Rice Weekly Research Report

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Outlook and Review:

- Unexpected heavy rainfall in October has ended the hopes of paddy farmers in northeastern Bihar's seemanchal and kosi districts of getting good harvest this year. As per assessment of agricultural department, around 6.6 lakh hectares were impacted due to floods, excessive rains and waterlogging conditions.
- In West Bengal, traditional crop of west Bengal was projected to produce more despite the current rains. During kharif, the state produces around 11 million tonnes of paddy accounting for 70% of entire output which is expected to be 15-16 million tonnes this year. The premium variety Gobindbhog is expected to be impacted by the rains as the crops are becoming larger and quality is suffering.
- Around 440 paddy procurement center is expected to set up in Khammam for KMS 2021-22. As per reports, about 6.50 lakh tonnes of paddy is expected to be procured in Khammam and kothagudem districts of Telangana. In Khammam district, paddy was cultivated in about 2.64 lakh acres in 21 mandals and 5.48 lakh metric tonnes yield was expected.
- As per USDA's GAIN report on China's rice prices said Indian rice made up to 23 percent of total imports by Beijing during January-August this year. The reason for such huge increase in imports is due to competitive price of Indian rice which averaged at \$345 per tonne while the world average stood at \$454 per tonne. As per sources, during January – August China imported 7.3 lakh tonnes from India, 7.1 lakh tonnes from Vietnam and 6.4 lakh tonnes from Pakistan.
- The recovery of huge quantity of PR variety of rice from two godowns of the Karnal district has put the authority on high alert. The district administration suspects that rice meant for public distribution system from UP, Bihar and other neighboring states could be delivered as the custom milled rice (CMR).
- Rice export prices in India rose to their highest level in nearly three months this week as the rupee appreciated amid a shortfall in supply, while higher shipping costs and a weaker baht dragged Thai rates lower. India's 5% broken parboiled variety was quoted at \$362 to \$365 per tonne up from last week's \$360 to \$363.
- The Government of India has stated that there is no possibility of genetically modified (GM) substances mixing with the rice exported because their production is prohibited. As France and other European countries have detected the content of genetically modified rice in the 500 MT of broken rice imported from India.
- Paddy harvesting in Malwa, Majha and Doaba regions of Punjab is expected to be delayed due to heavy rainfall coupled with high velocities of wind and flattened the crop thus reducing the harvest. As pr government figures, around 70 lakh tonnes of paddy have reached grain market which is roughly one third of total yield expected this season.
- In Amritsar, agriculture officials have reported 30% loss to the standing crop. In Rupnagar, 10% of the standing crop has been flattened. The rains have expected to delay the pace of the current harvesting season. The harvesting is expected to resume in most parts of Bathinda and Mansa districts from next week.

With increase in shipment to Asia, the forecast for world rice trade in 2021 is lifted to a new high of 48m t (+4m y/y). Reflecting an upgrade for India, the projection for global production in 2021/22 is raised by 1m t, to a peak of 513m (507m), with the net increase in supplies channelled to an increased figure for utilisation, leaving carryovers steady m/m, at 182m (+3m). Trade in 2022 is predicted to be little-changed y/y, at close to a new peak.

With increase in freight costs and logistics difficulties in some exporters, world rice import demand in 2020/21 is forecast to expand to a record of 48m t (+4m y/y) on firmer demand from buyers in Africa and Asia. Tied to acreage gains and improved yields, 2021/22 production is predicted at a new peak, including a sizeable main crop in India. While population growth will boost consumption, inventories are seen rising to a high of 182m t (+3m), with major exporters' reserves at a record of 50m. Trade in 2022 is seen remaining high, mostly on African demand.
