

Domestic & International Market Highlights:

- The Centre announced that it would purchase 44.4 MMT of wheat and 4.29 million MMT of rabigrown rice under the MSP programme in 2022-23. This however excludes Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, and Telangana estimates.
- In Vietnam, January-February rice exports are estimated to have risen by 38.6 percent from a year earlier to 906,000 tonnes. Revenue from rice exports in the period is seen rose by 22.3 percent at \$437 million. February rice exports from Vietnam likely totalled 400,000 tonnes, worth \$191 million.
- The Centre has procured 707.24 lakh tonne of paddy in the ongoing 2021-22 marketing year so far at the minimum support price (MSP). Till now, about 96.41 lakh farmers have been benefited with an MSP value of Rs 1,38,619.58 crore.
- Currently, 5% broken parboiled rice of IR-64 variety is trading with \$350 per tonne from Kolkata Port and \$368 per tonne from Nhava sheva. While 5% broken rice of Swarna variety is trading at \$334 per tonne from Vizag port.
- The CIF for 5% broken rice includes \$475 per tonne for Togo, \$498 per tonne for Gambia, \$462 per tonne for Djibouti and \$480 per tonne for Benin.
- Due to the ongoing Ukraine Russia issue, the Indian rice was impacted. As the rupee gets depreciated, the prices fell towards competitive side but it gets affected due to container and vessel issue which is moving with more uncertainty. Due to the increase in the oil prices, the freight movement gets largely disrupted which will have long term impact on exports.
- The global freight index increased by 0.45 percent compared to previous week to \$9789/FUE. The
 rate was stable and there were backlogs which is keeping the prices up. The demand is high and
 congestion problem still persists so it's unlikely that the prices would come down anytime soon.
 Freight charges are expected to increase due to increase in oil prices and uncertainty over
 insurance cover.
- Thailand's 5% broken rice prices were quoted at \$400 per tonne this week, down from \$410-\$420 a week ago. The baht weakened to 32.68 against the U.S. dollar on 24th February and by nearly 1.6% from a week ago and 1.3% from 23rd February, following Russia's invasion of Ukraine.
- Vietnam's 5% broken were offered at \$395-\$400 per tonne compared with \$400 per tonne a week ago. Importers are buying moderately, waiting for prices to fall when the winter-spring harvest peaks. Exports will increase from next month, with the key markets being the Philippines and Africa. Preliminary shipping data showed 219,000 tonnes of rice was loaded at Ho Chi Minh City port in February, with most of the rice heading to the Philippines.




