

### **Domestic Fundamentals:**

Market Outlook: Cotton spot market prices were noticed steady to weak on Friday.

**In The News:** The rise in cotton MSP may be good news for farmers, but raises concerns for the consuming industry, considering that the base price of the white fibre will go up in the next cotton year. Cotton acreage is **bound to go up by 10-15 per cent in the next season**, an industry source opined.

Agriculture Ministry Raised Cotton **MSP by Rs 1130**/ quintal for 2018-19 season for long staple it is Rs 5450/Qtl and Rs 5150 for Medium staple cotton.

The projected yearly Balance Sheet for the Season 2017-18 drawn by the CAI has estimated total cotton supply till end of the season i.e. upto 30<sup>th</sup> September 2018 at **416 lakh bales of 170 kgs.** each which includes opening **stock of 36 lakh bales** at the beginning of the season. The CAI has estimated domestic consumption for the season at **324 lakh bales** while the exports are estimated to be 70 lakh bales. The carry-over stock at the end of the 2017-18 season is estimated by the CAI at 22 lakh bales.

The total cotton sown area as on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2018, as per reports received from States, stands at **32.20 lakh hectare** as compared to **46.10 lakh hectare** at this time last year.

The central government will approve the much-awaited higher minimum support prices (MSP) for kharif crops in a cabinet meeting next week, Prime Minister Narendra Modi told farmers at his residence on Friday. The new MSP regime is likely to significantly raise the support prices for crops such as paddy, ragi, maize, moong, groundnut, sunflower, soybean and cotton. Going by the MSPs announced for these crops in the 2017-18 crop year, returns to farmers were under 50% of the costs of cultivation.

Sowing of Cotton has been completed 0.46 lakh hectares in Andhra Pradesh till June 27. Last year the crop was sown in 1.45 Lakh hectares in the same time frame. Lull period post monsoon arrival didn't help in providing enough moisture to hasten the sowing. In Southern peninsular India the sowing window extends up to September depending on the rainfall. Any delay in sufficient rain also delays the sowing campaign of cotton.

The Multi Commodity Exchange of India (MCX) has **signed an agreement with the Maharashtra government** to empower cotton farmers in the Vidarbha region. It aims to **create a value chain with final market linkages to support thousands of cotton farmers** in Akola, Amravati and Wardha.

#### **Monsoon Update:**

The India Met Department (IMD) has indicated that the monsoon is bracing for another revival phase from the South Peninsula and Central India, from July 6 and 8, respectively. This will come about with the likely formation of a cyclonic circulation over the North-West Bay of Bengal and adjoining Bengal coast around Friday (July 6). The US Climate Prediction Centre hinted that the 'buzz' due to the churn off the Andhra Pradesh-Odisha coast would continue to hold until July 19.



### **International Fundamentals**

President Donald Trump said on Thursday the United States may ultimately impose tariffs on more than a half-trillion dollars worth of Chinese goods as the worlds two largest economies hurtled toward the start of a trade war

Egypt's cotton exports are expected to **reach about 52,000 tonnes** in the 2017/2018 season that ends in August, up nearly 37 percent from the previous year, Nabil al-Santaricy, head of the Alexandria Cotton Exporters Association, told Reuters.

Chinese cotton futures fell nearly **3 percent** in early trade on Thursday, amid fears that a protracted trade dispute between the world's top two economies could affect China's textile exports.

US Area planted to cotton in 2018 is estimated at **13.5 million acres, up 7 percent from last year**. Upland area is estimated at 13.3 million acres, up 7 percent from 2017. American Pima is estimated at 243,000 acres, down 4 percent from 2017. The upland planted area in Kansas is estimated at a record high and Oklahoma upland planted area is the highest since 1956.

**ICE cotton futures fell over 1 percent on Monday** to mark a six-week low as investors remained on the sidelines amid trade tensions between the United States, the world's biggest cotton exporter, and top consumer China.

The most active cotton contract on ICE Futures U.S., the third-month December contract, settled **up 1.01 cent, or 1.2 percent, at 85.3 cents per lb**. It traded within a range of 84.2 and 85.62 cents a lb.

Actual turnover of china reserve cotton was 17,300 tonnes. Turnover rate was 57.62% as on June 27.

Due to acute water shortage, Sindh falls short of completing the cotton sowing target by **at least 30 percent of its land** experts and growers told to the news today.

Chin is set to return as a major cotton importer, taking **10 million to 15 million bales a year by 2019/20**, compared with 5 million bales this year. According to Tim Bourgois, Head of cotton platform at LDC.
