

COTTON WEEKLY RESEARCH REPORT 21st Mar 2022

Domestic market summary

Domestic Market Scenario: Indian cotton market remained firm during the week. Yarn market was dull so spinners faced tough time to get good quality cotton and sell yarn on the parity. All India daily arrivals decreasing rapidly and tight supply gave strong stand to the Indian market. Russia-Ukraine conflicts remained main focus for speculation. Indian cotton Shanker-6 prices remained stable near Rs. 77,500 to 78,300 per candy.

Weekly Price Outlook:

The average price of Kapas is likely to remain firm between Rs. 11,000-11,240/Qtl in Rajkot while the prices in Andhra Pradesh are likely to hover around Rs.10,200-10400/Qtl.

Major Market Highlights:

- The Cotlook Index stood higher (133.15 cents/lbs) compared to the ICE Cotton Futures that stood at 116.94 cents/lbs.
- Indian rupee remained weak against USD due to ongoing Ukraine-Russia conflict.

Market Highlights:

- Cotton prices continue to rule at elevated levels across the country with quality produce of the cotton. Arrival
 of cotton has dropped to 75,000 bales across the country. As per the local sources, there is a huge variation
 in the quality of the cotton coming to the markets. According to Indian Texpreneurs Federation, Cotton
 quality is a concern. Yarn realisation from cotton is low due to this, forcing higher wastage for spinning mills.
- According to the Ministry of Textiles, the production of organic cotton in India has increased in the current season in Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra. The production of organic cotton in India is 1.23 million tonnes which is 51 percent of global organic cotton production. However, organic cotton production is limited to few states owing to the higher production cost, lower demand and farmers turning to illegal GM seeds.
- Despite the infestation of pink bollworm on cotton crop during the 2021-22 seasons, Punjab has set a target to increase area under cotton by 23 percent in the coming 2022-23 season. Cotton was sown in 2021-22 season at 119.66 lakh hectares as compared to previous seasons of 128.07 lakh hectares across India.
- Cotton Association of India has reduced its January estimate of the cotton crop for the 2021-22 season by 5 lakh bales to 343.13 lakh bales from its previous estimate of 348.13 lakh bales. The association has attributed the reduction in crop estimate to the drop in production in states including Gujarat, Telangana, Odisha, Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh. AgriWatch has estimated cotton production for 2021-22 season at 342.60 lakh bales lower from its previous season estimate of 365.00 lakh bales.
- The total cotton supply between October 2021 to January 2022 remained at 272.20 lakh bales, which consists of the arrivals of 192.20 lakh bales, imports of 5 lakh bales during the month of January 2022 and Opening Stock of 75 lakh bales equivalent to 79.69 lakh running bales at the beginning of the season on 1st


October 2021. Further, the CAI has estimated cotton consumption for the months of October to January 2022 at 114 lakh bales while export shipment of cotton during the months of October to January 2022 is estimated at 25 lakh bales. Stock at the end of January 2022 is estimated at 113.20 lakh bales.








Cotton Seed Oil Cake weekly price Scenario

International Market Scenario

- The US Department of Agriculture (USDA) has pegged India's cotton production at 5,770 MT lower from its previous month estimate of 5,879 MT. The USDA has stated though the area under cotton had dropped to a five-year low of 124 lakh hectares, a higher yield of 465 kg/ha had helped bridge the gap a bit. Last month, the Cotton Association of India (CAI), has also reduced its crop estimates to 343.13 lakh bales from its earlier projection of 348.13 lakh bales.
- The ongoing Russia-Ukraine war has made the textile shipments in Bangladesh uncertain as many of the international containers lines have suspended shipping to Russia. Besides, others are also showing reluctance in taking of Russia-bound containers bookings.
- Trading volume in local cotton market in Pakistan remained low. A bearish trend was witnessed after fluctuation in international cotton market. Negative effect of war between Russia and Ukraine are seen over market sentiments. The rate of cotton in Sindh is ranging between Rs. 18000 to Rs. 20,000 per maund.
- The USDA in its March WASDE report has maintained its outlook for U.S. cotton from February report. There were no changes to the domestic balance sheet for cotton, with an average estimated farm price for upland cotton of \$.90 per pound.


In the world 2021-22 cotton balance sheet, ending stocks are 1.7 million bales lower than a month earlier (18,355 MT). A 300,000-bale decrease in production accounts for some of this change, but most of the decline stems from lower beginning stocks, reflecting updated Indian consumption estimates for 2019-20 and 2020-21 to reflect Indian government sources. Projected world 2021-22 consumption is marginally higher this month, up 111,000 bales. But with a 1-million-bale increase in the 2020-21 global estimates, March's projected consumption growth rate is lower this month. World consumption is now expected to grow 2.1% from a year earlier, below the 2.8% rate forecast in February. Production is projected lower as a 500,000-bale reduction in India's crop more than offsets a 150,000-bale increase for Mexico.

Cotlook A Index

Cotlook A Index was lower this week. The Cotlook A Index was at 135.09 cents/lb lower as compared to the previous week (134.18 cents/lb), possibly led by the lowering of production in the US and World by USDA. All other markets also seem to have taken a cue from the same.


