Price Outlook:

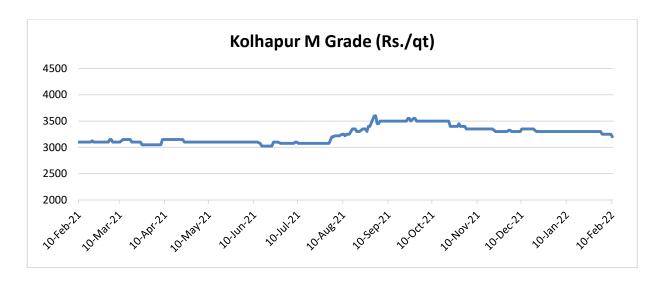
Prices in the major markets across India showed a mixed trend last week. The average sugar prices have slightly decreased to Rs. 3400/q this week from Rs.3422/q last week in Delhi market. The prices in Maharashtra have decreased this week and were at Rs.3263/q.

Price Projection for the Next week

As per the Agriwatch estimates, spot sugar prices (M grade) in the benchmark Kolhapur market are likely to slightly decrease in next week between Rs.3150 -3250 per quintal.

Domestic Sugar Market Summary

Sugarcane crushing season in India is at its peak with all the major sugar mills continuing cane crushing operations. Maharashtra is leading in sugar production in India with around 197 sugar mills in operation in the state. Average prices for Sugar 'M' grade in key Kolhapur market have slightly decreased and were at Rs.3200 per quintal around Rs.50 down from previous week.



Domestic Market Highlights

Recent Updates:

- According to the Maharashtra Sugar Commissioner, sugar mills in Maharashtra have produced 798.79 lakh
 quintals of sugar till 08th February 2022 by crushing 788.54 lakh tonne of sugarcane. Maharashtra is leading
 in sugar production in India with around 197 sugar mills in operation in the state. Kolhapur division is leading
 in the state in terms of sugar recovery with 11.56 percent whereas for the entire state, Maharashtra sugar
 recovery rate has reached 10.13 percent.
- About 83 sugar mills in Maharashtra have cleared 100 percent of the cane payment, around 47 sugar mills have paid 80-90 percent payment, and 33 mills have cleared 60- 70 percent dues while 28 mills have paid 50 percent cane dues for the ongoing crushing season.

Previous Updates

- The food ministry has allocated 20 LMT monthly sugar quota for February 2022 to 563 sugar mills which is 3 LMT higher than the quota released during the previous season for February 2021. In January 2022, the government has fixed 21.5 LMT monthly sugar quota for domestic scale.
- According to the Maharashtra Sugar Commissioner, sugar mills in Maharashtra have produced 792.02 lakh
 quintals of sugar till 31st January 2022 by crushing 724.91 lakh tonne of sugarcane. Kolhapur division is
 leading in the state in terms of sugar recovery with 11.46 percent whereas for the entire state, Maharashtra
 sugar recovery rate has reached 10.06 percent.
- According to Second Advance Estimates of ISMA, India's sugar production is expected to be 314.50 lakh tonne during 2021-22 season. This is after considering an estimated diversion of sugarcane juice /syrup or B-heavy molasses at sugar equivalent of 34 lakh tonne for production of ethanol. Opening stock is estimated at 82 lakh tonne as on 01st October 2021. Further, domestic consumption is expected to be 270 lakh tonne and exports around 60 lakh tonne during 2021-22 season. The closing stock as on 30th September 2022 is expected to be lower by over 15 lakh tonne at around 66.50 lakh tonne.
- The report also states that other States like Tamil Nadu, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh & Telangana, Bihar, Punjab, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Uttarakhand are collectively expected to produce about 50.60 lakh tonne of sugar, which is more or less similar to the production in 2020-21 Sugar season. These States are collectively estimated to account for

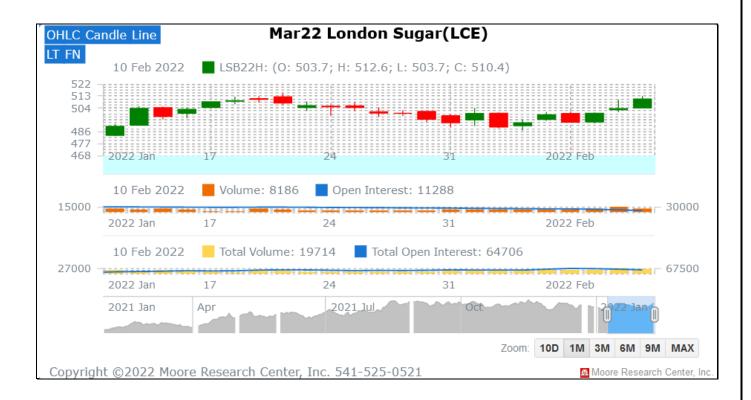
about 2.81 lakh tonne of sugar equivalent diversion into production of ethanol. The adjoining table shows the top three state-wise break-up of sugar production estimation for 2021-22 and its comparison with the previous year.

International Market Highlights

Previous Updates

- The Sugar Regulatory Administration (SRA) has stated that Philippines will import 200,000 metric tonnes of sugar in the 2021-22 season to keep a check the rising domestic prices. The sugar prices in the country are rising despite stable local production. The Sugar Regulatory Administration (SRA) plans to import 100,000 metric tonnes of standard grade refined sugar while the 100,000 MT would be refined sugar of "bottlers' grade" for the beverage industry.
- According to SRA the damage caused due to Typhoon "Odette" (international name: Rai) to the sugarcane
 crops grown in Negros, Panay and Eastern Visayas has led to the increase in wholesale and retail prices of
 raw and refined sugar. The sugarcane as well as sugar stocks in warehouses and facilities at sugar mills and
 refineries were also damaged due to the Typhoon.
- The Sugar millers from Nepal have increased the factory price of sugar from Rs 72-76 (Nepalese Rupee) per kg to Rs 82-90 per kg. The consumers will have to now pay up to Rs 100 for one kg of sugar. The recent increase in the minimum support price of sugarcane by the government by Rs 45.67 per quintal taking it to Rs 590 per quintal this season, is the reason behind the hike in sugar prices..
- The Ministry of Agriculture of Kyrgyzstan has extended the ban on sugar export till 01st August 2022. At the end of 2021, mass sugar exports resumed in Kyrgystan. Due to this, a decrease in the stock led to hike in domestic prices, therefore the government decided on the ban for the next six months starting from 01st February to 01st August, 2022. Earlier in the previous season the cabinet has passed a resolution setting a temporary ban on the export of sugar and vegetable oil due to rise in prices for six months.
- Sugar production in Philippines has increased by 4.63 percent in 2022 season. The Sugar Regulatory Authority has stated that as of 02nd January, 2022, Philippines has produced 657,352 metric tons (MT) of raw sugar as compared to 628,286 MT during the same period last year. The current supply of raw sugar in Philippines has increased by 3.15 percent to 910,870 MT as compared to 883,046 MT last year. As per Sugar Regulatory Authority, the demand for raw sugar has increased by 10 percent to 559,472 MT. It is expected that the sugar output will reach 2.0997 million MT this season.
- Sugar Output in China is expected to be lower by 300,000 tonnes at 10 million tonnes in 2021-22 season which is 6.3 percent less than the previous season. Due to recent frosts in Guangxi sugarcane cultivation in China was affected. As a result, Sugar imports by China are expected to increase from 4.5 million to 5.5 million tonnes.

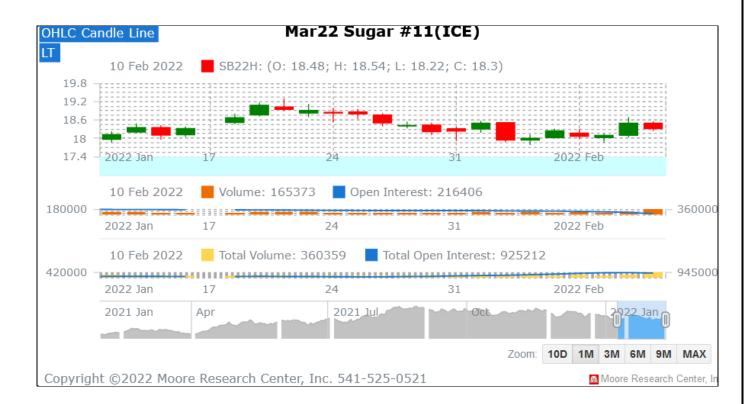
