



Domestic Fundamentals:

Market Outlook:

The prices in Adoni market of Andhra Pradesh also stood slightly up at Rs. 4330/q with 150 q of arrivals while the MCX spot price stood at Rs.15540/bale. ICE cotton futures moved modestly higher last week on further confirmation of large export sales to China and expectations that the US would forego economic sanctions on China.

News: CCI continued buying cotton from the farmers while the demand for cotton remained very low in in the market. The functioning of ginning mills remained halted in many districts across India. Only few mills are working that falls under CCI. The mills are unable to operate with its fill capacity due to lack of availability of labour around 20- 30% mills are working in Maharashtra while only 10% mills are working in Gujarat for around 8-10 hours. While only few mills are working in Adilabad of Telangana after the cotton procurement started in the ditrict last week. Some ginners in Gujarat are able to get the export contracts form Vietnam, Bangladesh and China due to cheaper Indian cotton prices against the international cotton.

The farmers in Vidarbha region are in distress after the isolated rains were reported in the region in the last few days and is expected to continue in the coming days also. The farmers are facing problems in selling the cotton due to the unseasonal rains in the area. The farmers would likely to face difficulty as CCI buys only FAQ grade cotton while the rains are deteriorating the quality of cotton and the moisture content could exceed over 12%. The sowing time for cotton is likely arrive for which farmers need sufficient money to commence the sowing and CCI procurement is very sluggish. Therefore, farmers are forced to sell their produce to local traders and private ginners.

Cotton area in Tamil Nadu is expected to increase but the farmers are uncertain that they will be paid a reasonable price or not in the coming season. One of the reasons, all the textile mills are in financial crisis and all the factories have shut production of yarn came to halt. So, this would definitely affect the raw cotton procurement from the farmers until CCI gives assurance. The cost of production is cheaper while the returns in growing cotton is higher compared to paddy. Total cost would come around Rs. 30,000 per acre, while the return is Rs. 1.5 lakh.

CCI purchased around 7.5 lakh bales this season at MSP so far Gujarat, highest purchases in past 12 years in the state. CCI has supported the farmers in the time of need as the kapas prices are hovering around Rs.4500-4900/q currently in the state due to less demand in the pandemic situation. Also, the cotton production is expected higher in Gujarat by around 5-7% in 2019-20 season from the previous year to around 90-92 lakh bales according to Agriwatch estimates.

In Maharashtra, CCI has activated around 34 centres across the state in the lockdown for procurement. Also the centres that are under red zone, likely to pick up procurement pace by the 2nd week of May. Before lockdown, CCI procured around 18 lakh bales and in last 15 days during the lockdown, CCI purchased around 6,900 bales. Out of total procurement value of Rs. 4,995 crore, a sum of Rs. 4,987 crore has already reached the farmers. In Maharashtra around 15-17% cotton crop is still with farmers and yet to arrive.

In Punjab, cotton has been sown in about 500 ha so far and it is likely reach to around 1.25 lakh ha by May 20. The state government is supplying ample amount of seeds to farmers without any delay. Due to the delay in wheat harvest this year, the cotton sowing is lagging behind by around 1week to 10 days. As cotton does not need as much labour as required in paddy, therefore, 7-10% of paddy cultivating farmers are shifting to cotton and the state is expecting to cover the area with cotton to around 5.5 lakh ha this year (2020-21) from 4 lakh ha last year (2019-20). The suitable weather for cotton is prolonged till the end of this month. So a significant rise in area can be noticed by the end of this month this year.

According to the trade sources, the Indian cotton exports for the March'20 were reported much lower around 2.94 lakh bales and around 50,000 bales of organic cotton. The exports were higher around 4 lakh bales in the previous month. In March'20, the shipments were halted due to the outbreak of Covid-19 virus in various countries and trade of 20 days was reported in March month. During the time, Bangladesh was the largest importer of 1.54 lakh bales at an average FOB of \$1.57/kg followed by China importing around 1 lakh bales at an average FOB of \$1.62/kg almost similar quantity was



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exported in the February month. The other export destinations of India were Indonesia (9,883 bales at 1.29 %Kg), Vietnam (6764 bales at 1.62/kg).

The cotton procurement from different centers is going to start in Telangana from today in number of phases. Farmers will be given tokens giving them the dates to bring their produce to the procurement centers. Purchase will be made at Jainad, Bheempur and Ichoda yards on 29th April, at Talamadugu, Bela and Boath yards on 30th April, at Tamsi, Adilabad and Mavala on 2nd May, at Jainad, Bheempur and Indervelli on 4th May and at Talamadugu, Bela and Jainad yards on 5th May. Farmers in Telangana have purchased cotton seeds on Sunday on the occasion of Akshaya trithiya. The farmers are waiting for the monsoon to occur to start the cultivation as already farmers have prepared the field particularly in Adilabad district.

CCI started the procurement in Punjab, Maharashtra and Gujarat so far last week. CCI procured about more than 25,000 quintals of cotton from the farmers in last 10-12 days. There is no demand from spinning industry, therefore, the ginning mills are facing problem in the storage and movement of ginned cotton bales. CCI has started selling cotton at lower price. At present, the market price is around Rs.36,000/ candy generally who buys one lakh bales from CCI.

The department of agriculture in Punjab is set to surge in the area under cotton cultivation in 2020-21 cotton season. The area under paddy is likely to switch under maize and cotton in the new season, thereby, enhancing the area of cotton from around 4 lakh ha in 2019-20 to cover about 5 lakh ha in the coming cotton season (2020-21) due to the higher returns and relatively higher yields compared to paddy. The state has managed to provide 25 lakh packets of BT cotton seed from the country's reputed seed producing companies. The cotton sowing in Punjab (Bathinda, Mansa, Muktsar, Faridkot, Moga, Fazilka and Firozpur) is expected to start from 1st of May'20 this year that is delayed by around 10-15 days due to the late wheat harvests amid lockdown in the state.

Weather Forecast for tomorrow:

Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning, hail & squally winds (speed reaching 50-60 kmph) very likely at isolated places over Bihar, Gangetic West Bengal and Assam & Meghalaya; with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30-40 kmph) at isolated places over Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Odisha, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Telangana, Lakshadweep, Kerala & Mahe and Tamilnadu, Puducherry & Karaikal and with lightning at isolated places over Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Gilgit-Baltistan, Muzaffarabad, Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Arunachal Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathawada and Karnataka.

International Fundamentals:

Cotton futures traded in plus territory on Friday, with the front month futures 49 to 85 points higher, Jul 20 Cotton closed at 56.24, up 85 points. The May 7th Cotlook A index was 1 cent higher to 63.90c/lb. The updated AWP for cotton was 46.01 cents/lb, and the LDP is now 5.99 cents/lb. through next Thursday.

The US Export Sales report from USDA showed 370,300 RB for 2019-2020 in week ending 30th Apr'20 were down by 15% compared to previous week. Increases primarily for China 217,500 RB, Vietnam 102,600 RB, Taiwan 18,300 RB, Bangladesh 10,900 RB, Turkey 10,300 RB and offset by reductions primarily from Mexico 7,000 RB, El Salvador 3,200 RB, Pakistan 2,800 RB. For 2020-2021, net upland sales of 55,900 RB were primarily for China 22,000 RB, Vietnam 11,400 RB, Turkey 6,600 RB, Mexico 5,000 RB. Net Upland Shipment for Exports of 370,300 RB were primarily to Vietnam 125,100 RB, China 56,500 RB, Turkey 51,500 RB, Pakistan 32,200 RB, Taiwan 23,700 RB.

According to USDA, the total Demand decline to 35 million bales in April estimates compared to 36.5 mln bales in March estimates. While the imports also has been hit badly that declined to 7.5 mln bales in April estimate from 8.25 mln bales in March'20. Due to the the reduced domestic as well as international demand, China is troubled facing dealing with huge inventory in the warehouses. Despite the stock reserves China likely to end the year with lower ending stock at 35.24 million bales due to lower imports and lower crop in 2019-20 from 35.67 mln bales in 2018-20.

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ICAC highlights in its report that global cotton consumption is likely to decline by 12% this year (2019-20), reducing global trade to 8.26 million tonnes amid pandemic across the globe. In 2020-21, global area is projected to decrease by 4% to 33 million hectares, with India remaining the top regarding the sown area to around 12 million hectares. The current price projection for the year-end 2019-20 average of the Cotlook A Index has been revised to 71.4 cents per pound this month. The price projection for the year-end 2020-21 average of the A Index is 56.9 cents per pound this month. The International Cotton Advisory Committee projected 2020-21 global cotton production of 25 MMT (4% lower) on 33 million ha planted. The ICAC forecasted a lower global consumption rate of 23.2 MMT in the coming season.

A drop in cotton production is estimated in Egypt to around 39 lakh bales from the 44.8 lakh bales attributing that to the reduction of yields due to the lower quality of seeds and losses due to whitefly infestation this year. Also, the reduced prices in 2019-20 discouraged the cultivation and expecting that this may continue in the coming season. India imports the Egyptian cotton of premium quality and other countries including Pakistan, Bangladesh, Greece, Germany and Italy in 2019-20 MY and expected to remain same in 2020-21. The Egyptian exports are likely to increase by 14% in 2020-21 amid lower prices that would attract the countries to the Egyptian produce.

Market reacted positively with some indication of China going to fulfil phase one deal of US China trade agreement by purchasing American cotton. ICE cotton futures have gained some support after China made an announcement that the country will buy one million bales from the US under the agreement signed two months ago to ease the financial crisis caused by the pandemic boosting its textile industry and improve US relations. The Chinese textile industry has gained momentum and demand for cotton. China still needs 550 to 600 lakh bales this year.
