Domestic Market Highlights:

- Exporters Worried about Indian Basmati Rice Exports to Iran Stalling: Iran, the most important importer of Indian basmati rice, has now almost stopped its purchase and has started sourcing basmati rice from Pakistan. In fact, India had earlier sought crude mineral oil from Iran and in return sent other agricultural products including basmati rice. But because of US pressure it stopped importing mineral oil, Iran also had to stop importing basmati rice. Already, Indian exporters owed about Rs 2000 crore in Iran, which has not yet been paid. The Indian basmati region is facing the brunt of the US embargo on Iran. His economic condition has become very weak and hence he is not in a position to spend much foreign exchange. The European Union and the United Arab Emirates have enacted strict quality regulations for basmati rice. This is expected to further affect its exports there.
- The government is considering cutting the minimum reserve price (minimum reserve price) of rice sold under the Open Market Sale Scheme (OMSS) as its level is higher than the open market price and hence the trading community is not actively involved in its purchase, Or not showing interest. According to rough estimates, the reserve price of government rice may be cut by up to Rs 500 per quintal.
- MY 2018-19 rice exports estimate is revised lower to 10.5 MMT, more than 13 percent lower than
 last year. Market sources report significant exports slowdown of non-Basmati (coarse grain) rice in
 the second half of the marketing season on weakening export competitiveness of Indian rice vis-avis other origins. Post's MY 2018/19 rice exports estimate is revised lower to 10.5 MMT, more than

- In the current kharif marketing season, a total of 230.27 lakh tonnes of paddy has been purchased by farmers in various states of the country by the Food Corporation of India (FCI) and its associated provincial agencies, the subordinate agency of the Central Government. This paddy has been procured at the minimum support price for the central pool and the procurement process is still in progress. According to the available official data, Food Corporation's participation in the procurement of a total of 230.27 lakh tonnes of paddy till 15 November 2019 was only 2.48 lakh tonnes while the remaining paddy was purchased by the provincial. Its volume was recorded at 227.79 lakh tonnes.
- Maximum 154.12 lakh tonnes of paddy has been purchased from the mandis of Punjab, while 63.14 lakh tonnes has been procured in Haryana, 6.20 lakh tonnes in Uttar Pradesh and 5.95 lakh tonnes in Uttarakhand. Apart from this, a small quantity of paddy has been purchased from other provinces. Under this, government procurement of paddy has been done in 39 thousand tons in Tamil Nadu, 26 thousand tons in Kerala and 21 thousand tons in Union Territory-Chandigarh. It is noteworthy that government procurement of paddy has not started in many states which have made significant contribution to the central pool. This includes states like Orissa, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh and Assam. The Food Corporation of India has purchased 2.07 lakh tonnes of paddy directly in Punjab, 21 thousand tonnes in Chandigarh, 15 thousand tonnes in Uttar Pradesh and 5 thousand tonnes in Haryana. The minimum support price of paddy has been increased to Rs 85 per quintal. Paddy support price increased from Rs 1750 per quintal for general category to Rs 1815 per quintal for general category and from Rs 1770 per quintal for 'A' grade to Rs 1835 per quintal for the current marketing season 2019-20 as compared to 2018-19 has been done.

• In the current season, FCI has set a paddy purchase target of 416 lakh tonnes. Which reached 230.27 lakh tonnes by 15 November. Bulbul storm damaged paddy crop in West Bengal and Orissa but rains from this storm in Tamil Nadu benefited paddy crop, export demand is also very weak.

GRIWATCH

- Indian rice export prices extended losses for a second week as the rupee weakened and demand from Africa remained low, while a cyclone damaged paddy fields in neighbouring Bangladesh. Top exporter India's 5% broken parboiled variety was quoted around \$363-\$368 per tonne, down from \$365-\$370 last week. In dollar terms, export prices are down due to the weak rupee. Local paddy rice prices are firm. The Indian rupee fell to a two-month low on Wednesday, increasing exporters' margins.
- Bulbul storms damaged 1.5 million hectares of crops in West Bengal. The government assured farmers to recover 100% loss. In West Bengal, the sowing of pulses-oilseeds crops is very less, so this storm did not have much effect on the pulses-oilseeds, the most impact was on paddy. Out of 4 million area under paddy, it is expected that around 0.9 million hectares were under damage.
- Tamil Nadu is one of the few states in the country where the production of kharif crops will be the same as last year. There is less damage to the crop in Tamil Nadu as compared to other states, Tamil Nadu mainly sows paddy and rain is a boon for paddy. Paddy sowing reached 11 lakh hectares in Sambha season (Kharif season) of Tamil Nadu. The paddy crop benefited from good rains.
- Paddy crop in 71K ha damaged in Odisha. Farmers of coastal areas in the district are a worried lot after the cyclonic storm destroyed their standing paddy crop. Kharif paddy was cultivated in over 1.24 lakh hectare in the district. A preliminary report of the district administration states that 71,000 ha of standing paddy crop was damaged due to heavy rainfall and gusty winds. Of the nine blocks where standing paddy crops were affected, Rajnagar, Rajkanika and parts of Pattamundai blocks were the worst hit, said Kendrapara sub-collector Jyotishankar Mohapatra. A prelim report of district agriculture department estimates the paddy crop loss in over 39,092 ha to the extent of 33%.
- Cyclone Bulbul causes massive damage to paddy crops in Odisha. Odisha was lucky enough to escape the direct wrath of cyclonic storm Bulbul which made a landfall in West Bengal. However, farmers in coastal districts in the State are now left in lurch as standing paddy crops in several hectares of agricultural lands have reportedly been damaged due to heavy rainfall triggered by the cyclonic storm. There has been extensive damage to paddy and other standing crops in Bhadrak, Kendrapara and Jagatsinghpur districts. Though the agriculture department had earlier issued advisory for farmers to initiate measures to protect crops in view of heavy rain forecast by BKC WeatherSys, farmers are now staring at a huge loss as the crops which were ready for harvest have been damaged.
- Over 66 lakh tons of paddy arrived in Haryana: During the current Kharif marketing season, more than 66.58 lakh tons of paddy arrived in the grain markets of Haryana between October 1 and November 11, which is about 1.90 lakh tons more than the quantity of 64.68 lakh tons in the same period last year. According to the Food Department, out of this total arrival of 66.58 lakh tons, 62.02 lakh tons of paddy was procured by government agencies, while the remaining 4.55 lakh tons of paddy was purchased by rice millers and traders. More than 33.58 lakh tons of paddy has been purchased by the Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Department of Haryana at the minimum support price from farmers in the mandi, while HAFED has 19.43 lakh tons, 8.95 lakh tons in Haryana Warehousing Corporation and Food Corporation of India (FCI) Has purchased about 4600 tons of paddy.
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 - Many rice-growing states received rainfall earlier this month, which delayed harvesting and damaged paddy crops ready for harvesting. Last week, cyclone Bulbul ripped through coastal areas of Bangladesh and eastern India, damaging 23,000 hectares (56,834.24 acres) of paddy fields, as per a preliminary assessment by Dhaka's agriculture ministry.

International Market Highlight:

- For rice marketing year (MY) 2019/20 (May-April), Bangladesh's rice production area and output have been marginally increased to 11.8 million hectares (HA) and 35.8 million metric tons (MMT), respectively. The increase is due to a reportedly strong year for Aus rice (April-August) production and a forecasted good season for Aman rice (July-December). Harvested Aus rice area is revised up to 1.1 million HA and production up to 2.45 MMT, based on official data from the Government of Bangladesh (GOB). Harvest of Aman rice is just started in November. The planted Aman rice area is revised at 5.8 million HA and production forecast is raised to 14 MMT as official sources and other contacts believe that continued favorable weather will result in an above average Aman rice harvest.
- The MY 2019-20 Bangladesh rice import forecast is lowered to 50,000 MT, which is 50 percent lower than MY 2018-19 imports. The forecasted decrease in imports is the result of the increased import tariff to on rice, from 28 percent to 55 percent.
- During the period from July-September 2019, about 839,356 metric tons of rice worth \$470.584 million was exported as compared the exports of 551.5,86 metric tons valuing \$312.147 million of same period of last year. According the data released by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, the exports of basmati rice increased by 47.29%, about 212,873 metric tons of



basmati rice valuing \$194.669 million exported as compared the 127,669 metric tons worth \$132.166 million of same period of last year.

• Rice rates for Vietnam's benchmark 5% broken rice were unchanged from last week's \$350 a tonne, a two-month high. Demand is weak, but low supplies have helped keep prices from falling. However, there were concerns that a move by the Philippines — Vietnam's largest rice export market accounting for 36% of total shipments — to reduce imports could further hit the Vietnamese market. Sluggish demand pushed export prices for Vietnamese rice to their lowest in nearly 12 years, at \$325 per tonne, in September.
