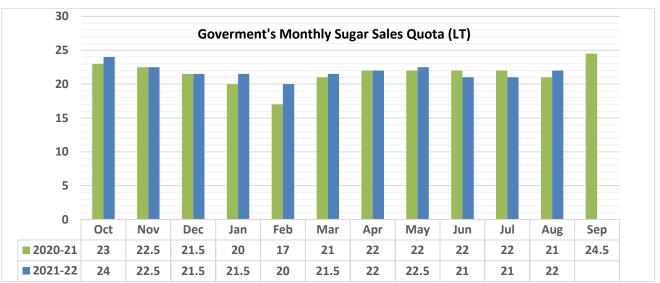

Sugar Domestic Balance Sheet

AgriWatch has revised its sugar production to 35.60 lakh MMT from previous 35.40 MMT. The sugar production was 30.90 MMT in the 2020-21 season. The increase in sugar production is from Tamil Nadu and Karnataka (where the sugarcane special crushing season is going on). Exports for the 2021-22 season is expected to reach 11.60MMT as sugar demand has increased from the international market. Domestic Consumption is also expected to increase in 2021-22 season to 27.20 MMT from 26.50 MMT in 2020-21 season. The stock to use ratio is expected to fall to 3.44 MMT in 2021-22 as compared to 6.64 MMT in 2020-21. Despite, higher total supply, likely increase in consumption and expected higher export would keep prices supported moving ahead.

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Domestic Market Highlights



Recent Updates:

Government of India has allotted the monthly sugar sale quota of 22 lakh MT for the month of July which is 1 lakh MT higher from the previous year. Consideration of higher sale quota is mainly due to expectation of improved demand ahead of the festive season like Raksha Bandhan, Janmashtami, Ganesh Chaturthi etc. In the previous month (July) government allotted 21 lakh MT of monthly sugar sales quota.

The Department of Food & Public Distribution (DFPD) under a vide notification as on 05th August 2022, has issued Export Release Orders (EROs) to exporters and sugar mills. DFPD has issued the orders taking into account higher-than-anticipated domestic production in the 2021-22 season.

Many sugar mills which have produced raw sugar for export were unable to export sugar due to restrictions. Since the raw sugar if not exported may get deteriorated in other 3-4 months, it has been decided to issue ERO to such sugar mills having stock of raw sugar and those who have applied for ERO. Around 4,30,563 MT of sugar is allowed for further export.

Earlier, The Ministry of Commerce and Industry, GoI vide notification no. 10/2015-20 dated 24th May 2022 has restricted export of sugar (Raw, Refined and White sugar) from 01st June 2022 onwards (except fixed quantity of sugar being exported under CXL and TRQ quota to EU and USA). Export after 01.06.2022 will be allowed on production of specific permission (as per the procedure to be notified separately by DFPD) from Directorate of Sugar, Department of Food and Public Distribution (DFPD), Ministry of Consumer affairs, Food and Public Distribution.

According to Indian Sugar Mills Association, Mills have exported 99.7 LMT of sugar so far in the ongoing 2021-22 season to countries such as Nepal, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, UAE, Afghanistan, Indonesia, Somalia etc.

As per Agriwatch estimate, Sugarcane crushing generally commence by end of October or 1st week of November however, in the coming 2022-23 season due to sufficient availability of sugarcane, crushing of cane is likely to commence in 1st to 3rd week of October 2022 and new sugar would start coming in the market from mid of October, 2022. Also, Given the current scenario, despite increased production this season, overall, the ending stocks are below the last year and pointing gradually tightening supply. Higher exports is the main cause of decline in the ending stocks. Overall, additional exports would further tighten the overall supplies.

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has approved Fair and Remunerative Price (FRP) of sugarcane for the 2022-23 sugar season at Rs. 305 per quintal for a basic recovery rate of 10.25%, providing a premium of Rs. 3.05/quintal for each 0.1% increase in sugar recovery over and above 10.25%, & reduction in FRP by Rs. 3.05/quintal for every 0.1% decrease in recovery.

However, the Government with a view to protect interest of sugarcane farmers has also decided that there shall not be any deduction in case of sugar mills where recovery is below 9.5%. Such farmers will get Rs. 282.125/quintal for sugarcane in ensuing 2022-23 season as compared to previous Rs. 275.50/quintal in 2021-22 current season.

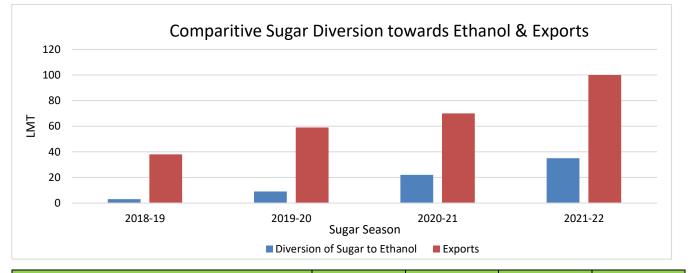

India has become the largest sugar producer in the world and the second largest exporter after Brazil during the 2022-23 season. Sugar production in India has been consistently increasing in the previous years and was comparatively higher than domestic consumption, thereby creating a surplus situation. Also, the Centeral Government has been encouraging sugar mills during the past few seasons to divert the surplus sugar to ethanol and is also facilitating mills to export surplus sugar to improve the liquidity in the market.

According to Indian Sugar Mills Association Preliminary estimate, the total acreage under sugarcane in India is estimated to be around 58.28 lakh hectares in 2022-23 Season, which is about 4% higher than 2021-22 sugar seasons of 55.83 lakh hectares. As of 15th July 2022, Sugar Production is expected to be 354.97 lakh tonnes in the 2022-23 season as compared to previous season 360 lakh tonnes. Currently, Special sugarcane crushing season is in progress in Karnataka and Tamil Nadu.

As depicted in the above table, net sugar production before considering diversion towards ethanol is estimated to be higher at 399.97 lakh tons, against 394 lakh tons during the 2021-22 season. However, in the current year sugar diversion towards production of ethanol is estimated to be higher.

According to Indian Sugar Mills Association, in the current season, till 15th July, 2022, total contracted quantity of ethanol is 444.42 crore litres. Out of this, 362.16 crore liters is from sugar industry. Out of this 362.16 crore liters, ethanol manufactured from sugarcane juice and B-Heavy molasses (BHM) stands at 349.49 crore liters (79.33 crore liters from sugarcane juice and 270.16 crore liters from BHM), which translates into diversion of about 34 lac tons of sugar into ethanol.

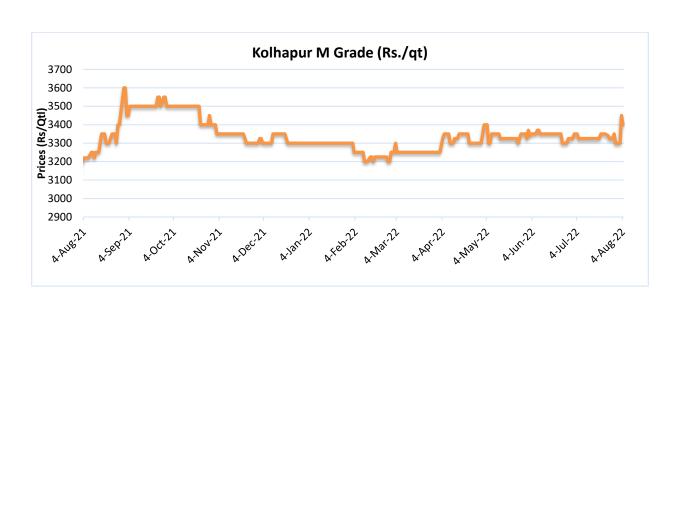
Since a significant quantity of sugarcane juice / syrup and B-molasses will again be diverted into ethanol production, a proportionate quantity of sugar is expected to get diverted in next season also. During the next year 2022-23, since the target of 12% blending is expected to be achieved, a total of about 545 crore liters of ethanol would be required and supplied. Accordingly, it is estimated that the diversion of cane juice and B-molasses to ethanol will reduce sugar production by about 45 lakh tons in next season, as compared to about 34 lakh tons estimated to be diverted this year.

Price Outlook:

Sugar prices had slightly decreased in the major markets across India last month as with the coming of monsoon season sugar demand has comparatively fallen in the market. The average sugar prices were lower at Rs. 3442 per quintal from the previous month at Rs.3463 per quintal in Delhi market. The prices in Maharashtra also stood slightly lower at Rs.3330/q in July'22 as compared to the previous month. AgriWatch expects prices to remain in the range of Rs. 3,300- Rs. 3,450 per quintal in the coming month.

Price Projection for the Next Month:

As per AgriWatch estimates, spot sugar prices (M grade) in benchmark Kolhapur market are likely to remain between Rs.3,350 -3,450 per quintal in Aug 2022.





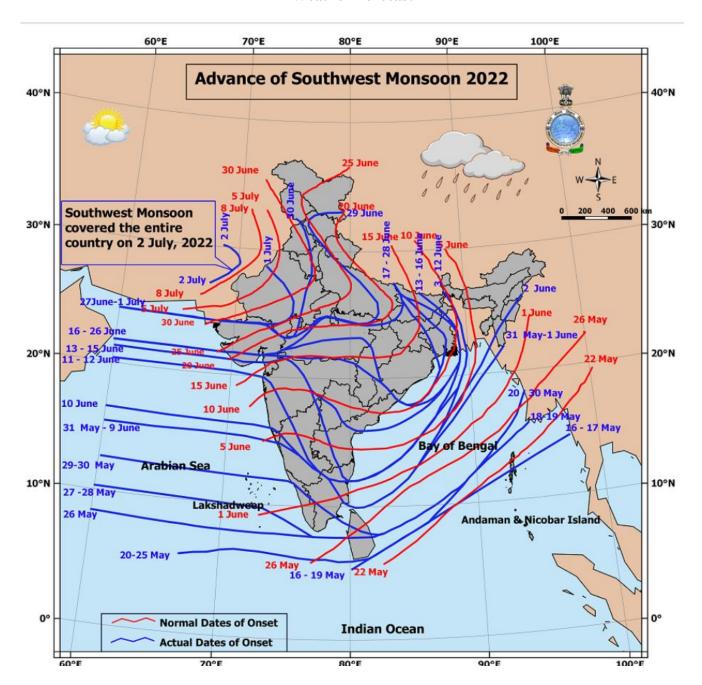

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Weather Forecast



India Meteorological Department has predicted the long-range forecast for the monsoon season, it indicates that from June to September 2022, the countrywide precipitation is likely to be 103 percent of the long period average (LPA) with a model error of 4 percent. The country may record seasonal precipitation up to 89.6 cm this year. There is 70 percent chance of normal rainfall in the coming July month, 20 percent chance of above normal rainfall and 10 percent chance of below normal rainfall. Also, India is likely to receive more rainfall in this season.

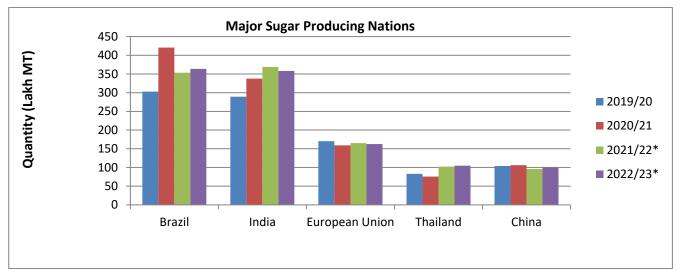
Sugarcane sowing 2022-23 season

Major Market Highlights:

According to Unica, Brazil's Center South region sugarcane crushing in the first half of July'22 has reached 46.34 million tonnes higher as compared to the previous season by 0.48 percent. Sugar production has reached 2.97 million tonnes in the first half of July 2022.

According to the Pakistan Sugar Mills Association, around 1.2 million tonnes of excess sugar is available at the beginning of the next sugarcane crushing season. During the previous 2021-22 season sugar mills had produced 2 million tonnes of surplus sugar. As per the sources, it is expected that because of good weather conditions in this season the sugarcane crop is expected to increase by 10 percent in the 2022-23 season.

Sugar beet production in Russia is likely to increase by 5 % against the previous season. The Sugar refineries have started processing sugar beet for this season. In the previous season Russia has produced around 41.2 million tonnes of sugar beet. An increase in sugar beet production would help the country to meet the domestic demand as well as the demand of the neighboring countries.

According to the International Sugar Organization, the global sugar production in the 2022-23 season is estimated at 177.372 million tonne, while consumption is projected to reach 174.604 million tonne. This

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indicates a surplus of 2.768 million tonne of sugar from October 2022. Global ethanol production in 2022 has been projected to reach 110.3 billion liters (+5.1 billion from 2021), consumption has been projected to reach 106.3 billion liters (+4.5 billion from 2021). Increased sugar production and consumption are expected in the US, Brazil and India in the 2022-23 season.

International Sugar Prices

The Raw Sugar futures ICE traded higher by 2 percent at Rs. 3147 per Quintal. The LIFE Sugar traded higher at Rs. 3848 per Quintal as compared to the previous season of Rs. 3446 per Quintal.

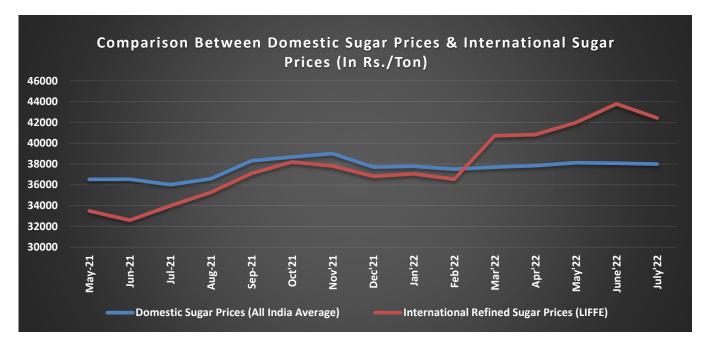


ICE (Raw Sugar Exchange) Future Market Scenario (Oct'22 Contract) Technical Commentary:

Domestic sugar prices stood slightly lower during July'2022. Domestic prices stood at Rs. 38,000 per tonne in July'22 compared to Rs. 38,081 per tonne in June'2022. The average international sugar prices have decreased around 3 percent in July'2022 to Rs.42434 per tonnes from Rs. 43781 per tonnes in June 2022. Mainly due to decreased demand from international market particularly from China, Indonesia and European Union. Also, domestic prices have fallen with the arrival of monsoon. For the coming August month we expect domestic prices to further increase due to improved festive demand.
