

COTTON WEEKLY RESEARCH REPORT 08th Jun 2020

Domestic market summary

Domestic market Scenario: Indian cotton market showed mixed trend during the week. The damage caused to the cotton crop due to the locust attack was witnessed to be in Rajasthan. Around 30% of the cotton area was in threat in Rajasthan and still the percentage loss is yet to discover. Another natural calamity, the cyclone Nisarga has made the harvested cotton prone to damage in Maharashtra and Gujarat. But even after the continuous rains the incurred damage is negligible in Gujarat while around 7 lakh quintals of kapas was damaged in Maharashtra due to poor storage facilities. The India cotton exchange prices stood anywhere between Rs 32,500 to 33,200 per candy. Gujarat Shankar-6 variety cotton spot prices in Cotton Association of India stood around Rs.35,000/ candy during the week.

Weekly Price Outlook: The average price of Kapas is likely to remain between Rs. 4700-5000/q in Rajkot while the prices in Andhra Pradesh likely to hover around Rs.4200-4550/q.

Major Market Highlights:

- Still Indian cotton is cheaper in the international market and CCI is daily purchasing about 50% of the arrivals.
- Cotlook index remained steady (66.75 cents/lbs) higher compared to the ICE cotton future stood slightly higher (59.35 cents/lbs).
- All India arrivals have reached between 50,000 to 70,000 bales per day.
- Indian Rupee remained weaker between 75.18 and 75.72 during this week.

Market Highlights:

- Government has increased the MSP for kharif crops in 2020-21 season by 2-13% hike. The CCEA has approved the hike for the upcoming kharif crops to provide benefit to farmers. Therefore, a rise of around 5% is recommended in medium and long staple length of cotton. There is an increase of Rs.275/q and Rs.260/q to Rs.5,825/q and Rs.5,515/q in long and medium staple length cotton respectively. The MSP for long staple length cotton was Rs.5,550/q and Rs.5255/q for medium staple in 2019-20 season.
- The rise in MSP is favourable for farmers that encourages them to grow more for the coming season. But the 5% hike in MSP is somewhere would be troublesome for spinners. Already northern part of India is witnessing higher cotton acreage and the southern and western cotton belts are yet start sowing. The cotton demand and trade prospects in cotton year 2020 have been severely hampered owing to the pandemic. The yarn and garment demand is impacted which is likely to result in a decline in cotton consumption for cotton year 2020. Therefore, the year that would end by September this year with higher ending stock. That would gradually does not support the prices in the coming year.



- CCI has done promising procurement of cotton from the farmers of around 95 lakh bales so far till May end this year against the target of 100 lakh bales in 2019-20. During lockdown, CCI started purchasing cotton after a halt of around one month in April last week and till May end it procured around 10 lakh bales despite the disruptions caused in the lockdown. But the as per the higher crop estimation this year, the slow pace in the procurement is not enough to buy all the crop that is left with the farmers (around 55 lakh bales) before the onset of monsoon.
- The sowing in Punjab, Haryana and Rajasthan is almost complete. The area in Rajasthan has remained near same compared to last year around 6 lakh hectare. While the significant area is increased in Punjab and around 5-10% increase in area is expected in Haryana. As the locusts have attacked severely in few areas in Rajasthan and Punjab areas that share border with Pakistan. Still the states are assessing the loss caused in those regions that are attacked by locusts but the main cotton belt near border is Sri ganganagar which covers around 30% of total area of Rajasthan that is likely to be affected more. No major loss is observed in Punjab and Haryana so far.
- In Nagpur district, total 16,75,028 quintals of cotton has been procured from 81,648 farmers till end of May. This includes 3,05,072 quintals of cotton procured by Maharashtra Marketing Federation from 12,863 farmers. Besides, CCI has procured 83,643 quintals of cotton from 2,114 farmers. And those holding marketing permit and licensed traders are procuring cotton from APMC are procuring cotton. Cotton Federation and CCI were procuring cotton at 23 ginning and pressing units in the district. It is expected that all the cotton with farmers will be procured by the onset of monsoon.

As per the latest estimates by Agriwatch, cotton output in country during the season 2019-20 would be around 351.8 lakh bales (of 170 kg each) whereas 321 lakh bales was produced in 2018-19.

Due to the good export parity in the current year, exports are likely to surge by around 8% to 45 lakh bales. The pandemic made the exports viable and cheaper in the international market.

Whereas, the imports are likely to decline to around 16.5 lakh bales from the previous estimates of 23 lakh bales in 2019-20.

Due to lower opening stock but estimation of higher production of cotton would increase the availability the new season at 392.8 lakh bales.

Total domestic mill consumption (excluding non- mill consumption) in 2019-20 is likely to decline by around 15% amid covid-19 pandemic to 240.6 lakh bales compared to 286 lakh bales during the previous season.


So, decline in consumption would result in higher ending stocks to around 88 lakh bales, it is higher much higher compared to the ending stocks of previous season.




Domestic Cotton Prices Scenario

Kapas (Raw Cotton) Weekly Price Scenario

Weekly Price Review: Weekly kapas average price at Rajkot remained weaker at Rs. 4653/q during last 6 days due to the slower CCI procurement and the market was closed for 3 days on the announcement of arrival of cyclone. Major activity is done by the private traders procuring lower grade cotton. The prices stood at Rs. 4787/quintal in the previous week. The arrivals started in Ahmedabad and Amarawati.



Kapas Monthly M-o-M Price Scenario



Few markets of Kapas (seed cotton) in country were openend in May month, the monthly average price was ruling lower in May at Rs. 4768/q much lower compared to the prices during the corresponding month of the previous season due to the lower demand this year. Monthly average price of Kapas at Rajkot remained Rs. 4887 per quintal during April, which was Rs 6302/quintal during the corresponding month last year in April'19. We expect Kapas prices to remain steady to low further in the coming month (June) due to the lower demand across the country as well as in international market.




Spot Price versus MSP

There were quite lower arrivals during the week ending on 6th June'20 in Gondal. Kapas average price at Gondal market was closed at Rs.4658/q much lower than MSP and from the prices before lockdown that stood at Rs. 5245/q. Average price in the week stood further down by around Rs.892/q from MSP (Rs.5550/q). The average gap between the spot price and MSP has increased after the lockdown amid coronavirus.



Lint price Outlook


The Sirsa market was active last week while the markets in Punjab were closed as the sowing for new season has started and coming to end of sowing process. The average price in the week stood around Rs. 3560/q a slight increase as few mills were opened and the prior week the stood around Rs.3526/maund of 37.32 kg each. There were no arrivals in other markets. The arrivals slightly increased the week ending on 30th May'20 to 6800 quintals from 5100 quintals in the prior week.





Cotton Fiber price Outlook

The average cotton fiber (Shankar-6) of premium quality prices increased to Rs. 34733/candy from around Rs. 34433 compared to the previous week due to the support gained from smoother exports of cotton. Also, the demand from international market seems positive as Indian cotton is now cheaper in the world market. Average price were around Rs. 45,783 per candy last year duing the same time. We expect cotton fiber to remain steady to firm in range of Rs 33500-35500 per candy in the coming week candy.




Cotton Seed Oil and Cotton Seed Oil Cake

Cotton seed oil price marginally showed positive trend across all the centres during the week ending on 6th June'20 due to hike in kapas prices. Weekly average price in Hyderabad stood weaker at Rs. 816 and in Mumbai the prices ranged around Rs. 823 and Rs.772 per 10 Kg in New Delhi.




Cotton Seed Oil Cake weekly Price Scenario

NCDEX Cotton seed oil cake futures ended with a firm note in the past week contrary to the spot prices. The cotton seed oilcake spot prices showed mixed trend. The NCDEX spot prices in Kadi stood at slightly lower Rs. 2232/q and Rs.2103/q in Akola. The buying pressure increased in the futures market. NCDEX Cocudakl is now getting support at 2052 and below same could see a test of 2020 levels, and first resistance is now likely to be seen at 2270. The prices are lower compared to the previous year due to the shortage of crop in the previous year. Weekly average price in Akola was Rs. 1866 per quintal before lockdown in March.

International Market Scenario

International US cotton spot prices stood slightly weak at 59.9 cents/lbs during the week. Also Cotlook A index weekly average stood slightly firm at 66.87 cents/pound this week, which was 66.33 at cents/pound during last week.

Major Market Highlights:


- The cotton in Brazil is about harvest within 25 days in last week of June. The expected crop is up to 13.5 million bales in 2020-21. In its May estimate, CONAB lowered 2020-2021 cotton acreage 6,100 hectares to 1,671,000 hectares. Exports were lowered by 300,000 tons to 7.810 bales, while ending stocks were placed at 9,013,950 bales. In April, Brazil shipped 4.16 lakh bales, and Vietnam was the top destination of 19,326 tons, followed by Turkey 16,776, China 13,582, and Indonesia 10,503 tons. As Brazil is still experiencing increased virus cases and death, therefore, Brazilian retailers and brands have also canceled orders, and the domestic market will be weak for some time. The record 2019 crop and the reduced domestic cotton use since March have caused Brazil to face a record inventory of unsold stocks that will is likely to carryover in the opening stock of 2020.
- According to the USDA's weekly Crop Progress and Condition Report, cotton is 66 percent planted across the Cotton Belt, versus a five-year average of 66 percent in the week ending on 31st May'20. The sowing progress was slightly higher by 1% in the previous year during the same time. The progress of planting was 48% fair and 39% good during the season so far. Planting advanced at a rapid pace as dry conditions allowed, but fieldwork was delayed in portions of Alabama and Georgia where the heaviest rainfall occurred. In some areas, producers are considering replanting options as seedlings failed to make a stand due to heavy rainfall. While in Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas are going through a dry spell, posing a threat to cotton crops.

Cotlook A Index

Cotlook A index noticed slightly firm in last week. The Cotlook A Index was at 66.87 cents/lb lower than the previous week (66.33 cents/lb) and a slight hike compared to the previous week.



USA Spot Prices

Market recovered after fear of expected small cotton crop in Texas due to weather concern. For the week ending May 31, the USDA estimated planting of the 2020 cotton crop at 66% complete, up 13 percentage points compared to the previous week. Planting progress remains on par with the rolling 5-year average pace. Net export sales and shipments against 2019-20 were notably lower (sales were net negative) against the previous sales period at approximately 10,000 running bales and 240,000 running bales, respectively. The US is 115% committed and 80% shipped agaisnt the USDA's export projection.

Pakistan Spot Prices

The prices stood weaker compared to the previous week by around 2%. Cotton trade in the local market has been sluggish during the last week. Textile mills showed no interest in buying cotton while ginners are waiting for the buyers of their stock of 5 lac cotton bales. Partial arrival of new cotton crop from lower areas of Sindh has started. Although cotton sowing is still going on in Punjab, the main reason that cotton growers have to sow cotton two or three times this year, is poor seed quality.






