

Domestic Market Highlights:

- Haryana government will give Rs.2000 to farmers who will not cultivate paddy in coming kharif season of MY-2020-21. Government encourage farmers to other crops in which water requirement will be low.
- APEDA yesterday tweeted that it has been approved to export 4,15,698 tonnes of rice under RCAC during corona virus.
- Kharif area sown to rice in India increased by 37.70 percent to 34.73 lakh hectare so far in the kharif (summer) season of the 2020-21 crop years. Farmers had planted rice in 25.22 lakh hectare area in the year-ago period in the same season. With regard to rice planting, the ministry has advised states to promote Direct Seeded Rice (DSR) which require less labour and tend to mature faster than transplanted crops. It has also asked them to promote cultivation of hybrid rice. Currently, 8 percent farmers use this method especially in states like Jharkhand, Odisha, Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh. The government is targeting 102.6 million tonne of rice production in the kharif season of the 2020-21 crop year (July-June).
- All-India progressive procurement of Rice as on 27th April 2020 stood at 420.60 lakh tonnes as compared to 380 lakh tonnes in the corresponding period last year. The procurement target set for 2019-20 (October-September) is 416.00 lakh tonnes which is exceed now.
- As per market sources, about 400,000 tonnes of non-basmati rice and 100,000 tonnes of basmati rice, meant for March-April delivery, are either stuck at ports or in the pipeline due to the lockdown.
- Rice export operations has resumed despite India extending the lockdown until at least till 03rd May 2020. The demand for Indian rice is huge as it has been offered at steep discount to rice from other countries but it would take time for exports to return to normal levels. New contracts are getting signed but at a very low pace due to bottlenecks in the supply chain. Traders are mainly signing contracts for May and June shipments, expecting New Delhi to ease restrictions after 03rd May 2020.
- Farmers in Telangana are facing the problem of excess Paddy production in the state is expected to reach one million (100 lakh) tonnes due to the availability of sufficient water for irrigation and increase in sowing area. But due to lock-down restrictions and the closure of mandis since the last week of March, farmers are facing difficulty in selling their paddy.
- The Congress asked the Telangana government to make a complete purchase of paddy and maize. Congress told the Telangana government yesterday that the government had talked about opening 7500 procurement centers for procurement but so far only 4380 centers were opened. Paddy procurement should be further accelerated.
- The Punjab Agriculture Ministry has targeted to reduce the area of non-basmati paddy from 23 lakh hectare in the next season to 19 lakh hectare.
- Paddy production in Telangana crosses 1 million tonnes expected to double in next season: An important agricultural producing state of South India- Telangana has witnessed a total production of 1.05 million tonnes of paddy during the current marketing season of 2019-20 due to favourable weather and rain conditions and better irrigation facilities. The production of 2019-20 seasons is much more than last year production of 66 lakh tonnes.
- A nationwide lockdown in leading rice exporter India to curtail the spread of the coronavirus pushed export prices to the lowest in about three months, while rates for the Thai variety came off multi-year peaks due to fluctuations in the local currency. India's 5% broken parboiled variety rates narrowed to \$361-\$365 per tonne this week their lowest since late December as rice exporters were struggling to operate due to the lockdown. Prices slipped from last week's \$363-\$367 range. The lockdown has disrupted the entire supply chain. The Indian rupee hit a record low this week, raising exporters' margin from the overseas sale.



• West Bengal to Provide Rice free of cost due to Corona Virus: As per announcement by West Bengal Government they provide rice from ration shops to 7.5 crore people free of cost till September, The rice is being given to those people who now get it for Rs 2 a kg. In view of the coronavirus outbreak, for the next six months, the state government will give rice free of cost to those who used to get it for Rs 2 a kilo. Altogether 7.5 crore will be benefitted. Also Mamta Banerjee announced that from this week starts from Monday, state government employees would be allowed to work from home by rotation till March 31,2020.

International Market Highlight:

- Pakistan, in the current marketing year, has so far exported 1.2 MMT of rice compared to 1.3 MMT during the same period a year ago. Vietnam, Thailand, and India are the main export competitors for Pakistani rice. MY 2019/20 and 2020/2021 rice exports are projected at a steady 4.4 MMT.
- In Bangladesh, where the lockdown has been extended until May 5, harvesting of the summer rice crop varieties could be affected due to a shortage of labourers. If this persists, Bangladesh could miss its target of 20 million tonnes for the "Boro" summer variety rice crop this season. Boro contributes more than half of Bangladesh's typical annual rice output of around 35 million tonnes.
- Meanwhile in Vietnam, rates were nominal since exporters were not ready to sign new contracts, given uncertainty over whether they can ship the rice due to the government's export quota. However, prices for 5% broken rice were quoted at \$440-\$450 per tonne their highest in nearly two-years. Buyers are not willing to sign contracts as they are not sure if they can buy. The Vietnamese government said on Wednesday it would raise its white rice exports quota for April to 500,000 tonnes from 400,000 tonnes. Traders said the 500,000 tonnes of rice to be exported this month were not enough to cover contracts signed before the government introduced a ban on rice exports in March.
- Thailand's benchmark 5-percent broken rice prices were quoted at \$530-\$556, wider from last week's \$530-\$538. According to trade sources, rice prices have not fluctuated much as demand has been steady with no major deals in sight. Many Thai exporters are waiting to see how the return of rice exports from competitors like Vietnam will impact prices and demand, after the disruption from the COVID-19 pandemic. Disruptions to sale by major exporters like Vietnam and India earlier this month raised the price of Thai rice to their highest level since April 2013. Concerns over possible shortages of rice supply due to the on-going drought continue to impact prices as well.


