Weekly Onion Report 1 April 2014

Executive Summary:

- All India, cumulative onion arrival during 4th week of March month is approximately 70.42% higher compared to previous year, on a week on week basis, arrivals in 4th week of March are also 22.75% higher than previous week. During the last week most of the markets were reported closed due to holiday period (festive season).
- Sources revealed that, from MP region like Shahjanpur, Gwalior after 20th April new arrivals likely to start.
- As per trade sources, onion prices may likely to go up in coming days due to crop loss in MP and Maharashtra region.
- In Delhi market arrivals coming from Rajasthan and Gujarat region.
- In benchmark market of Lasalgaon market prices have increased by 4.99%. Arrivals in Lasalgaon lower by 21.88% as compared to the previous week and support the prices.

Above table shows wholesale and retail prices of onion across different markets. Mixed sentiment witnessed in all the markets. Maximum prices have decreased in Kolkata by 21.07% followed by Patna where it has decreased from 10.76% respectively. In Bangalore, onion is arriving in market from local region (Gulbarga and Chitradurga districts) and Maharashtra region.





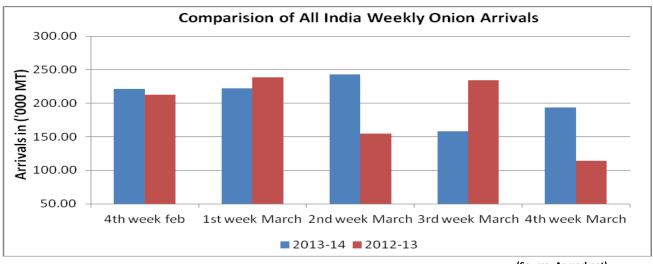

The above table depicts the weekly difference between prices and arrivals in producing regions. Market was mostly firm in all the producing regions because of lower arrivals. Arrivals are expected to increase further as harvesting of Rabi crop will pick up pace. However, in Solapur, Lasalgaon and Pimpalgaon arrivals were reported down.

The above graph depicts the week on week basis All India onion arrivals compared to last year. This year arrivals are comparatively higher than last year due to higher onion prices which attracted farmers to grow onion on larger scale.





Technical Analysis of Onion Prices at Lasalgaon, Nasik:



(Note: Each bar or "candle" in the chart shows the price movement in a particular week. The green candle signifies prices increased and red candle signifies prices decreased in that week. The length of the "candle" shows the upper and lower end of the price range for the week.)

The above chart shows the weekly price movement of onion in the benchmark of Lasalgaon mandi of Nasik. Range bound movement seen in the market. On the higher side prices may find resistance at a level of Rs 1055/ quintal and on the lower side prices may find support at level of Rs 580/ quintal. As we were expecting that prices may rise as per Fibonacci retracement and that exactly is in continuation for last 3-4 weeks. It is expected that prices will increase before it start falling again with the higher arrivals in coming weeks.
