

# **Rice Monthly Research Report**

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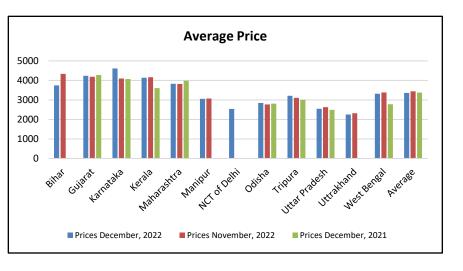
### **Ongoing Rabi Paddy Sowing Updates:**

• According to data released on 30th December,2022 by Ministry of Agriculture, paddy has been sown in 16.53 lakh Ha. against 13.70 lakh Ha of previous year, higher by 20.7% in this rabi season.

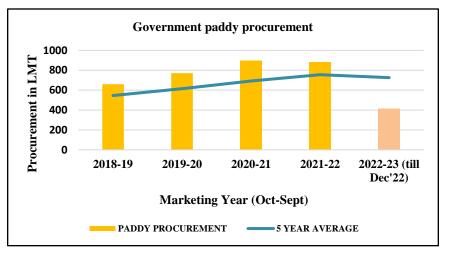
### Price:

- In December 2022, the average monthly wholesale price of rice in India was Rs. 3360.2 per quintal, down by 2.45% from Rs. 3444.55 per quintal in November 2022 and just slightly down from Rs. 3434.11 per quintal a year earlier.
- The average rice prices traded rangebound due to reduced arrivals and strong demand from private players, millers and exporters as well.



### Procurement:

 According to sources, FCI had purchased 530.78 lakh tonnes (LMT) of paddy for the central pool as of January 1, 2023, during the current 2022–2023 kharif marketing season. The government is actively purchasing paddy, which could assist to refill the reserves that PMGKAY has depleted.



### Export:

- Due to strong demand, the price of the 5% broken parboiled variety from India increased from the previous week's range of \$374 to \$380 to \$375 to \$382 per tonne. However, increases were constrained by the growing supply from new-season harvests.
- According to reports, the overall export of basmati and non-basmati rice in the current 2022–23 MY was 10.12 MMT, up 26% from the same period in 2021–22 MY. While non-basmati rice was predominantly marketed to African nations, basmati rice was primarily exported to developed markets like the United States, Europe, and Saudi Arabia.

Additionally, the export limitations on non-basmati had little to no effect due to amendments to the export regulations at the time.

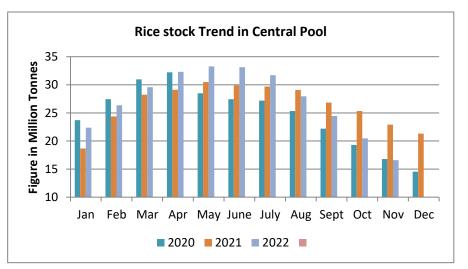

# Stock Position:

- As of January 1, FCI had 12.4 MMT of rice on hand and 32.5 MMT more to receive from millers, far exceeding the 7.6 MMT buffer requirement.
- Due to the government's active involvement in the purchase of paddy this year, the rice inventories that were depleted by the free ration plan - PMGKAY — are anticipated to rise.

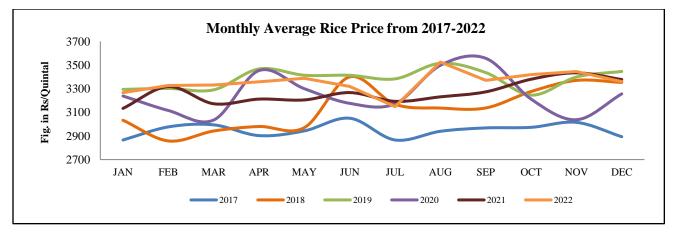
**Rice Production Estimates:** 

 The production of kharif rice in India is expected to reach a record 104.99 million tonnes during the 2022–23 season, down by 6% from what was harvested during the previous harvest season, according to the first advance estimates of production of major agricultural crops released by the Union Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare on September 21, 2022.

### International Market:

- As per sources, there is good demand for all varieties of Basmati from Iraq and Yemen. Dubai festival is also scheduled to start in Feburary,2023, it would push prices further up. Apart from this, Iran normally starts buying from March every year and is expected to be the same for this year too. Right now, packing/shipping for basmati continues for Yemen, UAE, Saudi Arabia and Russia in south India. Exporters for aromatic rice are active right now.
- The price for Vietnam's 5% broken rice was \$458 a tonne free on board, up from \$448-\$453 a week earlier and the highest price since mid-July as China's decision to relax its coronavirus restrictions is likely to help Vietnam to increase exports.
- In comparison to last week, price quotes for Thailand's 5% broken rice ranged from \$452 to \$465 per tonne. The export price high was brought on by the strong baht. Farmers and mills reduced activities in advance of the holidays, which normally reduced price volatility, even if it was acknowledged that supply would not be an issue to service increasing demand. Millers would buy more while prices were rising in order to stock up in anticipation of future price hikes.
- According to sources, Bangladesh has given Indian cooperatives around \$40 more per tonne to purchase 2.5 lakh tonnes of parboiled rice in a government-to-government deal than the private trade had bid in a global import tender. Trade sources claim that the import agreement will be carried out through Kendriya Bhandar and NCCF (National Cooperative Consumers Federation) in two instalments, with Dhaka receiving rice for a cost of \$443 and \$443.5 per tonne, respectively. Despite paying Indian cooperatives more for the G2G transaction, Bangladesh will obtain parboiled rice for at least \$25 less than Thailand or Pakistan. Thailand is currently asking \$486 per tonne, whereas Pakistan is currently offering parboiled rice for \$453–457 per tonne.
- As per estimates, Vietnam's rice exports will have increased 15.7% to 7.22 million tonnes in 2022. An estimated 550,000 tonnes of rice were exported from Vietnam in December, worth \$283 million.

Based on strong demand from importers in Africa and Asia, the 2022 (Jan–Dec) rice trade is predicted to reach a peak of approximately 52 million t (+3%). Global output is expected to decrease by 2% y/y, to 505 million tons, in the years

2022–2023, due to lesser harvests in Asian nations. Given the significant decline in supply, it is expected that worldwide consumption will decline by 1% year over year, and reserves will drop for the second year in a row to a five-year low. Within the overall picture, stocks are expected to decline in important exporters, particularly India. Due to declining Asian demand, trade may decline in 2023.
