

4Domestic & International Market Highlights:

- Currently 5% broken rice is trading with FOB \$355 per tonne from Mundra Port and 25% broken rice is trading with FOB \$335 per tonne from Mundra Port. And 100% broken rice is trading with FOB \$315 per tonne from Vizag Port and \$305 per tonne from JNPT port.
- The CIF for 100% broken rice includes \$400 per tonne to Djibouti and \$340 per tonne to Vietnam. For 5% broken rice include \$ 425 per tonne to Singapore.
- There is a huge demand for broken rice from the South east Asian markets.
- Currently trade enquiries are low though there is a huge demand going in international markets. The market remains flat to slightly firm in near term.
- Retail inflation for farm workers and rural laborer rose to 5.59 per cent and 5.94 per cent respectively in February, mainly due to higher prices of certain food items. Among states, the maximum increase in the consumer price index number for agricultural laborer was experienced by Rajasthan and for rural laborer by West Bengal. This was mainly due to rise in the prices of rice, wheat-atta, bajra, maize, fish, chilies green/dry, pan leaf, firewood, vegetables and fruits.
- A surge in wheat and corn prices is boosting demand for low-grade rice in animal rations across Asia, pushing up prices of rice at a time when global food inflation is already hovering near record highs.
- In Pakistan, 5% broken rice is being traded at FOB \$348 per tonne, for 25% broken rice, it is being traded at FOB \$340 per tonne and 100% broken rice is being traded at FOB \$330 per tonne. The market remains steady for near term and there was good demand from Asian markets.
- As per trade sources, during the month of February, around 16.82 lakh MT of rice was exported from India at an average FOB of \$838.34 per tonne. China emerged as the largest buyer of rice from India with 2.48 lakh MT of imports followed by Iran with 1.50 lakh MT and Benin with 1.20 lakh MT. The exports are higher compared to January month with 16.63 lakh MT. There was huge demand from South East Asia, Middle East and African countries.
- As of 13th March 2022, 731.53 lakh metric tonne (LMT) of paddy have been procured in KMS 2021-22 in the procuring states. Till now, approximately, 103.40 lakh farmers have been benefitted from the procurement with the MSP value of Rs. 1,43,382.03 crore.
- The 5% broken rice of IR 64 variety is being traded at FOB \$350 per tonne from Kolkata Port and \$368 per tonne from Nhava Sheva port. For 5% broken rice of Swarna variety, the price is \$334 per tonne from Vizag Port.

- The CIF price for 5% broken rice include \$498 per tonne for Togo, \$515 per tonne for Gambia, \$455 per tonne for Djibouti and \$505 per tonne for Benin.
- The non-basmati rice prices remain bullish as the increase in freight charges to African destination has supported the market. Also, many traders find it difficult to get the containers which haven't eased till now and is taking longer period of time to complete the contracts. There is a huge demand coming from African markets.
- As the stocks available is low, by the end of April it is expected that 90% of rice millers will stop the regular operations and will operate only according to the export demand. As rupee turned weaker, exporters maintained a competitive side on FOB offers but affected by the uncertain movements of vessels and containers.
- The basmati market is expected to remain steady in the coming week, the prices are already high which is making the market bit uncompetitive. Though lower availability and production will support the market.
- As per trade sources, 32,500 MT of rice vessel ABDUL M is loading at Kakinada Port since 10th March 2022. And 40,500 MT of rice vessel ASIAN PEARL is loading at Kakinada Port since 13th March 2022. And 40,000 MT of rice vessel ECO PACIFIC is loading at Kakinada Port since 14th March 2022. And 48,000 MT of rice vessel ISKANDER is loading at Kandla Port since 10th March 2022.
