

### Domestic Market Highlights:

- **Minimum Support Price of Paddy Hike by 2.92% from Last Year to Rs. 1868/Quintal for Common Grade:** As per by Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar, the Union Cabinet on June 1 approved minimum support price for 14 kharif crops. The revised prices will provide farmers nearly 50-83 percent more than the cost. The MSP for paddy has been raised by Rs 53 per to Rs 1,868 per quintal for the 2020-21 crop year. For Grade A, price increases by Rs.53 from last year price of Rs.1835 /quintal to Rs.1888/ quintal in this year.
- **Haryana Govt softens, no restriction now on growing paddy:** Softening its stand on restrictions on paddy cultivation, the government issued fresh guidelines. The farmers in the eight blocks identified who opt for diversification would get Rs 7,000 per acre in two instalments. Their alternative crops would be insured by the government. The government had said farmers in blocks where the level of groundwater was deeper than 40 metres would have to diversify on at least 50 per cent of the area under paddy cultivation. The order had stated that farmers operating their tubewells with 50-hp electric motor would not be allowed to grow paddy. The blocks are Ratia, Siwan, Guhla, Pipli, Shahabad, Babain, Ismailabad and Sirsa. The area under paddy cultivation in these blocks was 1,79,951 hectares last season.
- **Abundant rains from Amphan in Bangladesh and north-eastern India last week lead to flooding and likely stop** any fieldwork. Continued ample rains there this week will lead to additional flooding issues and slow fieldwork considerably. Additionally, rains in south-western India will slow fieldwork there but should progress well elsewhere.
- **South Indian ports traded less in April:** Due to the on-going lock-down and corona global pandemic, the cargo movement from south India to ports during the month of April was reduced and there was a considerable decline in the movement of goods. Earlier in March also, the situation of import-export there was not encouraging. During the period under review, import and export of goods from Tuticorin port declined by about 26 percent to 22.90 lakh tonnes from 30.80 lakh tonnes, slipped 38 percent to 39.50 lakh tonnes at Chennai port to 24.40 lakh tonnes, slipping 1 percent from 32.60 lakh tonnes at Mangalore port to 32.20 lakh. Tonne and Kochi port dropped 34 percent to 18.70 lakh tonne from 28.30 lakh tonne.
- **Government rice sales over 2.58 lakh tonnes till second weekly tender of May:** The Union Food Ministry has set a target of selling a total of 5 million tonnes of rice under the Open Market Sales Schemes (OMSS) during the financial year 2020-21 (April-March), with a minimum reserve price of Rs 2250 per quintal. The Food Corporation of India (FCI) is planning an e-auction on a weekly basis for the sale of rice.
- **Indian buyers have resumed purchases of Malaysian palm oil after a four-month gap following a diplomatic row,** with buying spurred by a fall in domestic inventories and discounted prices
- **The Central Agricultural Department estimated the crop production to be 2960 lakh tonnes in the third advance production,** which is 2.7% more than the production of the previous year.
- **According to the third advance production estimate, the Central Agriculture Department gave the figures of paddy production to be 117.94 million tons,** which is about 5 lakh tons more than the second estimate, in the second production estimate, the figures of 117.47 million tons of paddy production were given, i.e. the production increased by 4.7 lakh tons from the previous estimate.
- **The government can declare a reserve price of Rs 2250 rice under the OMSS scheme for the 2021 season.** The government is planning to sell 5 million tonnes of rice this season under the OMSS scheme, which is equivalent to the previous year's sales.

- **Haryana chief minister, Manohar Lal has appealed to the farmers to adopt crop diversification and sow crops which consume less water like Maize, Arhar, sesame, Guar, Moong, etc,** instead of Rice. Giving detailed information about this, the Chief Minister said that the dark zone, depleting level of groundwater and its excessive exploitation has become a challenge for us and we have started to solve these challenges for the coming generations. The Chief Minister said that he had already made this appeal while talking to the leaders of various farmers associations of the State to encourage the farmers to adopt crop diversification and sow crops consuming less water.

### International Market Highlight:

- Harvesting of the 2020 first season paddy crop, which accounts for half of the annual production, is virtually complete and yields of the harvested crops are similar to the record high yields obtained in 2019. The improvement of extension services of the Guyana Rice Development Board (GRDB) and the expanding of public agricultural investments supported crop yields.
- Rice export prices increased 4 percent as Thai rice exporters are sourcing new-crop rice to fulfill large volume contracted shipments of white and parboiled rice to Asian and African buyers. Also, foreign buyers began to seek Thai rice as prices of Thai and Vietnamese white rice are currently about the same, compared to a typical price difference of around U.S. \$15-20/MT, after the Vietnamese government removed its rice export restrictions earlier this month.
- Since May this year, Vietnam's rice export activities have returned to normal, with the month recording the highest rice export price seen in recent years and paving the way for the country to outpace Thailand in global rice exports in 2020.
- Vietnam's rice export volume and value in the last month soared by 47% and 55.3% month-on-month, respectively. Rice export prices in May shot up to the highest level over the past few years, with the average price recorded at US\$527 per ton, up 21.4% year-on-year. Between January and May, the average price of Vietnamese rice rose by 13% year-on-year at US\$485 per ton.
- Data from the General Statistics Office indicated that over the first five months of 2020, Vietnam's revenue from rice exports amounted to US\$1.4 billion, increasing by 17.2% year-on-year. Meanwhile, Thailand exported 2.11 million tons of rice worth US\$1.38 billion from January to April, dipping by 32.1% in volume and 15.7% in value year-on-year, according to Thailand's Ministry of Commerce. As such, the Vietnamese Ministry of Industry and Trade forecast that the country is likely to surpass Thailand in terms of rice exports this year. From March 24 to April, Vietnam halted rice exports to ensure food security amid the spreading Covid-19 infection, affecting local rice exporters and export activities.
