

Rice Weekly Research Report

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Outlook and Review:

- In KMS 2021-22, a quantity of 351.27 lakh metric tonne of paddy has been procured up to 13th December 2021. Till now about 30.06 lakh farmers have been benefitted with MSP value. Maximum procurement has been done in Punjab 186.85 lakh tonnes followed by Haryana with 55.31 lakh tonnes.
- As of 10th December, rabi paddy sowing was done in 10.81 lakh hectares up by 0.525 lakh hectares from 10.366 lakh hectares the previous year during corresponding period. In Tamil Nadu, around 9.611 lakh hectares up by 1.127 lakh hectares from 8.484 lakh hectares the previous year.
- Fortified rice kernel manufacturers association of Haryana said they will go on hunger strike if the government did not cancel its milling tenders to private firm. As per reports, the government has given tenders to firm which offered Rs. 59.64 + GST per kg of fortified rice to the government, while the Haryana based firm are even ready to give the same quality rice at Rs. 45-50 per kg.
- As per reports, around 10,591 hectares of paddy crop has been lost in the Balasore district of Odisha due
 to Jawad induced rains. The farmers claim that it will take next 20 days to completely drain out water from
 the farm lands by then all paddy would be either damaged or germinated.
- As per Thai rice exporter association (TREA) rice importing nations would pay approximately \$579.75 million to shipping line as freight charges by the end of the year. Nigeria would pay \$300 million for 2 million tonnes of rice, Benin pays \$81 million for 540,000 tonnes while Togo pays \$56.25 million for 375,000 tonnes and Ghana pays \$142.5 million for 950,000 tonnes. The shift from containers to bulk shipment have affected the cost of foreign rice importation to West Africa from Thailand and other Asian countries.
- Telangana high court refuses to pass orders on paddy MSP as in many places' reports are coming of low price selling of paddy by the farmers to the millers. The paddy was sold at menial Rs. 1000 by the farmers due to fear of damage of crop due to the rains. The paddy purchasing is going in the state and around 6,439 procurement centers have been established.
- After Telangana, Andhra Pradesh asks farmers to shun paddy cultivation this rabi and shift the area to
 alternatives like millets. The state has earlier planned to increase paddy area by one lakh hectares to 8.50
 lakh hectares from normal area of 7.50 lakh hectares. But the farmers have sown only 50,000 hectares as
 of now against 94,000 hectares the previous year.
- Rice exporters association of Pakistan (REAP) is urging government to take immediate action to ensure timely availability of containers for the exports of rice. Also shipping companies are charging too high compared to the prevailing rates.
- Chhattisgarh has started depositing custom milled rice to the central pool to FCI godowns int the state. The
 rice millers in the state have announced a support price of Rs. 120 for milling per quintal of rice.
 Chhattisgarh has set a target of depositing 61.65 lakh tonnes of rice under central pool.
- India's 5 percent broken rice was quoted at \$351-\$356 per tonne down from \$353-\$358 last week. The
 price fell as Indian rupee weakened touching two months low. This has made Indian rice highly competitive
 in international market.



- In Vietnam, 5 percent broken rice fell to \$410-\$414 per tonne from \$415-\$420 per tonne last week. The
 market is considered to be idle currently except high freight charge and container crunch remains a major
 problem. Farmers in Mekong Delta are also accelerating the sowing of seeds in order to avoid drought and
 salinity.
- Thailand's 5 percent broken rice was narrowed to \$385-\$396 per tonne from \$380-\$397 per tonne last week. It is mainly due to strengthening of Thai baht over Us dollars.
- Jharkhand government to take loan of Rs. 1552 crore for the procurement of paddy at MSP from two PSU banks. Normal paddy would be purchased at Rs. 2050 per quintal while grade A paddy will be procured at Rs. 2070 per quintal.

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Procurement of paddy in ongoing KMS 2021-22 is going in India at MSP, as was done in previous seasons, and a quantity of over 351.27 LMT of rice was procured as of December 13th 2021. In Punjab, the procurement operations are almost finished. The procurement has been done majorly in Punjab and Haryana. The procurement in southern and eastern part of the country have started. With time the procurement is about to increase specially in southern and eastern part of the country.

The Council's forecast for global rice trade in 2021 is fractionally higher m/m, at 48.3 m t (44.0 m), on stronger than anticipated demand from buyers in Asia. While 2021/22 world production is projected little-changed m/m, at a peak of 513 m t (+1% y/y), end-season stocks are lifted from before, to 184 m (+3 m y/y), on an upward revision for India. The outlook for global import demand in 2022 is maintained and would be steady y/y.

Stronger demand from importers in Asia and Africa is seen pushing up world rice trade to a peak of 48.3m t (44.0m) in 2021. Linked to another record outturn in India, global production in 2021/22 is forecast at a fresh high, while inventories are seen expanding on accumulation in the major exporters. Despite a likely contraction in feed uptake in China, consumption is predicted at a record on continued population growth. Trade is projected little-changed y/y in 2022 as a potential reduction in deliveries to Asia is countered by firmer demand in Africa.
