

#### **Price Outlook:**

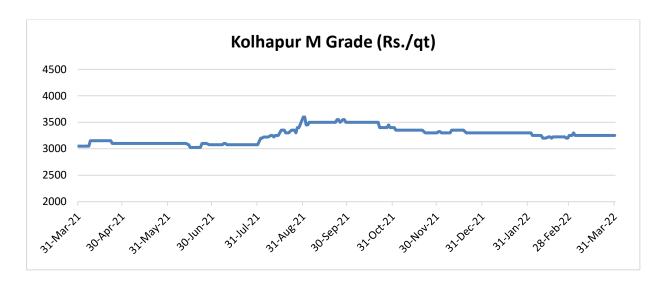
Sugar prices had slightly fallen in the major markets across India last month. The average sugar prices were lower at Rs. 3414/q from the previous month at Rs.3418/q in Delhi market. The prices in Maharashtra also stood slightly higher at Rs.3252/q in March'22 as compared to the previous month. Agriwatch expects prices to remain stable in the coming month. Demand for sugar is expected to increase with the coming of the summer season, which may be supportive to the prices.

#### **Price Projection for the Next Month:**

As per Agriwatch estimates, spot sugar prices (M grade) in benchmark Kolhapur market are likely to remain between Rs.3,250 -3,350 per quintal in April 2022.

#### **Domestic Sugar Market Summary:**

Out of 516 sugar mills which had started crushing in 2021-22 Sugar Season, 152 sugar mills had stopped their crushing operations till 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 in India. Last year, 503 sugar mills had operated, out of which 221 had stopped crushing on the corresponding date last year. Maharashtra is leading in sugar production in India with around 184 sugar mills in operation in the State. Average prices for Sugar 'M' grade in key Kolhapur market was steady at Rs.3250 per quintal last month.



### **Sugar Domestic Balance Sheet**

- As per the Agriwatch's latest estimates, India's sugar production was 30.9 MMT during 2020-21 Sugar Season and sugar production in 2021-22 is likely to increase at 32.50 MMT as area under sugarcane has increased in 2021-22 season to 53.86 lakh hectares compared to previous season area of 52.94 lakh hectares.
- Sugar domestic consumption is estimated at 26.5 MMT in 2020-21 and consumption is expected to slight increase at 27.00 MMT in 2021-22.
- The 2020-21 Sugar Season is expected to have ended with 6.64 MMT carry over stock and it is projected that in 2021-22 SS, the ending stock may decrease to 4.14.

#### **Domestic Market Highlights**

#### **Recent Updates:**

The Food Ministry has allocated 22 LMT monthly sugar quota for April 2022 which is same as the quota released during the previous season for April 2021. In March 2022, the government has fixed 21.5 LMT monthly sugar quota for domestic sales.

Around 366 sugar mills are currently in the cane crushing operation in India. Sugar mills have produced around 309.87 lakh tonne of sugar till 31st March'2022 as against 278.71 lakh tonne produced same period last year. The

States of Andhra Pradesh & Telangana, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana and Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Odisha have collectively produced 29.04 lakh tonne of sugar till 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2022. The adjoining table shows the state-wise breakup of sugar production for major states till 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 and the comparison with the previous year.

Indian Sugar Mills Association has revised up its sugar production estimate for 2021-22 Sugar Season for Maharashtra at 126 lakh tonne (after diversion into ethanol), against 117 lakh tonnes estimated in its 2<sup>nd</sup> advance estimates. Similarly, Karnataka is now expected to produce 55 lakh tonnes (after diversion into ethanol), as against 45.21 lakh tonnes estimated earlier. However, not much change is expected in other States including U.P., and they are expected to produce 152 lakh tonnes of sugar (after diversion into ethanol). All India sugar production in 2021-22 season is therefore expected as 333 lakh tonnes, considering diversion of 34 lakh tonnes of sugar equivalent into ethanol. AgriWatch has estimated 325 lakh tonnes of sugar production for the 2021-22 season higher from the previous season production of 309 lakh tonne.

Agriwatch expects sugar exports to reach 80 lakh tonnes during the 2021-22 season. With crude prices seeing a sharp increase in recent weeks due to the Ukraine-Russia conflict, the freight costs have increased. As a result, importers in the Middle East, East Africa and South-East Asia are preferring the Indian sugar over Brazilian supplies. As per Agriwatch market sources, around 72 lakh tonnes of sugar exports contracts have been signed so far in the 2021-22 season.

According to the Sugar Commissionerate Maharashtra, total of 197 sugar mills were in operation including 98 cooperative mills and 99 private mills. Out of that, till 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2022, a total of 25 sugar mills have stopped operations including 19 from the Kolhapur division, one each from Aurangabad and Nagpur, and 4 from Solapur division. Sugar mills in Maharashtra have produced 11.62 lakh tonnes sugar by crushing 1120.04 lakh tonnes

sugarcane with a recovery of 10.38 percent slightly higher from the previous week of 10.36 percent till 27<sup>th</sup> March, 2022.

Sugarcane crushing season in Uttar Pradesh has entered the final phase as several mills are closing their operations. As on 26<sup>th</sup> March, 2022, sugar mills have produced 84.06 lakh tonnes of sugar by crushing 833.60 lakh tonnes of sugarcane and they have so far cleared Rs 18,647.83 crore cane payment which is around 71.28 per cent. Earlier, the mills have made almost 100 percent of the payment for the previous seasons. The amount cleared for the 2020-21 season is around Rs 32,872.28 crore which is 99.57% of the total dues. For the 2021-22 season, the state government is taking steps to ensure that the sugar mills will make 100 per cent cane payment.

Uttar Pradesh is likely to witness low sugar production in the current 2021-22 season as compared to the previous season. The diversion of sugar to ethanol production and the rising disease and pest infestation are the major reasons for the declined sugar output. Indian Sugar Mills Association has earlier estimated sugar production in UP to be 102 lakh tonne as against 110.59 lakh tonne in last year.

During the 2021-22 ethanol supply year, about 131.69 crore litres of ethanol have been blended with petrol in India till 27<sup>th</sup> March 2022, thereby achieving 9.60 percent blending across. The government is confident for achieving 10 percent blending rate in the 2021-22 season. Earlier the government has fixed 20 percent blending target till 2025. During the 2021-22 season, Telangana leads in Ethanol Blending with Petrol program with 10.57 percent blending rate, followed by Karnataka with 10.37 percent.

#### **International Sugar Market Summary:**

The average global raw sugar prices have slightly increased by around 1% to 19.22 cents/lbs in March 2022 from 18.22 cents/lbs in February 2022. The average prices of refined sugar were slightly higher by around 20% to \$513/tonne in March'22 from \$493.46/tonne during February'22.

#### **International Market Highlights:**

According to the Thai Sugar Millers Corporation, the sugar output in Thailand is likely to reach 10 million tonne by 31<sup>st</sup> March 22. After two years of low output, sugar production in Thailand is likely to increase in the current season over good yield following favorable weather. The sugar mills have produced 9.6 million tonne of sugar by crushing 87.75 million tonne of cane so far. The sugar output in the last season was 6.7 million tonne and, in this season, it is expected to rise by 35% to 10 million tonnes.

The sugar production in Pakistan likely to increase by 2 million tonnes from last year to 7.5 million tonnes. As a result, Pakistan is back to sugar surplus country from deficit. Ex-mill sugar prices are now around Rs 81/kg substantially lower from last year.



According to the Unica, Sugarcane crushing in Brazil is down by 91 per cent in early March as compared to the same period last year. The mills in the first half of March have crushed only 142,000 tonnes of sugarcane as the companies are waiting for the crop to fully develop and they have enough stocks of sugar and ethanol. The mills are primarily focused on ethanol production in the first half of March. Traditionally mills start crushing in March though the official crushing season starts in April. The recent frost and severe drought last year have hampered the development of the crop for the 2022 season, and they are waiting for the growth of the crop to start harvesting.

The Russian government has informed that it has sufficient sugar to meet the domestic demand and warned consumers against panic-buying after the country was hit with sanctions from the West due to its military invasion in UkraineSome regions in the country had reported a shortage of sugar due to panic-buying and the government has already banned the export of sugar until 31st August 2022 and set a duty-free quota for imports of 300,000 tonnes of sugar and raw sugar, hoping to ease domestic food inflation.

Bangladesh government has decided to continue the importation of raw sugar with lower import duty for two and half months. At present, there is a 20% tariff benefit on the import of sugar and it would be extended till May 15 to maintain stable rates in the domestic market ahead of the holy month of Ramadan. As per the order, the reduced tariff facility will be effective from March. Earlier the government had reduced import duty from 30% to 20% which ended on February 28.

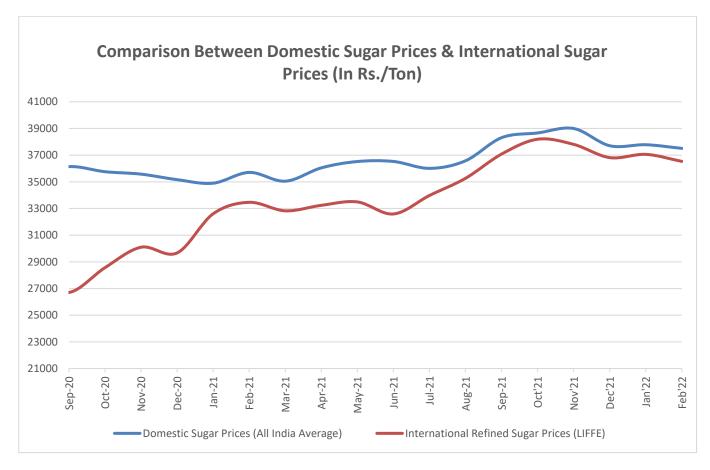
# ICE (Raw Sugar Exchange) Future Market Scenario (May'22 Contract) Technical Commentary:
