

# **Rice Monthly Research Report**

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# **Outlook and Review (Domestic Front)**

- Price: Average monthly wholesale rice prices in India stood at around Rs.3414 per quintal in June-2019, down by 3.22% from Rs.3527 per quintal in May-2019 and down by 2.82% from Rs.3512 per quintal a year ago. Agriwatch expects non-basmati rice market to move range bound with firm tone due to decreasing of arrival from major producing regions and demand of Indian rice from overseas buyers.
- **Export Price:** Rice export prices in India edged higher this week, helped by an uptick in demand, while a strong Thai baht propped up prices in the world's second largest rice exporter amid subdued consumption. In India, the top exporter of the staple grain, 5 percent broken parboiled variety was quoted around \$369-\$372 per tonne this week, up from last week's \$367-\$370. Traders are seeing interest building up from West African markets. Farmers have planted summer-sown rice on 630,000 hectares as of June 21, down 32% compared with the same period a year ago, according to provisional data from the Ministry of Agriculture, as the monsoon delivered less-than-average rainfall.
- Minimum Support Price of Kharif Crops can be announced on 3rd July: The Government has announced to increase the MSP of normal grade paddy by 65 rupees to 1815 and 'A' grade Paddy MSP of 1835 rupees per quintal. MSP increased in paddy, not according to expectation of farmers. The government does not want to encourage paddy sowing to see the water crisis. Increasing the MSP will not affect the prices of paddy in next harvesting season, however lower production estimates could hamper the rice price.
- Monsoon Updates: India's monsoon rains were 24% below average in the week ended June 26, the weather office said on Thursday, as the seasonal rainfall was scanty over central and western parts of the country. The rains are crucial for farm output and economic growth as about 55% of the south Asian nation's arable land is rain-fed, and the farm sector makes up about 15% of a nearly \$2.5-trillion economy that is Asia's third-biggest. The below-average rainfall has delayed sowing of summer-sown crop such rice, soybean and corn and threatens to curtail crop yields. Monsoon has delivered 36% lower-than-normal rainfall since the start of the season on June 1, due to a delay in the onset of monsoon rains, according to data compiled by India Meteorological Department.
- **Punjab Govt. 'Pesticide-free' Campaign for Basmati Rice:** To save Basmati export to Europe, USA and Arab countries, Punjab, which is highest user of fertilisers and insecticides per hectare in the country, much above the national average, has launched a 'pesticide-free' Basmati campaign in the state. Basmati exporters and Basmati growers in the state are now working together to use fewer pesticides in order meets the new guidelines of the European Union (EU) and other countries regarding the Basmati import from India. This effort is to achieve total compliance with EU Maximum Residue Level (MRLs). The Department of Agriculture, through its network of field officers, would recruit fresh agriculture graduates to fan out to all the Basmati clusters in the state and directly remain in touch with the farmers.
- Future Trade for Aromatic Rice: NCDEX started the futures trading of Mung and basmati from July 1, NCDEX has sought approval from SEBI to launch futures trading in Tur and Urad.
- Sowing Updates: Transplanting of Paddy is under progress in Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Assam, Orissa, Tamil Nadu, Chhattisgarh, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Telangana, Haryana, Punjab and West Bengal. The states where the crop was sown through DSR (Direct Seed Rice) method, crop is in seedling emergence stage. Acreage of Paddy in the current week is almost similar to corresponding week of last year as Paddy is mainly

sown in irrigated areas and hence sowing was not affected due to deficient rainfall. Farmers are interested in cultivating Paddy crop because good yield and market price were realized last year. As per the ministry of Agriculture, Kharif Rice acreage as on 28<sup>th</sup> June 2019 has declined by 0.12 per cent at 27.09 lakh hectares as compared to 27.12 lakh hectares same period last year and about 24% down from normal area as on date of 35.54 lakh hectares.

• Basmati Rice Exports Rise to USD 4.71 Billion in 2018-19: The country's basmati rice exports increased to USD 4.71 billion in 2018-19 as compared with USD 3.20 billion in 2016-17. In volume terms, the exports increased to 44,14,605 tonne in 2018-19 from 39,85,210 tonne in 2017-18.Similarly, exports of non-basmati rice also rose to USD 3 billion in the last financial year from USD 2.52 billion in 2016-17.

- Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Mizoram, Tripura, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Kerala states received the deficit rainfall.

- Sikkim, Jammu & Kashmir, Rajasthan and Goa states received Normal rainfall.

### Weather Forecast:

- Above normal rainfall activity likely to occur along west coast, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh & East Rajasthan and many parts of Gujarat states. It is likely to be normal to below normal over remaining parts of the country during 4th to 10th July.
- Heavy to very heavy rainfall at a few places with extremely heavy rainfall at isolated places likely over West Madhya Pradesh and Konkan & Goa; Heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places over Uttarakhand, East Madhya Pradesh and East Rajasthan; heavy rainfall at isolated places over Uttar Pradesh, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat region, Coastal Karnataka, SubHimalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Kerala & Mahe and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura during 3rd July to 5th July 2019

The area coverage is mainly reported from Uttrakhand (1.58 lakh hectares), Assam (2.20 lakh hectares), Nagaland (1.57 lakh hectares), Chhattisgarh (1.69 lakh hectares), Kerala (0.20 lakh hectares), Odisha (2.39 lakh hectares), Tamil Nadu (0.10 lakh hectares), Punjab (12.87 lakh hectares), etc.

### Agriwatch Rice Supply & Demand:

1. Consumption figure YoY generally increases by 0.5 MMT due to population growth but due to typo error it was increased by 2 Million tons from MY-2013-14 to 2014-15 which impact the carry over stock.

2. Agriwatch revised the rice production figure from 113 MMT to 114 MMT in current year after final harvesting and revised the yield of paddy (MY-2018-19) after having discussion with farmers and traders.

3. Finally my carry-over stock for MY-2018-19 remains 23 million tons out of which 3.2 Million tons are with private traders (2.2 MMt-Non basmati and 1 MMt Basmati rice) and remaining stocks are with FCI. This figure was calculated on the basis of telephonic surveys with exporters/traders and millers.

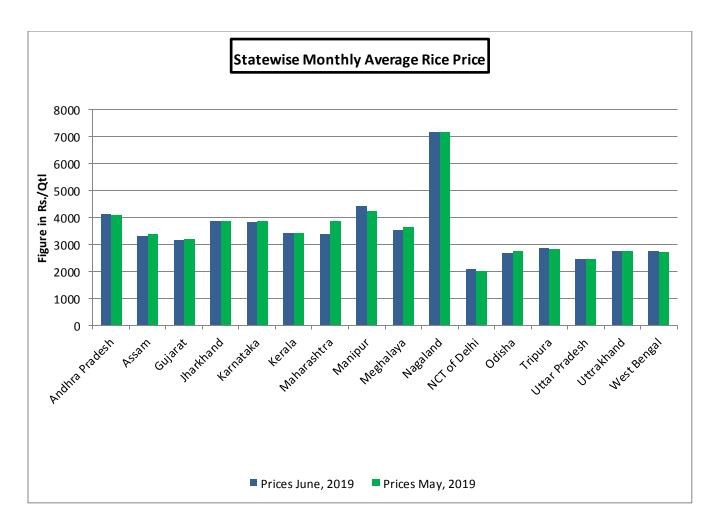

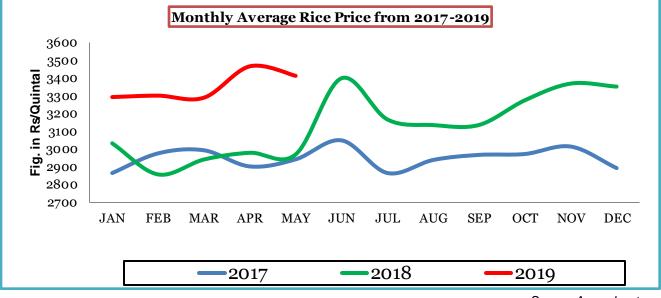

Due to higher production estimate, procurement is higher this year as compare to last year. All-India progressive procurement of Rice as on 24th June 2019 for 2018-19 seasons stood at 433.90 lakh tonnes as compared to procurement of 300 lakh tonnes in the corresponding period of last year. Of the total quantity procured, Punjab has procured 113.34 lakh tonnes rice, around 39.09 lakh tonnes in Haryana, 40.80 lakh tonnes in Chhattisgarh, 49.33 lakh tonnes in Telangana, 32.33 lakh tonnes in Uttar Pradesh ,34.76 lakh tonnes in Orissa, 39.66 lakh tonnes in Andhra Pradesh, 13.95 lakh tonnes in Madhya Pradesh, 16.57 lakh tonnes in West Bengal, 4.62 lakh tonnes in Uttrakhand, 11.62 lakh tonnes in Tamil Nadu, 4.25 lakh tonnes in Maharashtra and 9.28 lakh tonnes in Bihar.

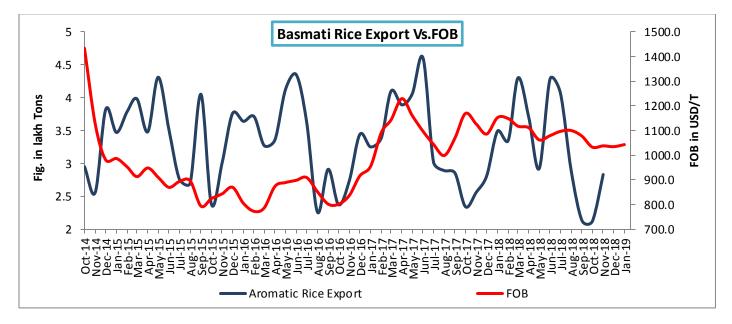

In April-2019, 3.07 lakh tons of non-basmati rice and 4.33 lakh tons of basmati rice were exported from India. Exports of basmati rice from October-2018 to April-2019 were 27.71 million tons and non-basmati 39.64 lakh tons. Despite the record domestic harvest and the government announcing an export subsidy benefit of 5percent for coarse grain non-Basmati under the Merchandise Exports from India Scheme (MEIS) on November 22, 2018, rice exports have continued to lag behind last year's level on weak export demand for non-Basmati rice.



Aromatic Rice Export vs. 1121 FOB (Monthly Trend Analysis):

Above given chart shows the quantity of basmati rice export on monthly basis and tentative FoB for the same. Aromatic rice export in the month of Dec was 2.13 lakh tons with an average FoB of USD 1034.34/T. Aromatic rice export in the month was 26% lower than last month export of 2.89lakh tons.

### **Global Market Scenario**

- Neighboring Bangladesh had been unable to strike a deal since its ban on rice exports was lifted a
  month ago. So far there is no progress in making any deal. Bangladesh lifted its longstanding ban on
  rice exports in May, aiming to sell as much as 1.5 million tonnes to support farmers following a drastic
  drop in domestic prices.
- Thailand's benchmark 5 percent broken rice prices rose to \$395-\$415 a tonne, free on board Bangkok (FOB), compared with \$390-\$407 last week. Traders attributed the price increase to a firm Thai baht, which has strengthened more than 5% against the greenback so far this year. Traders say supply of Thai rice is also gradually decreasing during the rainy season, while demand remained flat.
- In Vietnam, the third biggest rice exporter after Thailand, rates for 5 percent broken rice were unchanged from last week at \$340-\$345 a tonne. Traders have begun delivering rice to Iraq under a contract signed earlier for 150,000 tonnes for delivery this month and next. However, Vietnam's rice exporters will continue to face difficulty clinching new deals during the rest of this year on weaker demand from China, its largest rice export market, the ministry of industry and trade said in a statement this week.
- Vietnam's rice shipments to China in the first five months of this year fell 74% from a year earlier to 223,078 tonnes due to China's rising inventories and its move to impose stricter non-tariff barriers, according to the statement.
- Iran Gov't Approves Rice Cultivation Restrictions Due to Water Shortage: Iran Govt Approves Rice Cultivation Restrictions Due to Water Shortage Iran Gov't Approves Rice Cultivation Restrictions Due to Water Shortage. Restrictions will be imposed on rice cultivation in Iranian provinces other than the two northern provinces of Gilan and Mazandaran. According to deputy agriculture minister for water and soil affairs, the decision has been made by the Cabinet and conveyed to provinces across the country for implementation.
- Export prices for most grades of rice remain unchanged, except prices for fragrant rice, which declined around 1 percent from the previous week. Traders report that new supplies of off-season fragrant rice are entering the market. Most of the new fragrant rice supply is Pathumthani fragrant rice, which is mainly grown in the lower northern and the central plains regions. Fragrant rice prices have been high for the last several months due to tight supplies. Meanwhile, the Thai baht remains strong at 31.15 baht/U.S. \$1.00. Rice Export Update Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding fragrant rice) for June 3-9, 2019 totaled 120,150 metric tons, up 31,583 metric tons from the previous week and up 6,285 metric tons from the four week moving average of 113,865 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 June 9, 2019, totaled 3,031,661 metric tons, down 25 percent from the same period last year.

### **Rice Market Outlook**

Non-basmati rice price in domestic markets have traded weak in June due to sluggish demand from local as well overseas buyers. Exports of non-basmati rice decreased 13.6% compared to last year to 67.11 lakh tonnes which was 77.66 lakh tonnes from April to February last year. On the other hand exports of basmati rice increased by 6.5% to 38.55 lakh tonnes. Overall rice exports, compared to last year, exports were down by 7.2% to 105 lakh tonnes

Price of Aromatic rice was traded firm in June from last month and currently 1121 steam rice traded at Rs.8500/quintal; Agriwatch expects price to be steady to firm in coming month with lower crop estimates, aromatic rice or paddy price wouldn't go much lower as stock from last year is not sufficient to fulfill the demand and once demand from overseas country will come price gets support from current level. Basmati rice prices are increasing day by day due to the emergence of Iran, West Asia and domestic demand. Millers are having difficulty in making rice after lower availability of basmati rice.

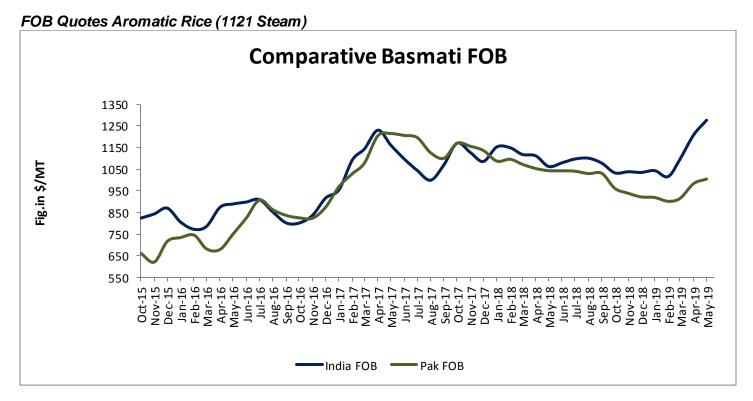
### IGC Rice Balance sheet Highlights:

The Council's forecasts for rice supply and demand in 2018/19 are little-changed from before. Trade is seen at 46m t, with reductions for key exporters contrasting with an upgrade for China's shipments, which are being underpinned by African demand for long-grain varieties. The projection of global trade in 2020 is down slightly m/m, at 47m t (+1m y/y), on lower expectations for China's purchases. Gains in key exporters, particularly in India where a record main crop was cut, underpinned 2018/19 rice production at a new peak of 499m t. Despite expanded total use, global stocks are likely to accumulate, including nominal growth in China. In 2019/20, further gains in Asia may see output rise to a fresh high, while ample availabilities and expanding populations could boost consumption. World trade in 2020 is predicted to rise as stronger demand from sub-Saharan Africa offsets smaller purchases by Asian importers, such as China.
