

### Domestic Market Highlights:

- **As per the ministry of Agriculture, Kharif Rice acreage as on 05<sup>th</sup> July 2019 has declined by 23.5 per cent at 52.47 lakh hectares** as compared to 68.60 lakh hectares same period down by 33% from normal area as on date of 79.36 lakh hectares. The area coverage is mainly reported from Uttarakhand (1.82 lakh hectares), Assam (3.14 lakh hectares), Nagaland (1.86 lakh hectares), Chhatisgarh (4.38 lakh hectares), Kerala (0.33 lakh hectares), Odisha (5.16 lakh hectares), Tamil Nadu (0.65 lakh hectares), J&K (0.07 lakh hectares), etc.
- **The Government has announced to increase the MSP of normal grade paddy by 65 rupees to 1815** and 'A' grade Paddy MSP of 1835 rupees per quintal. MSP increased in paddy, not according to expectation. The government does not want to encourage paddy sowing to see the water crisis. Increasing the MSP will not affect the prices of paddy.
- **Rice export prices in India edged higher this week, helped by an uptick in demand, while a strong Thai baht propped up prices** in the world's second largest rice exporter amid subdued consumption. In India, the top exporter of the staple grain, 5 percent broken parboiled variety was quoted around \$369-\$372 per tonne this week, up from last week's \$367-\$370. Traders are seeing interest building up from West African markets. Farmers have planted summer-sown rice on 630,000 hectares as of June 21, down 32% compared with the same period a year ago, according to provisional data from the Ministry of Agriculture, as the monsoon delivered less-than-average rainfall.
- **To save Basmati export to Europe, USA and Arab countries, Punjab, which is highest user of fertilisers** and insecticides per hectare in the country, much above the national average, has launched a 'pesticide-free' Basmati campaign in the state. Basmati exporters and Basmati growers in the state are now working together to use fewer pesticides in order meets the new guidelines of the European Union (EU) and other countries regarding the Basmati import from India. This effort is to achieve total compliance with EU Maximum Residue Level (MRLs). The Department of Agriculture, through its network of field officers, would recruit fresh agriculture graduates to fan out to all the Basmati clusters in the state and directly remain in touch with the farmers.
- **NCDEX started futures trading of Mung and basmati from July 1, NCDEX has sought approval** from SEBI to launch futures trading in Tur and Urad.
- **Due to the decrease in supply and availability during the last few weeks, there has been a huge increase** of about 20 per cent of the price of Sona mansuri and kolam. In the eastern part of Karnataka and in the Vidarbha region of Maharashtra, this non-basmati coconut rice is mass production and the customer likes it very much. In fact, due to severe drought in major producing areas of these two states, the paddy crop was badly affected and accordingly the production of rice decreased.
- **With the delay in the monsoon, paddy sowing is being affected in the country. Paddy sowing has** been done in 4.3 lakh hectare in the country till June 14, which was 5.47 lakh hectares during the same period last year. If monsoon is weak, then it may have an impact on paddy production.

- Farmers in Haryana are posing a positive attitude towards the state government's efforts to discourage paddy cultivation under the Crop Diversification Scheme and to promote maize and arhar paddy cultivation in the state.** Within Haryana, 11,535 farmers in 8 blocks of the districts have expressed their resolve to leave paddy cultivation in 7443 hectares and start farming of alternative crops. As per the official data, till June 10, 2850 farmers in Pundari block of Kaithal district had 975 hectares, 2605 farmers in Asandh block of Karnal district, 1892 hectares, and 1768 farmers in Ambala and Saha blocks of Ambala district had paddy in 1468 hectares. The place has pledged to cultivate other crops. In addition, 1682 farmers of Jind district of Naroda block, in 1294 hectares, 1332 farmers in Umri block of Kurukshetra district in 1090 hectares, 678 farmers in Gannaur block of Sonapat district 373 hectares and 620 farmers in Radaur block of Yamunanagar district 351 has decided to adopt crop diversification scheme in the area. The seeds of maize and arhar will be provided free of cost to the farmers, assistance will be provided at a rate of Rs. 2000 per acre, under the Prime Minister's Crop Insurance Scheme, the Government will bear the burden of the premium and procurement of maize and arhar will be done by the provincial agencies at the minimum support price.
- Chhattisgarh government announces the sale of rice at a concessional rate of 10 rupees per kg to 7 lakh families over poverty line**
- Indian rice exports have been robust since the beginning of MY 2018/19 on strong demand for both** Basmati rice to the traditional markets, especially Iran, and non-Basmati rice to traditional African markets due to the GOI's export subsidy (5 percent of FOB value for exports from November 26, 2018 to March 25, 2019). According to preliminary official statistics, rice exports from October 2018 to March 2019 were estimated at 6.05 MMT, nearly the same for the corresponding period last year. Market sources reported a strong surge in the first quarter of CY 2019 on strong exports of long grain Basmati rice to Iran under the special rupee payment arrangement (against India's oil imports from Iran) and nonBasmati rice to avail the 5 percent export subsidy before the March 25, 2019, deadline. While official data is not yet available, market sources report slowdown in the pace of exports since April 2019. Rice exporters may also seek an extension of the export subsidy, which could support exports in the last quarter of MY 2018/19
- Paddy production in the current kharif season can be reduced by 4% from last year to 97.8 lakh hectares.** Like other crops, paddy crop also depends entirely on rain.
- The Paddy nursery sowing is ongoing. And farmer has cultivated the field after harvest of rabi crop.** Rainfall received in month of May-19 in Haryana, Punjab and Rajasthan was beneficial in preparation of the field. Farmer is interested to paddy crop because farmers reaped good yield and market price in the last year.
- Average monthly wholesale rice prices in India stood at around Rs.3527 per quintal in May-2019,** up by 1.76% from Rs.3466 per quintal in April-2019 and up by 23% from Rs.2864 per quintal a year ago. Agriwatch expects non-basmati rice market to move range bound with firm tone due to decreasing of arrival from major producing regions and demand of Indian rice from overseas buyers.
- Prices of India's 5 percent broken rice were unchanged from last week at \$364-\$367 per tonne.** Export demand is weak but we couldn't cut prices due to the rising rupee. A strong rupee reduces exporters' margin from overseas sales.
- Haryana Government sought FCI approval from raising the milling charge of paddy from Rs 10 to Rs 15,** for a long time Rice Millers of Haryana were demanding increasing milling charges. The Haryana Government is trying to improve the situation of rice mills in the state. The State

Government has approved the approval of the FCI to increase the charge of milling in the central pool to Rs 15 per kg, which is currently 10 rupees per kg. If FCI approves this proposal, then about 1000 rice mills will benefit.

- **Egypt has issued tender for purchase of Indian, Chinese and Vietnamese rice in international markets.** Whose shipment will be from July 25 to August 20.

### International Market Highlight:

- **Restrictions will be imposed on rice cultivation in Iranian provinces other than the two Northern provinces** of Gilan and Mazandaran. According to deputy agriculture minister for water and soil affairs, the decision has been made by the Cabinet and conveyed to provinces across the country for implementation.
- **In the international market, India's 5% broken parboiled rice was quoted around \$371 - \$374 per tonne this week-** down from last week's \$373 - \$376. Aggressive selling of old inventories by China was reported to weigh on the global prices.
- **Bangladesh has postponed a decision on lifting its ban on rice exports** until the completion of summer rice harvest as cyclone Fani is estimated to have partially damaged the summer sown "Boro" crop on 55,600 hectares of land.
- **Egypt is seeking to buy at least 20,000 tonnes of 10-12 percent broken rice for delivery between July 25 and Aug. 20,** a source with Vietnam's Ministry of Industry and Trade was reported saying.
- **Ivory Coast banned rice imports from Singapore-based commodity trader Olam International for one year** after destroying an 18,000-tonne shipment of spoilt.
- **Rice production in Burma (also called Myanmar) in MY 2019/20 is forecast to increase as farmers increase** planting acreage in anticipation of favorable weather and due to attractive prices. Burma's overall rice exports in MY 2019/20 are forecast remain at the same level as MY 2018/19 at 3.0 MMT. There will be some lost market potential in the EU, offset by some increased market potential in China.
