### Sugar & Gur Domestic & International Fundamentals

#### **Recent Update:**

**Steady tone was witnessed in Sugar physical markets today in India.** Sugar prices closed higher in Delhi and khatauli by Rs.5-10 at Rs. 3285/q and 3130/q respectively. Prices were steady at Rs. 3150/q in Kolhapur and other markets.

More than 170 hectares of sugarcane crop has been damaged due to cyclone in Puducherry. According to the preliminary estimates the initial damage due to the cyclone was around Rs 400 crore and about 170 hectares of sugarcane crop has been damaged. The state government would demand initial interim central assistance of Rs 50 crore for post cyclone reconstruction and rehabilitation.

### **Weather Forecast:**

Heavy rainfall at isolated places very likely over Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam and Andaman & Nicobar Islands. Thunderstorm with lightning likely at isolated places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and thunderstorm with lighting at isolated over Rayalseema, Kerala & Mahe, and Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam.

#### **Previous Updates:**

**Sugar millers in Uttar Pradesh are against the hike in State Advisory Price (SAP).** The decline in recovery rate of sugar has increased the production cost of sugar. UP sugar mills are now requesting the government not to increase the SAP for current season. As the sugar mills are not able to recover the cost of sugar production.

The sugar recovery percentage has reduced in Uttar Pradesh from 9.54% in 2019-20 to 9.15% at the beginning of the crushing season. The private sugar mills have recorded a decline from 9.57% to 9.16% and the cooperative sugar mills from 9.06% to 8.82%. The decrease in sugar recovery percentage is due to damages incurred to the crop through untimely rains and occurrence of red rot diseases mainly in eastern Uttar Pradesh.

**Aurangabad sugar mill produces 7.96 lakh quintals of sugar.** Sugar mills in Aurangabad have crushed 11 lakh tonnes of sugar till date. Total 19 private and cooperative sugar mills are participating in crushing operations. Earlier 22 sugar mills have applied for license to start sugarcane crushing, out of which 20 sugar mills were granted permission and are currently operating.

**Sugar mills are advised to clear cane dues within 15 days.** The sugar mills of Kalaburagi in Karnataka are advised to clear cane bills of the farmers within 15 days of procurement. The factories in the district should pay Rs2, 500 per tonne to the farmers for their produce.

**Sugar mills in Pakistan are facing sugarcane shortage.** The sugarcane farmers in Pakistan are demanding a higher price than the fixed price of Rs200 per 40 kg by the government. The mills are not able to pay the amount to farmers, hence may be forced to shut down in a week. The sugar mills have already started their operations as per government orders but are now facing problems due to shortage of cane.



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**Food Ministry provides Rs 12,500 crore loan to set up ethanol unit.** About 185 sugar mills and standalone distillers will be provided a loan of Rs12,500 crore for the capacity addition of about 468 crore liter of ethanol per annum, as to achieve the target of 20 percent of the blending with petrol. Earlier, 70 ethanol projects were sanctioned amounting Rs 3, 600 crore. The government is promoting ethanol production as well as making effort to manufacture ethanol.

**Sugar production increases in Uttar Pradesh.** The sugar production in Uttar Pradesh has increased to about 3.85 lakh tonnes which is 30 percent more than the corresponding period last year 2.93 lakh tonnes. About 76 mills are operating in this season in Uttar Pradesh.

**India has lost the opportunity to export sugar.** Due to delay in announcement of export policy by the government, India has lost the opportunity to export about 1.7 million tonnes of sugar as the buyers are now turned to other suppliers after waiting for India. This has helped increase international prices of raw sugar as well as white sugar by about 15% since October.

International Sugar Organization has forecasted that the global sugar deficit will be increased to 3.5 million tonnes from 724,000 tonnes estimated earlier in August. The deficit has been projected lower due to lower sugar output which is estimated at 171.1 million tonnes, lower from 173.5 million tonnes earlier. The sugar production estimates for Thailand has been reduced from 8.7 million tonnes to 8.2 million tonnes and for India from 31.5 million tonnes to 31 million tonnes. Also, the global sugar consumption has been increased from 174.2 million tonnes to 174.6 million tonnes.

**Sugarcane farmers are demanding one time FRP.** The cane farmers from Maharashtra are demanding one time Fair and remunerative price (FRP) from sugar mills. The sugar mills in Kolhapur and Maharashtra have agreed to pay one time FRP but the mills from other parts of state have not responded to the demand.

**Sugar mills in Uttar Pradesh assure farmers to clear cane Dues.** The sugarcane farmers had launched an agitation outside the Bijnor sugar mill premises to demand their cane arrears for the crushing season 2019-2020. They demanded to clear their cane dues immediately. The mills administration has assured them to clear all the cane dues by 30<sup>th</sup> November 2020. Farmers of Punjab and Haryana are also protesting for pending cane arrears.

**According to Indian Sugar Mills Association about 14.10 lakh tonnes of sugar has been produced till 15**<sup>th</sup> **November 2020,** which was 4.84 lakh tonnes last year on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2019. This year 274 sugar mills have started crushing sugarcane, in Uttar Pradesh 76 sugar mills are producing 3.85 lakh tonnes of sugar, Similarly, crushing operations have been started in Maharashtra, Karnataka and Gujarat. Policy decisions regarding export policy along with export subsidy for the sugar year 20-21 and creation of buffer stock is still awaited from the government.

**Uttarakhand to start new sugar mill at Bazpur.** The Bazpur Sugar mill has completed all its preparations to commence sugarcane crushing and is expected to start by 20<sup>th</sup> November 2020. Sugar mills in Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka and Maharashtra have already started their production for the new season. With the estimated production of 310 lakh tonnes this year, India is expected to have another surplus season and will have opportunity to export about 60-70 lakh tonnes of sugar.
