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Domestic market summary

Domestic Market Scenario:

Cotton sowing is progressing across India for the coming 2021-22 season. Till 02nd September 2021 cotton sowing across India has reached 118.13 lakh hectares compared to previous season sowing at 126.45 lakh hectares during the same time. Cotton Corporation of India may not require procuring more than 30 lakh bales in 2021-22 season. Cotton Corporation of India has procured around 92 lakh bales of cotton during the ongoing 2020-21 season. Gujarat Shankar-6 variety cotton spot prices in Cotton Association of India stood high around Rs.56,348/ candy in August'21.

Monthly Price Outlook : The Kapas prices likely to remain firm between Rs. 7100-7800/q in the Rajkot market and the prices of medium staple length in Adoni market are likely to hover around Rs. 5700-7500/q in the coming month.

Major Market Highlights:

According to the latest data available from Cotton Association of India, the total cotton supplies from October 2020 to July 2021 stood at 482.61 lakh bales. This consist market arrivals of 348.61 lakh bales upto 31st July 2021. Cotton Association of India has reduced its July estimate for 2020-21 cotton crop by 1.50 lakh bales to 354.50 lakh bales from its previous estimate of 356 lakh bales due to the lower production expected in the central zone and southern zones. The Cotton production estimate for the central zone has been reduced by 0.50 lakh bales to 193.50 lakh bales from 194 lakh bales estimated during the previous month. Cotton crop estimate for the southern zone has been reduced by 1 lakh bales to 90.50 lakh bales compared to the previous estimate of 91.50 lakh bales. Further, the cotton consumption was estimated at around 275 lakh bales, and exports up to 31st July'2021 were estimated to be 70 lakh bales, cotton imports have also reached 9 lakh bales till 31st July'2021 and stock at the end of July'2021 was estimated at 137.61 lakh bales.

During the 2020-21 season, Telangana has becomes the country's largest supplier of cotton. Telangana has supplied about 178.55 lakh quintals of cotton during the Kharif (Vaankalam) Marketing season 2020-21. According to the State the cotton procurement is almost double the cotton procured by Maharashtra which stood with 91.98 lakh quintals. The cotton crop was sold to Cotton Corporation of India which is in addition to the crop purchased by private businessmen. All of the cotton crop was purchased from farmers at Minimum Support Price of Rs. 5825 per quintal as part of the Centre's Price Support Scheme aimed at eliminating middlemen and support farmers. All the payments to the farmers for their produce are made directly into their bank accounts by the concerned procuring agencies.

According to ICAR-Central Institute of Cotton Research (CICR), Nagpur the overall acreage for 2021-22 cotton season could be 2-3% lower than the previous year. Cotton acreage was reported at 130.37 lakh hectares last season. The initial estimates for current season were around 130 lakh hectares, but sowing has been completed only on 116 lakh hactares till 13th August 2021. Sowing in the north is almost complete with Punjab reporting a slight dip. The sowing has been normal in Haryana while Rajasthan and Gujarat had reported dry spells earlier in June-

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July. There has been a dip in Maharashtra sowing since farmers shifted to other crops like soybean and groundnut, but some pick up is likely to be seen in Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu in the coming month.

The Central government plans for setting up research centers of ICAR- All India Coordinated Research Project on cotton at Warangal and Adilabad have commenced. According to the Union State Textile Minister the center had initiated a step for the promotion of Indian cotton under the brand name "Kasturi Cotton India". The ICAR research center will provide the necessary technical support in the form of test parameters and acceptance criteria for the branding on Indian cotton.

According to USDA'S Cotton Products update report, For the 2021-22 season India's cotton production is forecasted at 29.0 million bales, unchanged from the last month and up by around 2 percent from the previous year (28.0 million bales). The area harvested is forecasted at 12.9 million hectares marginally down from last month due to the slow progression of the southwest monsoon and competition with other crops such as soybean and pulses. Kharif cotton planting is underway in central and southern India as the two week monsoon delay has been followed by intense rains across the cotton producing states. Mill consumption is good at 25.5 million bales buoyed by strong export orders.

Cotton crop gets infected with parawilt in Mansa district. Due to the sudden change in the temperature cotton crop in some villages of Mansa district was affected by parawilt diseases. The disease is mainly caused due to rains when the temperature was high. As per agricultural experts, parawilt is also caused when the crop is sown in saline water. Cotton crops in villages like Jatana Kalan, Naharan, Karandi, Khaira Khurd, Khaira Kalan, Jhanda Khurd, Jhanda Kalan in Mansa district has shown signs of parawilt. The Agriculture Department has asked farmers not to panic over the attack as it could be controlled by spraying insecticides which are distributed free of cost by the government.

Gujarat textile sector expects boost in cotton exports. With the center announcing the new rate under the Rebate on Duties and Taxes on export Products (RoDTEP) scheme, textile exporter are expecting a boost in order volumes backed by better cost competitiveness. As per the new rates, RoDTEP extends incentives of 2.5% to 4.5% on the export of yarn and fabric of different kinds.

Cotton has been purchased at Rs. 6,500 per quintal in Mansa. Cotton arrivals have started coming in Mansa and has been purchased at a price of Rs. 6,500 per quintal against the minimum selling price of Rs. 6,025 per quintal. As per the market sources, the rise in prices is due to the competitive bidding amongst the private players including the cotton traders and factories which are placing bids and quoting higher price to purchase the produce.

Cotton ginners are expecting a good season in 2020-21. Cotton ginners across the country are hopeful of a better season in 2021-22 after a couple of lacklustre years. Cotton prices are currently ruling high at over Rs 7,000 per quintal. And cottonseed prices are hovering around Rs 4,500- 5,000 per quintal. The prices have been increasing as consumption by mills is strong and there is good demand for yarn. The Centre has fixed an MSP for medium staple cotton at Rs 5,716 per quintal for the 2021-22 season, higher than the previous year's Rs 5,515. For the long-staple cotton, the MSP for 2021-22 has been fixed at Rs 6,025 per quintal, against Rs 5,825 in the previous year.

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Cotton Production:

Modified cotton fabric which absorbs air pollutants has been developed by IIT Delhi. Researcher from IIT Delhi had developed a modified cotton fabric that is capable of absorbing harmful air pollutants like benzene, aniline, styrene etc. The modified cotton has been named as Zeolite Imidazolate Framework (ZIF) - 8@CM cotton and ZIF-67@CM cotton.

Cotton acreages are expected to come down by 15 percent. According to the cottonseed industry, the cotton acreages are expected to come down of about 15 percent with farmers shifting to oilseeds and pulses cultivation in several parts of the country. It may go down from the previous year's area of 129 lakh hectares.

Maharashtra has completed sowing on 139.10 lakh hectares for the current kharif season. Farmers from Maharashtra have completed 92 % of the kharif sowing operations. The average area under Kharif is around 139.10 lakh hectares along with sugarcane in the state. The state had completed sowing on nearly 137.23 lakh hectares by 10th August 2021. Excluding sugarcane, the sown area was around 136.01 lakh hectares, accounting for nearly 95.80% of the total sowing operations. Due to long breaks in monsoon and subsequent heavy rains, there has been attack of various pests and diseases. Some cotton fields in Marathwada and Vidarbha have reported pest infestation.

As per the latest estimates by Agriwatch, cotton output in the country during the season 2019-20 would be around 362.0 lakh bales (of 170 kg each). The cotton output in the 2020-21 season is estimated to increase to around 365.0 lakh bales, as the area sown under cotton has increased.

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Due to the good export parity in the 2019-20, exports are likely have increased to 50 lakh bales. Whereas, the imports in 2020-21 are likely to decline to around 10 lakh bales from 15 lakh balesin 2019-20.

The total cotton availability by the end of the season in 2019-20 is estimated at 402.8 lakh bales and even an even higher availability is expected in 2020-21 season of around 478.8 lakh bales.


Total domestic mill consumption (excluding non- mill consumption) in 2020-21 is expected to increase to 274.00 lakh bales in 2020-21, with the coming of festivals and also due to relaxation in lockdown restrictions in several states across the country.

So, the decline in consumption has result in higher ending stocks of around 103.82 lakh bales in 2019-20 and is likely to occur this year too, the endingstocks by the end of 2020-21 season is estimated to be 78.82 lakh bales. Although, as per Cotton Corporation of India the country had exhausted all its stocks and is now left with only 9 lakh bales before the start of the season in October, due to strong demand for cotton in the market but CAI and various government agencies data is yet to be released.


Kapas (Raw Cotton) Monthly Price Scenario




Kapas Monthly M-o-M Price Scenario

There were no arrivals during the past month.




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
Lint price Outlook

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




Cotton Seed Oil Cake monthlyPrice Scenario

International Market Scenario

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ICE front month futures were up by around 4 % in Aug'21 month compared in July'21. The average of ICE Oct contract stood high around 93.91 cents/lbs in Aug, up by 4.26 percent compared to the average price that stood in July around 90.07 cents/lbs.

Major Market Highlights:

According to an International Cotton Advisory Committee Report, after a 7 percent decrease in 2020-21, cotton production is projected to increase by 3 percent in 2021-22 season to 25 million tonnes. Global Consumption has also recovered from 2019-20, to post a 12.4 percent increase to 25.5 million tonnes in 2020-21 and is projected to improve further to 25.8 million tonnes in 2021-22. Also, the concerns remain due

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to Covid 19 stubbornness with threats from factory closures and logistical issues looming in Bangladesh and Vietnam.

- According to USDA'S World Agriculture Supply and Demand Estimate (WASDE) August report, for the 2020-21 global ending stocks are higher despite lower production and higher consumption. Global trade is raised and led by higher imports for China and Bangladesh. The U.S. 2020-21 balance reflected only a drop in exports by 50,000 bales to 16.35 million. The 2021-22 cotton crop was lowered by 118,000 tons to 3.76 million with leaving the planted acres unchanged. Exports were decreased by 44,000 tons to 3.27 million and ending stock was depressed by 65,000 tons to 0.66 million tons, down year over year by 6.3 percent.
- According to USDA'S World Agriculture Supply and Demand Estimate (WASDE) report, For 2021-22 U.S. Cotton projection, World cotton production is forecasted 546,000 bales lower at 118.84 million as reduced production in Brazil (12.50 million bales) and United States (17.26 million bales) offset higher projection for Australia, Mali, and Tanzania. Consumption is forecasted slightly higher up by 170,000 bales and ending stocks are projected at 87.2 million bales, about 500,000 bales lower than in July and 4.6 million lower than in 2020-21. India's cotton production is forecasted at 29.0 million bales, unchanged from the last month and up by around 2 percent from the previous year (28.0 million bales).
- According to the Food and Agriculture Outlook Report, India is expected to be the world's largest cotton
 producer till 2030. Despite the challenges including land constraints, water shortage, climate change and
 crop's susceptibility to pest and disease attacks, India will continue to be the World's largest cotton producer
 till 2030. India's cotton production is expected to expand to 7.2 million tonnes (approximately 43 million bales
 of 170 kg each) compared with the current output of 6 MT equivalent to roughly 36 million bales. India will
 contribute to as much as 40 percent global increase in cotton production during the outlook period.
- According to the Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA), Bangladesh and India can reap more mutual trade benefits through better collaboration in apparel and textile industry as there are great opportunities for Bangladesh and India to complement each other in boosting apparel and textile business in both the countries.
- Cotton picking has started in Pakistan. Cotton picking has commenced in Pakistan, as per the Agriculture Department, quality of cotton is good and no major pest attack was observed. The farmers are not only achieving good production but are also getting good price for their produce in the market.


