Price Outlook:


Prices in the major markets across India showed a mixed trend last week. The average sugar prices have eased marginally to Rs. 3430/qtl this week from Rs.3436/qtl last week in Delhi market. The prices in Maharashtra were stable at Rs.3250/qtl. Agriwatch expects prices to remain stable in the coming week. Demand for sugar is expected to increase with the coming of the summer season may remain supportive for prices.

Price Projection for the Next week

As per the Agriwatch estimates, spot Sugar prices (M grade) in the benchmark Kolhapur market is likely to increase slightly in next week between Rs.3250 -3300 per quintal.

Domestic Sugar Market Summary

Out of 516 sugar mills which had started crushing in 2021-22 Sugar Season, 81 sugar mills had stopped their crushing operations till 15th March 2022 in India. Last year, 503 sugar mills had operated, out of which 172 had stopped crushing on the corresponding date last year. Sugarcane crushing season in Maharashtra is in the final crushing phase. Average prices for Sugar 'M' grade in key Kolhapur market traded steady at Rs.3250 per quintal last week.



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Domestic Market Highlights

Recent Updates:

Around 435 sugar mills are currently in the cane crushing operation in India. Sugar mills have produced around 283.26 lakh tonnes of sugar till 15th March '2022 as against 259.37 lakh tonnes produced same period last year. The States of Andhra Pradesh & Telangana, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana and Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Odisha have collectively produced 26.43 lakh tonnes of sugar till15th March, 2022. wise breakup of sugar production for major states till 28th February 2022 and its comparison with the previous year.

Previous Updates

- According to the Indian Sugar Mills Association, around 64-65 lakh tonnes of Sugar export have been contracted as of 15th March'22. Out of which, about 47 lakh tonnes of sugar have been physically exported from India up to 28th February, 2022, as compared to about 17.75 lakh tonnes exported last year during the corresponding period. Further, considering the pipeline, it is expected that physical exports by the end of this month may be around 55 56 lakh tonnes. Accordingly, it is estimated that in the current season, Indian sugar industry should be able to export 75 lakh tonnes.
- Sugar mills in Maharashtra have started closing their cane crushing operations as the season is nearing to an end. According to the Maharashtra Sugar Commissioner, Sugar mills in Maharashtra have produced 108.17 lakh tonnesof sugar till 14th March 2022 by crushing 1046.12 lakh tonnes of sugarcane. Maharashtra sugar recovery rate has reached 10.34 percent higher from previous week of 10.32 percent.
- Indian Sugar Mills Association has revised its sugar production estimate for 2021-22 Sugar Season for Maharashtra as 126 lakh tonnes (after diversion into ethanol), against 117 lakh tonnes estimated in its 2nd advance estimates. Similarly, Karnataka is now expected to produce 55 lakh tonnes (after diversion into ethanol), as against 45.21 lakh tonnes estimated earlier. However, not much change is expected in other States including U.P., and they are expected to produce 152 lakh tonnes of sugar (after diversion into ethanol). All India sugar production in 2021-22 season is therefore expected as 333 lakh tonnes, considering diversion of 34 lakh tonnes of sugar equivalent into ethanol. Agriwatch has estimated 320 lakh tonnes of sugar production for the 2021-22 season Higher from the previous season production of 309 lakh tonnes.

International Market Highlights

Previous Updates

- The Russian government has announced extending the ban on the export of sugar till the August end. As a
 result, Central Asian countries may face a sugar shortage. The ban on sugar export would affect Kazakhstan
 the most as the country's sugar output has been affected due to drought. The sugar output in the country has
 been lowered this season and the country imports 2/3 of the sugar to meet the domestic need. Half of the
 imported sugar comes from Russia. It also procures sugar from Belarus which is also facing sanctions due to
 the Russia-Ukraine crisis. The officials have stated that the country has sugar stocks that can last for only
 three months.
- Algeria government has banned the export of sugar as well as some other items like veg. oil, pasta, semolina, and wheat derivatives. The government has taken steps following the crisis looming due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Apart from Algeria, few more countries have taken steps to stock food items.
- Bangladesh government has decided to continue the import of raw sugar with lower import duty for two and half months. At present, there is a 20% tariff benefit on the import of sugar and it would be extended till May 15 to maintain stable rates in the domestic market ahead of the holy month of Ramadan. As per the order, the reduced tariff facility will be effective from March. Earlier the government had reduced import duty from 30% to 20% which ended on February 28.
- Brazil Centre-south region is likely to crush 562 million tonnes of sugarcane in 2022-23 season. The crop is
 recovering this year from the lower output of 525 million tonnes last year due to drought and frost. The crop is
 in a critical development stage at present and the region is facing scant or no rains in the last few weeks. The
 sugarcane crop this season is likely to remain below the 605.5 million tonnes recorded in 2020-21 season
 despite recovering from the previous cycle.
- International Sugar Organization has lowered the global sugar deficit for the 2021-22 season to 1.93 million tonnes from an earlier projection of 2.55 million tonnes. The reduction in sugar consumption from 173.03 million tonnes to 172.44 million tonnes was the primary reason for lowering the global deficit. Earlier the global sugar output was projected to increase from 170.47 million tonnes to 170.51 million tonnes.
