

**Soy Meal Fundamentals:** Steady to weak tone are seen in Soymeal markets today, Monday. Soymeal (Indore) prices closed lower at Rs.30200/T against 30500/T.

- The provisional data of SOPA reveals India's August 2020 soymeal exports are down by 41% Y-o-Y at 45,000 metric tonnes compared to 76,000 metric tonnes. \*Figures may change later, if revised by the Association.
- The soybean crush margins continued to remain negative due to the weak factors and we expect them to recover if the demand in meal picks up and the soybean imports fall which surged by 52% in July'20. Given the bearish global soybean supply outlook for the season, both demand in meal and reduction in soybean import are unlikely in short-to-medium-term.
- Indian soybean exports is already facing stiff competition from meal of South American origin due to their price competitiveness. The suspension of MEIS benefit/incentive of 5% by the Indian government have further made it challenging. India has lost the traditional South East Asian markets to South America in recent years. It is unable to market soybean as non-GM which was an advantage few years back; Japan was the big buyer of non-GM soybean of Indian origin earlier.
- In a major blow to the domestic soybean market, which was already reeling under pressure, DGFT has blocked the online registration of Merchandise Export from India Scheme Claims (MEIS), this week, on its portal from exports undertaken 01.04.2020 onwards. This will result in further decline in soybean exports from India, as MEIS benefit of 5% is a significant incentive to compete in the world market. SOPA has made a representation to the government to revoke the suspension of the MEIS benefit immediately. The revenue department have argued against continuing the MEIS, calling it wasteful and inefficient.
- Vietnam, Indonesia, Philippines, Thailand, S. Korea and Japan combined together is forecast to import 19.75 Mn T of soybean in 2020/21 mainly from Argentina, Brazil and US.
- The export of oilmeals from India during July 2020 is provisionally reported at 262,085 tons compared to 233,042 tons in July, 2019 i.e. up by 12%. The main reason in increased of oilmeals in July 2020 is sharp increase in export of rapeseed meal to 148,170 tons from 122,573 tons in July 2019. The overall export of oilmeals during April to July 2020 is provisionally reported at 841,195 tons compared to 917,811 tons during the same period of previous year i.e. down by 8.34% - SEA.
- India's soybean shipments may fall to around 500,000 tonnes in 2019-20 (Oct-Sep), less than one fourth of the year-ago figure of 2.1 million tonnes due to slack in demand from traditional overseas buyers amid ongoing lockdowns, said, Soybean Processors Association of India Chairman Davish Jain.
- India's soybean production of the country is likely to stand at 62.78 lakh tonnes. Carry over stock of Soybean is estimated at 1.59 lakh tonnes and 1.37 lakh tons of carry forward stocks. While export sea and land may stand at 10 lakh tonnes lower output and non-competitive prices in world market. India had exported total 22 lakh tonnes in last year in 2018-19 season. Domestic consumption of Soybean (Food) is estimated at 5.50 lakh tonnes and 47.50 lakh tonnes for Feed. In October month, India has exported total 0.50 lakh tonnes of Soybean lower against 1.31 in Oct 2018 on lower overseas demand.
- During the week (September 11 to September 17, 2020) US Net sales of 28,600 MT for 2020/2021 were down noticeably from the previous week, but up 30 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases primarily for Mexico

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(10,900 MT), Nicaragua (10,500 MT, including 6,000 MT switched from El Salvador, 4,600 MT switched from Guatemala, and decreases of 100 MT), Canada (8,900 MT, including decreases of 4,900 MT), Jamaica (4,600 MT), and Indonesia (3,100 MT), were offset by reductions primarily for El Salvador (6,000 MT) and Guatemala (5,600 MT). For 2020/2021, net sales of 294,700 MT were primarily for unknown destinations (100,000 MT), the Dominican Republic (58,000 MT), Mexico (26,800 MT), Canada (24,700 MT), and the Philippines (22,500 MT). Exports of 138,200 MT were down 40 percent from the previous week and 31 percent from the prior 4-week average. The destinations were to the Philippines (55,600 MT), Mexico (28,000 MT), Canada (18,300 MT), Nicaragua (15,500 MT), and Panama (9,800 MT).

- In the July 20 report, USDA has kept India's soymeal production at 6.64 million tonnes for 2019/20 in lower from 7.68 million tonnes in 2018/19 season. Domestic consumption is also placed unchanged at 5.49 million tonnes for this season which was estimated at 5.28 million tonnes last season.
