Price Outlook:

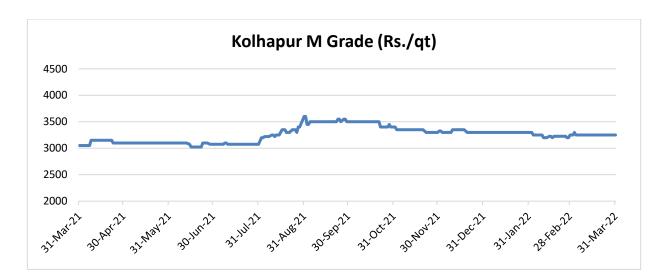
Prices in the major markets across India showed a mixed trend last week. The average sugar prices have increased marginally to Rs. 3395/qtl this week from Rs.3371/qtl last week in Delhi market. The prices in Maharashtra were stable at Rs.3250/qtl. Agriwatch expects prices to remain stable in the coming week. Demand for sugar is expected to increase with the coming of the summer season may remain supportive for prices.

Price Projection for the Next week

Agriwatch expects that spot Sugar prices (M grade) in the benchmark Kolhapur market is likely to increase slightly in next week between Rs.3250 -3300 per quintal.

Domestic Sugar Market Summary

Sugarcane crushing season is in the final crushing phase across India. Average prices for Sugar 'M' grade in key Kolhapur market traded steady at Rs.3250 per quintal last week.



Domestic Market Highlights

Recent Updates:

The food ministry has allocated 22 lakh tonnes of monthly sugar sales quota for April 2022 which is the same quantity allocated in the last season. In the previous month, the food ministry has allocated 21.5 lakh tonnes of sugar sales quota.

Previous Updates

- According to the Sugar Commissionerate Maharashtra, total of 197 sugar mills participated in the crushing operation including 98 cooperative mills and 99 private mills. Out of that, till 27th March, 2022, a total of 25 sugar mills have stopped operations including 19 from the Kolhapur division, one each from Aurangabad and Nagpur, and 4 from Solapur division. Sugar mills in Maharashtra have produced 11.62 lakh tonnes sugar by crushing 1120.04 lakh tonnes sugarcane with a recovery of 10.38 percent slightly higher from the previous week of 10.36 percent till 27th March, 2022.
- Sudden rainfall accompanied by a whirlwind has damaged 10 acres of sugarcane crops grown near Thalavadi in Erode district of Tamil Nadu on 27th March 2022. The sudden rain and whirlwind damaged all the standing sugarcane crops that were about to be harvested for crushing. The areas of Mallankuzhi, Thalavadi, Tamilpuram, and surrounding villages were hit by the heavy rain. According to the market sources, the Agriculture Department officials has visited the fields on 28th March 2022 and have assured the farmers that the government would take the necessary step to provide assistance.
- As per Agriwatch market sources no major crop loss would be there as only few fields in some villages have been majorly affected because of heavy winds. Although, heavy rains will lead to a little delay in harvesting of the crop. The area under sugarcane was higher in Tamil Nadu during 2021-22 season at 1.71 lakh hectares as compared to 1.50 lakh hectares in 2020-21 season. As a result of increase in area and better yield in the ongoing season, the production has increased. The total production till 15th March 2022 in Tamil Nadu was 5.75 lakh tonnes as compared to 4.16 lakh tonnes.
- Around 435 sugar mills are currently in the cane crushing operation in India. Sugar mills have produced around

283.26 lakh tonnes of sugar till 15th March '2022 as against 259.37 lakh tonnes produced same period last year. The States of Andhra Pradesh & Telangana, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana and Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Odisha have collectively produced 26.43 lakh tonnes of sugar till15th March, 2022. The adjoining table shows the state-wise breakup of sugar

production for major states till 28th February 2022 and its comparison with the previous year.

- Uttar Pradesh is likely to witness lower sugar production in the current 2021-22 season as compared to the previous season. The diversion of sugar to ethanol production and the rising disease and pest infestation are the major reasons for the lower sugar output. Indian Sugar Mills Association has earlier estimated sugar production in UP to be 102 lakh tonnes as against 110.59 lakh tonnes in last year. Sugar mills have produced 82.28 lakh tonnes of sugar by crushing 817.01 lakh tonnes of sugarcane till 23rd March 22.
- Agriwatch expects sugar exports to reach 80 lakh tonnes during the 2021-22 season. With crude prices seeing
 a sharp increase in recent weeks due to the Ukraine-Russia conflict, the freight costs have increased. As a
 result, importers in the Middle East, East Africa and South-East Asia are preferring the Indian sugar over
 Brazilian supplies. As per Agriwatch market sources, around 71 lakh tonnes of sugar exports contracts have
 been signed so far in the 2021-22 season.

International Market Highlights

Previous Updates

- According to the Unica, Sugarcane crushing in Brazil is down by 91 per cent in early March as compared to the same period last year. The mills in the first half of March have crushed only 142,000 tonnes of sugarcane as the companies are waiting for the crop to fully develop and they have enough stocks of sugar and ethanol. The mills are primarily focused on ethanol production in the first half of March. Traditionally mills start crushing in March though the official crushing season starts in April. The recent frost and severe drought last year have hampered the development of the crop for the 2022 season, and they are waiting for the growth of the crop to start harvesting. Earlier, Brazil has faced a severe drought in 2021 that led to the slower development of the sugarcane crop in the 2022 season.
- The sugar production in Pakistan likely to increase by 2 million tonnes from last year to 7.5 million tonnes. As a
 result, Pakistan is back to sugar surplus country from deficit. Ex-mill sugar prices are now around Rs 81/kg
 substantially lower from last year.
- According to the Thai Sugar Millers Corporation, the sugar output in Thailand is likely to reach 10 million tonnes by 31st March 22. After two years of low output, sugar production in Thailand is likely to increase in the current season over good yield following favorable weather. The sugar mills have produced 9.6 million tonnes of sugar by crushing 87.75 million tonnes of cane so far. The sugar output in the last season was 66.7 million tonnes and in this season it is expected to rise by 35% to 90 million tonnes.
- The Russian government has informed that it has sufficient sugar to meet the domestic demand and warned consumers against panic-buying after the country was hit with sanctions from the West due to its military invasion in Ukraine. According to the Russian government, the country has enough sugar to cater to the domestic demand and there is no need for panic-buying the commodity as this would destabilize the production network in the country. Some regions in the country had reported a shortage of sugar due to panic-buying and the government has already banned the export of sugar until 31st August 2022 and set a duty-free quota for imports of 300,000 tonnes of sugar and raw sugar, hoping to ease domestic food inflation.
