

Domestic Market Highlights:

- Mixed sentiments were witnessed in most of the markets for the days upon the arrival of rice although in most of the markets, prices remained steady.
- As per sources, the government purchases parmal varieties on the MSP, and their arrival this
 year in the district's numerous grain markets has outpaced that of the same duration last year.
 The Haryana State Agricultural Marketing Board (HSAMB) has requested that the district
 government impose a prohibition on the distribution of gate passes to farmers visiting the grain
 markets because they suspect the acquisition of paddy from other states.
- Export price of 5% Broken Parboiled Indian Rice eased marginally at \$370-\$75 per Tonne as that of \$375-\$384 last week due to lull demand amid a dive in rupee. African demand has been declining amid fresh arrivals.
- As on October 31st, 2022, the Center has so far purchased 170.54 lakh tonne (LMT) of paddy in the current 2022–23 marketing year at the Minimum Support Price against the Kharif season's target of 550 LMT. The MSP value has so far benefited around 100.37 lakh farmers.
- Market prices remained bearish throughout this week due to fresh arrivals and lull export demand. In Ludhiana mandi, arrivals of 20,000 bags of all varieties have been reported so far while in aromatic section, like traditional basmati, 1509, 1121 varieties of paddy are likely to arrive after 10 days. Currently, Pr 13/14 and common grades of non-basmati are being purchased by procurement agencies including FCI. Private players and millers are not active for the bulk volume as they have already purchased to fulfil their immediate requirements.
- Meanwhile, at benchmark Narella market, the weekly average price of Sughandha rice eased marginally by 1.3% at Rs. 6,416.66 per quintal, whereas, the prices of 1121 steam wand corrected by 5.8% at Rs. 8241.66 per quintal.
- On 31st October,2022, GOI released a notification to let Nepal import 6 lakh tonnes of unmilled rice duty-free, which is thought to help the Himalayan country meet its food security needs as Nepal depends on India to meet its food grain's demand. The quantity allowed will be effective as of the notification date, which is October 31, 2022.
- The IIRR released the improved Sambha Mahsuri (ISM) and blast resistant varieties like DRR
 Dhan 51 and DRR Dhan 62 in consideration of this issue. Farmers in Telangana and Andhra
 Pradesh who are producing DRR Dhan 53 varieties are already seeing good yields in regions
 afflicted by the bacterial blight.



- The Chhattisgarh government will start making purchases at the minimum support price (MSP) on November 1 in order to meet its goal of buying 11 million tonnes of paddy during the current kharif marketing season.
- Despite yield losses from unseasonal rains and dwarfing disease, the Haryana government is likely to meet its goal of purchasing 55 lakh MT of paddy at the minimum support price (MSP) amid rumours that the arrival of rice from the neighbouring state of Uttar Pradesh could aid the procurement agencies in reaching the target.
- As per sources, the first advance estimates of production of major agricultural crops released by the Union Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare on 21st September,2022, the production of kharif rice in India is expected to reach a record 104.99 million tonnes during the 2022–23 season, down by 6% over what was harvested during the previous harvest season.

Domestic Market Outlook (Non-Basmati):

• As per prevailing market fundamentals, such as high arrivals and depressed export demand, it is expected that domestic prices would remain bearish in near term as per existing scenario.

International Market Highlights

- As per sources, Bangladeshi market prices for rice this year hit a record high. While the price of rice fluctuated in the past, individuals had flour as a substitute (ata). Low-income individuals are in crisis this year as a result of the rising cost of flour, which has increased to Tk 65 per kg. Rising production costs are a domestic element that contribute to higher rice prices.
- Vietnamese 5% broken rice's price per tonne remained unchanged at \$425-\$430. There is a rise in domestic prices due to low supply.
- Thailand's 5% broken rice prices widened at \$405-\$410 due to quiet demand domestically and overseas as well.
- As per sources, Vietnam exports 6.07 MMT of rice valued at 2.94 billion USD, an increase of 7.4% in value and 17.2% in volume during Jan-Oct, 2022. During the time period, export prices decreased by 8.3% from the same time last year, averaging 484 USD per tonne.
- According to sources, Vietnam's rice market is currently at its high, which helped the nation generate \$3 billion in export revenue during January-October 2022, and it is expected to increase further.



- As per sources, it is likely that Bangladesh, which has been working to lower high domestic prices after floods earlier this year damaged 254,000 tonnes of rice, will suffer as a result of Cyclone Sitrang's destruction of rice fields on 6,000 hectares.
- According to sources, Thailand's main rice harvest for 2022–23 would most likely be harvested
 two weeks later than usual due to floods as a result limiting output for the season, which
 typically starts in early November.
- As per sources, to ensure a sufficient supply at times of global food shortages and emergencies, the Philippines will increase its budget for rice buffer reserves by almost 70% the next year.
- Major crops like cotton and wheat have been harmed by the weather, but most of the rice crop has been spared, and Pakistan is on track to meet its 4.8 million tonnes export goal this season.
- As per sources, this year's floods in Pakistan affected the non-basmati growing region, but the
 basmati belt remains unaffected and has suffered no damage. Due to Pakistan's currency's sharp
 decline, basmati rice export prices are currently very competitive against India, which has a
 negative impact on India's pricing and export demand.
- According to sources, Thailand's rice exports could hit 8 million tonnes this year after typhoon
 Noru's flooding had little effect and the weak baht boosted global sales.
- As per sources, in Bangladesh, prevailing prices of traditionally marketed rice have recorded
 a hike of maximum 17% as that of last year. A shortage of supply in local crops since the Boro
 season, a fall in Aus output, and decreased imports are key reasons attributing to a hike in
 prices.
