estimated to be consumed by mills, 24 lakh bales by small scale units, while 10 lakh bales is likely to be non-mill consumption.

India exported 0.712 lakh bales of cotton last week (28 Mar-04 Apr 2016), which was 1.19 lakh bales previous to last week (14 Mar-20 Mar 2016), according to the data released by IBIS and compiled by Agriwatch.

Major importer of Indian cotton during the week (28 Mar -04 Apr 2016) was Bangladesh. According to the data released by IBIS and compiled by Agriwatch, Bangladesh imported 0.40 lakh bales of cotton from India in the past week (28 Mar -04 Apr 2016). Other major importers were Pakistan, Vietnam, China and Indonesia and their imported volumes were 0.15 lakh bales, 0.09 lakh bales, 0.03 lakh bales and 0.03 lakh bales respectively.

Department of Agriculture, Ministry of Agriculture (MoA) in its second advance estimates, has revised the cotton production estimates downwardly for the season 2015-16 at 306.92 lakh bales (of 170 kg each). For the season 2014-15, the estimate was 346.23 lakh bales according to the first advance estimates for the season.

The Foreign Agriculture Services (FAS), division of USDA has lowered the production forecast for India in its latest report to 356 lakh bales. The reason for the downfall in the revision is lower yield expectation in Punjab and Haryana due to the attack of white fly and impact of pink bollworm in Gujarat.

According to Cotton Association of India (CAI), the arrivals during 2015-16 season up to the end of February 2016 are estimated at 245 lakh bales compared to 276.25 lakh bales arrived up to the same period last year. This reduction in the arrivals of cotton is an indication of a lower crop this season.



#### **International Fundamentals:**

According to latest USDA attaché report, India's 2016/17 cotton production forecast is 28.5 million 480 lb. bales on marginally lower acreage of 11.8 million hectares. Yields are expected higher through a combination of better crop, pest, and weed management practices and assuming a normal monsoon after two consecutive years of deficient rain. Mill consumption is forecast lower than the 2015/16 marketing year as demand remains weak. Exports are forecast at 5.0 million 480 lb. bales while imports are forecast at 900,000 480 lb. bales.

Cotton planted area in Vietnam is likely to drop to less than 1,000 hectares. Cotton imports are forecast to increase to 1.17 million tons or 5.37 million bales in the Marketing Year (MY)2015/2016, up 25 percent over MY 2014/2015.

World cotton production in 2016/17 is projected to increase by 4%, to just under 23 million tons, as the world average yield is anticipated to improve by 4% to 732 kg/ha. In 2016/17, world cotton area is expected to expand by 1% to 31.3 million hectares. India's area is forecast up 4% to 12.4 million hectares due to improved domestic cotton prices in 2015/16. After production plummeted in 2015/16, cotton production in Pakistan is expected to jump 35% to 2.1 million tons as yields recover. The world cotton consumption is anticipated to remain stable at 23.9 million tons.

#### **Outlook**

#### We expect domestic prices to remain range bound to weak in the near -term.
