

Domestic Fundamentals:

Market Outlook: Cotton spot prices noticed range –bound to weak tone on Tuesday.

In The News: Delay in monsoon and issuance/renewal of crop loans by banks are likely to affect the State government's plan of restricting cotton cultivation in the ongoing kharif to 23 per cent compared to the total cropped area of over 47 per cent during the previous kharif. Another factor supporting cotton cultivation is that sowing can be done by third week of July.

According to preliminary report by the government, cotton sowing as on 17th June, 2016 has been covered under 12.25 lakh hectares compared to 19.66 lakh hectares during the same period previous year.

Indian cotton planting in the 2016 -17 marketing season is likely to decline to the lowest in seven sources according to industry sources. Forecast of good monsoon and pest attack in certain states during the previous season are motivating farers t switch other crops like sugarcane, peanut and pulses. Cotton planting area is likely to decline to around 11 million hectares in the next marketing year that starts on Oct. 1, the lowest since 2009/10 compared to 11.9 million hectares in the current marketing year.

The Cotton Association of India (CAI) has estimated India's cotton output in 2015 -16 at 341.50 lakh bales (of 170 kg each), around 10.8 per cent lower Thicompared to the previous year's production of 383 lakh bales. The projected balance sheet drawn by the CAI for 2015-16 pegs total supply at 429.10 lakh bales, while domestic consumption is seen at 305 lakh bales, thus leaving an available surplus of 124.10 lakh bales.

India exported 0.526 lakh bales of cotton last week (06 -12 June 2016), which was 0.619 lakh bales previous to last week (30 May -05 June, 2016), according to the data released by IBIS and compiled by Agriwatch.

Major importer of Indian cotton during the week (06 -12 June, 2016) was Bangladesh. According to the data released by IBIS and compiled by Agriwatch, Bangladesh imported 0.347 lakh bales of cotton from India in the past week (06 -12 June, 2016). Other major importers were Vietnam, China, Djibouti and Pakistan and their imported volumes were 0.064 lakh bales, 0.052 lakh bales, 0.029 lakh bales and 0.026 lakh bales respectively.

Department of Agriculture, Ministry of Agriculture (MoA) in its second advance estimates, has revised the cotton production estimates downwardly for the season 2015-16 at 306.92 lakh bales (of 170 kg each). For the season 2014-15, the estimate was 346.23 lakh bales according to the first advance estimates for the season.

The Foreign Agriculture Services (FAS), division of USDA has lowered the production forecast for India in its latest report to 356 lakh bales. The reason for the downfall in the revision is lower yield expectation in Punjab and Haryana due to the attack of white fly and impact of pink bollworm in Gujarat.

According to Cotton Association of India (CAI), the arrivals during 2015-16 season up to the end of April 2016 are estimated at 302.40 lakh bales, lower compared to previous year. This reduction in the arrivals of cotton is an indication of a lower crop this season.



International Fundamentals:

According to the Central Agency for Public Mobilisation and Statistics (CAPMAS), the consumption of locally grown cotton by Egyptian companies declined by around 56% in the second quarter of the agricultural season 2015 -16. During December 2015 - February 2016 period, local companies purchased 76,400 kantar (1 kantar = 45.02 kg) of cotton, compared to consumption of 175,800 kantar in the corresponding period of the previous season. Consumption has declined amid closure of a number of spinning mills.

The Chinese government has started the auction of its huge reserves of cotton. Stocks of cotton are expected to decline amid decline in Chinese imports and falling domestic production. The US Department of Agriculture has forecast China's cotton stocks to fall by 6% in 2015-16, to 13.9m tons.

According to USDA latest report, global 2015/16 cotton ending stocks are revised down this month. World 2015-16 cotton production is projected at 98.15 million bales, 16 per cent below last season. World ending stocks are now projected at 102.08 million bales. For India, production is forecast at 26.8 million bales, same as previous month's estimates and India's crop is estimated 9 per cent below 2014/15 and the lowest since 2009/10.

Outlook

We expect domestic prices to remain range bound to firm in the near -term.
