

Domestic Market Highlights:

- Firm to steady sentiment was noticed in major spot markets during the day, on the account of improved exporter's demand after, reduction on import duty by Bangladesh.
- As per the sources All India Rice Exporters' Association has stated that around 9,14,000 tonne of Rice has been exported till now under ongoing 2021-22 season from India to Bangladesh against the exports of 4,91,000 tonne during last 2020-2021 for the corresponding time period. This demand was mainly after Bangladesh reduced import duty on Rice due to floods hitting the country.
- As per the official sources in telangana area cover under Paddy till as on date 29th june 2022 stands at 0.18 Lakh hectare as compared to 0.29 Lakh hectare during corresponding time last year.
- As of now the pace of Rice sowing this Kharif is running behind the normal due to uneven distribution of rains over the key growing regions of the country. Given situation and prevailing higher prices is creating concern among the traders that this may force government to put restriction on Rice exports as done for wheat.
- According to the sources during last five days Non-Basmati Indian Rice prices in global markets spiked from \$ 350 per tonne to \$ 360 per tonne after Bangladesh reduced the import duty on Rice. Not only had this domestic Rice prices also taken a firm route during paste five days, seeing rise by around 10 percent.
- As per the sources around 93.5 lakh tonnes of Paddy's costume milling has stopped in Telangana after FCI's denial of lifting up milled stocks.
- According to official sources in India 19.59 lakh hec. of area rice has been sown till 25th June 2022 against 36.03 lakh hec. of area for same time period during last year.
- Sources suggest that demand of Indian White Broken Rice is maintaining an upper hand over its
 competitor exporting countries due to feasible export prices when compared with others.
 Although export price of 5% Broken Parboiled Rice variety fell to \$355 -\$360 per tonne from \$357-\$365 per tonne last week, as Rupee value against dollar trumbled during past week.
- Due to early paddy sowing in Tamil Nadu, farmers are expecting early crop this season, which
 would be ready for harvest by last week of August. Looking at the early planting, reportedly state
 government has requested the Centre to procure paddy a month early in the state by 1st week of
 Sept 2022.
- According to sources there are reports that Rice millers in Telanagana have around 90 lkh MT of Paddy stocks piled up in the various yards and warehouses. Millers have issued the statement saying that there are possibilities of complete halting of the milling Paddy into Rice if, FCI does not reseumes its Rice procurement in from the states.
- There are chances of increasing export demand of Indian Rice on the account of consumers opting
 Rice as staple food over Wheat due to persisting high prices of Wheat around the world. Under
 current scenario in upcoming season export of Indian Rice is expected jump by 1.0 million and
 there are chances of India to emerge as leading Rice exporter, accounting for around forty percent
 of total world Rice supply.



As per the sources Paddy growing in the state of Kerala lags behind and crop cycle of Paddy
happens to be getting disturbed during upcoming Kharif season, on the account of Southwest
monsoon showers. This might give rise to the condition leading to reduced Rice yield in the region.

Domestic Market Outlook (Non-Basmati):

• Foreseeing on going domestic and international demand, with little arrivals it is expected that domestic prices would remain range bound in near term as per existing scenario.

International Market Highlights:

- Sources say that around 14,700 MT of Rice as the part of humanitarian aid has been received at Colombo from the side of India.
- As per the sources government of Vietnam (department of Crop Production at the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development) stated that just in case India bans Rice exports, Vietnam would be ready for the export of around 7 million tons of Rice.
- As per the sources in order to control the ongoing instability in domestic Rice market, Bangladesh government has reduced import duty rates for the import of Rice from 62.5 percent to 25 percent. This norm as of now is supposed to continue till 31st October 2022.
- As per the sources Thailand's 5% broken rice prices saw a decline for the consecutive week and fell to \$420-\$425 per tonne from \$430-\$440 last week, following lower demand along with dropped prices of Bhatt. Also surge in the oil prices has led to increased transportation cost making delivery prices not-so-feasible for the buyers.
- Sources state that Vietnam's 5% broken rice prices were down to \$418-\$423 per tonne from 420-\$425 in past week due to supply exceeding demand persisting in the market.
- Reportedly, export prices of Cambodian Rice have escalated over past few days due to persisting
 international food insecurity due to prolonged Russia-Ukraine conflict. Having analyzed current
 scenario we can expect a further rise in the prices of export at source locations like Cambodia,
 Thailand and Vietnam, Wheat export ban by various source countries is also acting as the catalyst
 for souring Rice export prices at various locations.

Indian Weather/ Monsoon Highlights:

• As per the latest update of Indian Meteorological Department (IMD), the SW Monsoon (SWM) so far has covered the entire southern part of the country along with eastern, NE state and most of the parts of Madhya Pradesh and southern Gujarat region. The pre-monsoon showers have covered almost the entire Rajasthan except some parts of central and southern Rajasthan. As on June 26th, the cumulative rainfall % departure country as a whole, again came down to -7% which reached at break even on June 22nd (at par with normal).
