Recent Update:

Sugar physical market continued to mostly stable trend today in India. Sugar prices reported higher by Rs. 10/qtl in the Delhi market at Rs. 3415/qtl and in Kolhapur prices remained stable at Rs. 3300 per quintal.

As per sources, Maharashtra are set to stop cane crushing 45 to 60 days earlier than last year as heavy rain has curtailed sugarcane availability. Maharashtra could produce 12.8 MT of sugar in the current season 2022-23.

India has allowed sugar mills to export only 6.1 MT of the sweetener in the current season and out of that mills have already contracted to export 5.7 MT.

The Haryana government has hiked the SAP to Rs. 372 per quintal from the existing Rs.362 per quintal. Earlier, Haryana Sugarcane farmers has urged the government to hike the sugarcane SAP from Rs. 450 per quintal as against the existing SAP of Rs. 362 per quintal.

As per the market sources, the government may take a decision in the coming February month for increasing the sugar export quota from the current 60 lakh tonne. In the current marketing year so far, the mills have dispatched 30 lakh tonnes of sugar for exports and out of that 18 lakh tonnes have already been shipped. As pet the food ministry, the entire 60 lakh tonnes will get exported by May. The government is currently assessing the supply and demand estimate in the domestic market along with the actual sugar production.

The National Federation of Cooperative Sugar Factories (NFCSF) has estimated that around 515 sugar mills across the country have produced 160 lakh tonnes sugar till 15th January 23 which is about 10 lakh tonne higher than the corresponding date of last year. However, the average sugar recovery is decreased by 0.14% as compared to the last year's average recovery of 9.64%.

As per the NFCSF's estimate, the 2022-23 sugar season will be over by the end of April and the sugar production is estimated at 343 lakh tonnes which is expected to be lower by 16 lakh tonnes compared to last year's 359 lakh tonne. Apart from this, around 45 lakh tonnes of sugar will be diverted to ethanol production. Thus this year, the gross total sugar production will be around 390 lakh tonne.

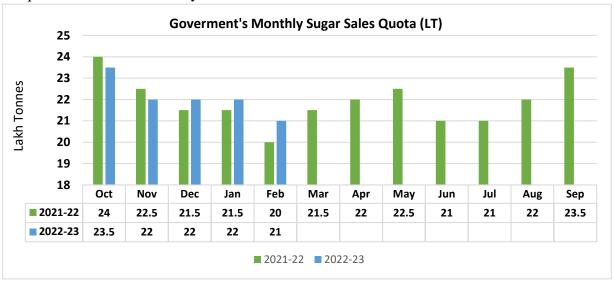

Post diversion of 45 lac tons to ethanol due to diversion of cane juice / syrup and B-molasses to ethanol, ISMA estimates sugar production in 2022-23 at around 340 lakh tons of sugar.

Domestic Sales Quota:

In a notification issued on 31st day of January 2023, the food ministry has allocated 21 LMT monthly sugar quota for February 2023 to 554 sugar mills which is higher than 1 LMT in comparison to the quota allocated in February 2022.



Weather Forecast

Rise in min. temp. by 2-3 degree Celsius very likely over many parts of Northwest India during next three days and no significant change thereafter.

International Market Updates:

The Nepal government has fixed the minimum support price of sugarcane at Rs.610 per quintal for the 2022-23 season. During the previous season government has increased the MSP for sugarcane by 8.39 % to 590 per quintal.

The red rot disease was detected in the Sugarcane crop of Parsa and Bara region of Nepal. Farmers are planning for a early harvest of the crop to prevent infection from the crop. Also, the farmers are selling crops on the prices which mills are offering as the government has not yet announced the minimum support price for sugarcane.

Jaggery:

As per AgriWatch sources, Jaggery-making units in Uttar Pradesh are working on a lower scale as winter season will end in coming 1-2 months, along with it there is enough stock available in the market.

The Karnataka government is planning to provide an industry tag on jaggery. Consumption of jaggery is likely to increase as the focus on sustainable lifestyle increased. India is the biggest exporter of jaggery and Karnataka is the third largest cane producer which can give an advantage to the state to increase jaggery production.

Ethanol:

Sutlej Organics and Chemicals is planning to set up an ethanol plant having a capacity of 120 klpd at Jehan Kela and Bassi Mustafa in the Hoshiarpur district of Punjab. The proposed project spread over 21.62 acres of land will also include a 2.5 MW co-generation plant.
