

Kharif Sowing Scenario:

- After a late start and slow pick-up, monsoon rains seemed to gain momentum in the last week of June, though the overall rainfall deficit continues across South India and most parts of the country. This is an active phase of the monsoon. Heavy rains are expecting till the first week of July which is likely to be favorable for the Kharif Sowing.
- Farmers are expecting a delayed start of Red Chilli sowing, with a delay of 20-25 days observed in most growing regions. However, favorable monsoon conditions have raised hopes for the sowing process to commence next week.

RED CHILLI

Fundamentals:

Today's Update:

- Mostly steady sentiment was reported in the Red Chilli spot markets on Friday.
- Currently, farmers are offloading their inferior quality stocks in the spot markets (on an average 10,000 to 15,000 bags, 1 bag = 45 kgs) which are not kept in the cold storage and for best quality cold-storage varieties, they are waiting for improvement in market demand.
- Farmers are expecting delay in start of Red Chilli sowing, with a lag of 20-25 days observed in most growing regions. However, favorable monsoon conditions have raised hopes for the sowing process to commence next week.
- AgriWatch forecasts a medium-term price rebound driven by increased demand from export markets such as China, Malaysia, and Bangladesh, along with the demand from masala millers and Chilli Oleoresin companies and hence these factors are expected to support market arrivals.

Previous Update:

• As per AgriWatch estimates, Red Chilli all India production for 2023 is estimated at 15.56 lakh metric tonne (LMT). Last year's production was 14.07 lakh MT, up by 10.59%.
