

## Sugar &Gur Domestic & International Fundamentals

### Recent Update:

**Steady tone was witnessed in Sugar physical markets today in India.** Sugar prices were lower in Delhi by 10-20 at Rs. 3130/q. Prices were lower in Kolhapur at Rs. 3000/q.

**Brahmavar sugar factory has started producing organic jaggery.** The factory has prepared jaggery without using chemicals and has also received good response from the consumers; the jaggery is directly sold to the consumers without any intermediary. The factory with the capacity to grinding 15 tonnes of sugarcane per day has produced around 450 kg of Jaggery.

### Weather Forecast:

Dense fog in isolated pockets very likely over Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Assam & Meghalaya. Cold wave condition in isolated pockets very likely over north Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand and Odisha.

### Previous Updates:

**Farmers's agitation has impacted cane harvesting in Gohana, Haryana.** The on-going farmers' agitation for the withdrawal of farm laws has impacted the sugarcane harvesting activities. Due to this, sugar mills are facing lower supply of cane for crushing. Earlier, the mill had set a target of crushing 47 lakh quintal of sugarcane for this season. But till date, the mill could only complete crushing of 18.75 lakh quintal sugarcane. The farmers from the region are rushing to participate in the agitation resulting in lowering the speed of crushing activities.

**Sugarcane farmers from Uttarakhand have launched an agitation to hike the sugar price.** Farmers from the Tarai region of the state depend mainly on the sugarcane crop and the farmer's income is depend on the income which they get from sugarcane crops. According to farmers, the government is not increasing the purchase rate of cane which is affecting the farmers' income.

**The Government has increased the budget estimates under ethanol interest subvention scheme from Rs 50 crore (budget estimate 2020-21) to Rs 300 crore in the financial year 2021-22.** The estimate for 2020-21 is six times more from the previous estimates and this would encourage domestic sugar mills and distilleries to enhance production from ethanol for sugarcane and surplus grains like maize, rice available with FCI and other feed stocks. The budget has also proposed to increase customs duty on import of ethanol from 2.5 to 5 percent with a view to encourage domestic manufacturing of denatured ethanol.

**Mills in India have produced around 176.83 lakh tonnes of sugar till 31st January'21.** According to the Indian Sugar Mills Association, 491 sugar mills were in operation in the country till 31st January 21 and have produced around 176.83 lakh tonnes of sugar, as compared to 141.04 lakh tonnes of sugar produced by 447 sugar mills on 31st January' 20 previous year.

**Shortages of shipping containers have affected sugar export from India.** The shortage of shipping containers has affected the white sugar export on a large scale. The geopolitical tensions with China have also affected the availability of containers in the country. As the sugar demand continues to increase from Afghanistan, Sri Lanka and East Africa but due to lack of containers there is slow movement of sugar from India. The mills are expected to export 200,000 tonnes of sugar including raw sugar. Till now, India has exported 70,000 tonnes of white sugar this month as compared with 370,000 tonnes in January 2020.

**According to Indian Sugar Mills Association, major sugar producing states will focus on ethanol production.**

According to the estimation around 6.74 lakh tonnes of sugar will be diverted for production of ethanol by the sugar mills in Uttar Pradesh in the current year as compared to about 3.70 lakh tonnes diverted in 2019-20 Sugar Season. Also, Sugar mills in Maharashtra will divert around 6.55 lakh tonnes of sugar compared 1.42 lakh tonnes in last season and mills in Karnataka are expected to divert about 5.41 lakh tonnes of sugar for ethanol production in the current year as compared to about 2.42 lakh tons diverted in the previous Season.

**Government has announced 17 LMT Monthly sugar sales quota for February 2021.** The food ministry has allocated 17 LMT monthly sugar quota for February 2021 which is 3 LMT lower than that of February 2020 which stood at 20 LMT. In the previous month the government has allocated 20 LMT monthly sugar quota for January 2021 to 548 mills.

**Sangli District is likely to witness more sugar output this season.** Around 15 sugar mills are operating in the district and have produced about 48 lakh tonne sugar by crushing 43 lakh tonne sugarcane in last two months. The district has recorded 11.24 per cent sugar recovery rate this season. Earlier the mills faced problems like lack of cane harvesters and demand of hike in cane harvesting rates at the beginning of the crushing season. However, the mills managed the issues and began crushing operations in November. The mill which were operating in the previous season are also engaged in the ongoing operations, and this will add more sugar in the district's output.

**Kenya is planning to import sugar from Uganda.** Kenya is planning to import around 90,000 tonnes of sugar from uganda and 160,000 tonnes from other countries after exhausting comesa import quota allotted to it. Kenya has been importing around 350,000 tonnes from within EAC and Comesa due to a widened deficit in its market.

**Over Rs. 12,000 crore cane dues are still pending in Uttar Pradesh.** The sugarcane farmers have supplied cane worth Rs 14,000 crore to the sugar mills in the ongoing season but have received only RS 4,448 crore. The payment made by the mills in the current season also includes arrears of over Rs 2,500 crore of the previous sugar seasons. Also, the state government has yet not announced the sugarcane SAP.
