

Domestic Market Highlights:

- Various markets for the day are showing mixed sentiments for the day. Fresh arrivals and active buying by government and private players kept the market steady.
- A little uptick in demand helped India's 5% broken parboiled variety push up to \$374-\$380 per tonne from \$373-\$378 last week, but rising supply from the new season crop limited the gain. The second half of December is typically quiet, but this year fewer sellers received export orders since rice from India is less expensive than rice from other countries.
- According to sources, due to an increase in the purchase of food grains during the previous eight years, the minimum support price (MSP) for rice has increased by 42.64 % during the eight years of the Narendra Modi government. Total procurement was 1,926 million tonnes from 2006 to 2014, and from 2014 to 2022, it rose to 2,273 million tonnes.
- As per latest data of Ministry of Agriculture released on 16th December 2022, paddy has been sown in 12.64 lakh Ha. of area compared to 11.13 lakh Ha of previous year, marginally up by 14% in this rabi season.
- As of December 15, 2022, during the current 2022-23 kharif marketing season FCI have procured 417.05 Lakh tonnes (LMT) of paddy for the central pool. Government is aggressively procuring paddy which might help in replenishing the stocks.
- According to reports, in a significant move, the government decided on Friday to grant 81.35 crore impoverished people free rations for a whole year under the National Food Security Act (NFSA). Under the NFSA, rice is distributed to the needy for Rs 3 per kg. The Centre will be entirely responsible for distributing free food grains under the NFSA, according to Food Minister Piyush Goyal, who gave a press briefing on the Union Cabinet's decision. It is estimated that the exchequer will incur annual expenses of Rs 2 lakh crore. In the meantime, the government opted not to prolong the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY), a free ration programme that expires on December 31.

Domestic Market Outlook (Non-Basmati):

- As per prevailing market fundamentals, arrivals of non-basmati have almost come to an end so, it is expected that domestic prices would improve in near term.

International Market Highlights

- Vietnam's 5% broken rice price was \$448–\$453 per tonne, remaining constant from a week earlier when rates hit their highest point since July of last year. The demand remains at top from the Philippines.
- Thailand's 5% broken rice prices were reported at \$452 to 460 per tonne, up from a range of \$425 to \$457 the previous week. Asia is now the region with the most demand, whereas Africa has the highest demand for Indian rice. Because exporters were buying to stock up, there was news that the supply would soon become limited.
- As per news reports, in contrast to the pricing offered by the private trade in a global import tender, Bangladesh has offered Indian cooperatives almost \$40 per tonne extra to import 2.5 lakh tonnes of parboiled rice in a government-to-government transaction. According to trade sources, the import agreement would be made through NCCF (National Cooperative Consumers Federation) and Kendriya Bhandar in two instalments, with Dhaka receiving rice at a price of \$443 and \$443.5 per tonne, respectively. Bangladesh will receive parboiled rice for at least \$25 less than Thailand or Pakistan, despite paying Indian cooperatives more for the G2G transaction. Currently, Pakistan is offering parboiled rice for \$453-457 per tonne, while Thailand is bidding \$486 per tonne.
- As per sources, Indonesian government allowed BULOG to import rice as domestic rice production struggles to meet demand, thus the nation must import rice to maintain sufficient supplies for domestic consumption. By the end of the year, BULOG hopes to have acquired 1.2 million tonnes of rice.
- As per sources, in order to obtain at least 0.5 million tonnes (mt) of parboiled rice on a government-to-government (G2G) basis for distribution through ration shops, Bangladesh has approached India.
- According to sources, this year, Thailand is expected to surpass Vietnam as the second-largest rice exporter in the world. Thailand exported 790,000 tonnes of rice for 13.97 billion baht (402.9 million USD) in October. Its anticipated exports have reached 800,000 tonnes in November, increasing to a higher level in December as a result of demand around Christmas and New Year's.

- As per sources, Sri Lanka has banned rice imports and would require licenses beginning in December 9th 2022. In the current main growing season, Sri Lanka is anticipating a good harvest, hence farmers needed to be "protected." Raw, milled, and parboiled rice will need permits starting from December 9th, according to the import control notice, but products shipped before that date will be permitted entry into the country through December 23.
- After fields were destroyed by floods earlier this year, a deadline to import rice at a discounted tariff was extended by three months to end-March. Despite these measures, domestic rice prices in Bangladesh remained high.
- As per sources, this year, Vietnam is expected to export more than seven million tonnes of rice, bringing in an estimated US\$3.5 billion. During the first ten months of the year, Vietnam exported more than six million tonnes of rice worth US\$2.9 million, an increase of 8% in value and 17% in volume over the same period last year.
- As per sources, over 860,410 tonnes of rice were exported by Myanmar in the first eight months of the fiscal year 2022–23.
- As per sources, in November, the Philippines imported 3.37 million metric tonnes (MT) of rice, which is a 34.14 percent increase over the 2.51 million MT imported during the same period last year.
- Due to the Middle East's major buyers increasing their inventories despite prices rising by almost a quarter, India's exports of premium basmati rice are expected to increase by 15% compared to last year.
- As per sources, the revival of the European market and the introduction of new markets, such as Bangladesh, have led to the Cambodian Rice Federation's expectation that rice exports will increase in 2023. From January through October of this year, Cambodia exported 509,249 ton of milled rice, an increase of 10.6%.
- As per sources, to ensure a sufficient supply at times of global food shortages and emergencies, the Philippines will increase its budget for rice buffer reserves by almost 70% the next year.
