#### Sugar & Gur Domestic & International Fundamentals

#### **Recent Update:**

**Indian Sugar market showed mixed trend compared to previous day across India.** Overall the prices are expected to be steady to low due to lower demand and the effects of coronavirus spread in India. Khatauli sugar market was closed at steady price of Rs.3245/q while the prices in Kolhapur market prices stood at Rs.3150/q.

**Despite the downfall in the international sugar prices in the last one week, the Indian sugar exports likely to increase.** As the decline in production in Thailand (down by 5 million tonnes) and the increased demand of sugar from Indonesia will help India to pick up the pace in exports. As per ISMA, sugar mills have dispatched almost 30 lakh tons of sugar for export against MAEQ of 60 lac tons till 15<sup>th</sup> Mar'20. And about 36-38 lac tons of sugar have been contracted for exports so far. The Indonesian government has released an additional import quota to its refineries and the recent decision of Indonesian Government to allow 600 ICUMSA sugar at a concessional import duty from India, Australia and Thailand has open the wider gates for India to export large quantities of sugar to Indonesia.

According to ISMA, 215.82 lakh tonnes of sugar have been produced till 15th March 2020 by 321 mills across India as against 273.65 lakh tonnes produced in the same time last year. As on 15<sup>th</sup> Mar'20, 136 mills have stopped their operations as compared to 173 mills had stopped operations in the same time last year and 354 mills were operating. In UP, 119 sugar mills have produced 87.16 LT of sugar compared to 84.14 LT of sugar with only 117 mills operational mills till 15<sup>th</sup> Mar last year. In Maharashtra, 56 mills have closed their operations with only 90 mills operating at this time with producing 55.85 LT down 44.19% year on year. Similarly, this year Karnataka has also produced less sugar i.e., around 33 LT against 42 LT last year till 15<sup>th</sup> Mar. Only 13 mills are in operation out of the total 63 mills this year. According to Agriwatch, Maharashtra is likely to produce around 59 LT followed by UP estimated around 122 LT of sugar and 34.92 LT of sugar in Karnataka.

#### **Weather Forecast:**

During the next 24 hours, dry weather is expected to prevail over almost entire India. However isolated light rains may occur over Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, East Assam and Arunachal Pradesh. Day and night temperatures will increase over most parts of Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Delhi NCR, parts of Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal and Odisha.

#### **Previous Updates:**

The coronavirus became pandemic and the sugar industry is also likely to be affected like all the other commodities. Global sugar prices crashed and Sugar futures market fallen to 11.7cents/lb from 13.89cents/lbs on Friday down by around 15% within 10 days, making exports unattractive for Indian mills, as selling in the domestic market is now more profitable. And no new export transactions are taking place in the Indian market. The necessary precautions that are being taken by the government to avoid spreading is going to affect the sugar consumption. Because people are avoiding consuming cold drinks, ice creams and other products. Thus, everyone is waiting for the change in climate and temperature to rise so that the situation to be under controlled.

**As on 12<sup>th</sup> Mar'20, total 119 sugar mills has been crushing sugarcane in Uttar Pradesh against 117 mills** during the correspond period previous year. So far, UP has crushed 5.12% more sugarcane around 762.49 LT

against 725.35 LT in the previous year and produced 85.02 LT of sugar which is 3.97% higher due to the favorable conditions in the state this year as the area increased. Whereas, the average sugar recovery remained higher at 11.15% compared to the previous month and lower by 1.06% at 11.24% recovery rate in the same time previous year from the start of the season in Oct till 12<sup>th</sup> Mar'20.

Maharashtra has produced around 52.94 lakh tonnes of sugar this year so far till 5<sup>th</sup> of Mar'20 by crushing around 477 lakh tonnes of cane with a recovery rate of 11.08%. Overall 32 mills have closed their crushing operations including 11 mills in Aurangabad, 7 mills in Ahmednagar, followed by 4 mills each in Pune and Solapur and 3 mills are closed in Kolhapur. Kolhapur has produced around 19.5 lakh tonnes of sugar with the highest recovery of 12.1% in Maharashtra so far. After Kolhapur, Pune has produced 13.6 lakh tonnes of sugar with a recovery of 11.11% followed by Solapur producing 6.5 lakh tonnes of sugar (recovery rate of 10.02%).

As on 6<sup>th</sup> Mar'20, total 119 sugar mills has been crushing sugarcane in Uttar Pradesh against 117 mills during the correspond period previous year. So far, UP has crushed 6% more sugarcane around 730.78 LT against 689.47 LT in the previous year and produced 81.3 LT of sugar which is 4.96% higher due to the favorable conditions in the state this year as the area increased. Whereas, the average sugar recovery remained low compared to the previous month at 11.12% and lower by 1.07% which was at 11.24% in the same time previous year from the start of the season in Oct till 6<sup>th</sup> Mar'20.

The total 2019-20 EU sugar production likely to decline by 428,000 MT in 2019-20 sugar season (October-September) at 17.502 MMT according to the S&P Global Platts Analytics forecasts due to the dry conditions early in the season and heavy rainfall late in the season. The sugar production has fallen since previous two seasons and is likely to see further drop in production. Prices slumped because of the initial rise in production that forced the EU to try to compete in a depressed global market. Prices have now rebounded as production has fallen in the EU.

Thailand Raw sugar as well as refined sugar exports declined by 6% and 2% respectively in 2019 (Jan'19-Jan'20) whereas the white sugar exports rose significantly by 16% to 7.19 LT till Jan'20 from Jan'19. Overall Thailand sugar exports also declined by around 3.5% to 107.92 LT compared to the previous year. In January, around 462,098 tonnes of raw sugar was exported at an average FOB of \$292.29/ton higher price compared to the previous months' exports. Similarly, White and refined sugar were exported around 44,283 tonnes and 2,49,084 tonnes at an average FOB of \$338.6/ton and \$347.73/ton respectively reported to be the highest price of the season. The Thailand exports in January'20 increased due to the higher imports in Indonesia, Vietnam, Sudan, Singapore, China followed by Philippines.

According to ISMA, all sugar mills across India have produced around 194.84 lakh tonnes of sugar lower as compared to 249.3 lakh tonnes produced on the corresponding time last year lower by 22%. This year around 68 sugar mills across India have stopped crushing operation due to lack of availability of cane out of 453 sugar mills. Maharashtra this year have produced sugar less by around 45% to 50.7 lakh tonnes with a closure of around 22 sugar mills compared to 92.88 lakh tonnes last year till 29<sup>th</sup> Feb. In U.P. 119 sugar mills which are in operation have produced 76.86 lac tons of sugar till 29<sup>th</sup> February'20, compared with 73.87 lakh tons up by 4% year on year produced by 117 mills on the corresponding date of last year.
