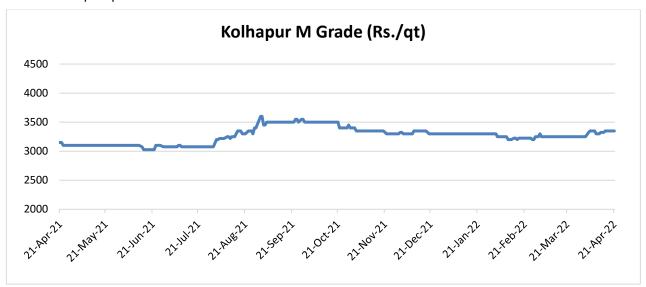
#### **Price Outlook:**

The average sugar prices have increased marginally to Rs. 3,443 per quintal during the past week from Rs.3,396 per quintal in Delhi market. Prices in Maharashtra have also increased and were at Rs.3346 per quintal. Agriwatch expects prices to remain firm in the coming week as rising temperature would lead to higher demand from beverage industry.

#### **Price Projection for the Next week**

Agriwatch expects that spot Sugar prices (M grade) in the benchmark Kolhapur market is likely to remain stable in next week between Rs.3325 -3350 per quintal. Average prices for Sugar 'M' grade in key Kolhapur market was stable at Rs.3350 per quintal last week.



#### **Domestic Market Highlights**

#### Recent Updates:

According to the Ministry of consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution, Sugar production in the 2021-22 season is expected to be higher by 13 percent in the current season as compared to the previous season. As per the revised estimates, production of sugar for the 2021-22 season is estimated to be about 350 Lakh Metric Tonne (LMT) (after discounting diversion of 35 LMT of sugar to ethanol) against estimated domestic consumption of about 278 LMT.

Sugarcane crushing season is in the final crushing phase across India. Around 305 sugar mills are currently operating in India. Sugar mills have produced around 329.91 lakh tonne of sugar till 15th April'2022 as against 291.82 lakh tonne produced same period last year. The States of Andhra Pradesh & Telangana, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Haryana and Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Odisha have collectively produced 31.35 lakh tonne of sugar till 15th April, 2022. The above table shows the state-wise breakup of sugar production for major States till 15th April 2022 and its comparison with the previous year. Out of the above states, Bihar, Odisha and Rajasthan have closed their crushing operations for the current season. Among other states, 13 sugar mills in Punjab, 1 sugar mill in Haryana, 2 sugar mills in Uttarakhand, 12 sugar mills in M.P, 2 sugar mills in Chhattisgarh, 2 sugar mills in A.P. and 6 sugar mills in Telangana have closed their operations.

AgriWatch expects sugar exports to reach 90 lakh tonne during the 2021-22 season. According to Indian Sugar Mills Association, around 80 lakh tonne of sugar exports contracts have already been signed so far in the 2021-22 season. Out of which, physical exports by the end of March 2022 are expected to be around 57.17 lakh tonne as compared to 31.85 lakh tonnes exported in the last sugar season during the same period. As per the market sources, about 7-8 lakh tonnes of sugar is in pipeline for export in April 2022. The major export destination during the 2021-22 sugar season were Indonesia and Bangladesh. In the previous season, India had exported 48 per cent of sugar to Indonesia and Afghanistan during the same period.

### **International Market Highlights**

#### **Previous Updates**

• As per the market sources, Sugar and ethanol production in the center south region of Brazil is likely to increase the coming 2022-23 season. The sugarcane production may increase by 6.7 percent to 558 million tonnes in the 2022-23 season due to improved recovery of the fields from the drought last year. As a result, sugar production is expected to increase to 33.5 million tonnes as compared to 32.1 million tonnes in the 2021-22 season. Also, Ethanol production is expected to reach at 30.2 billion litres as against 27.5 billion litres in the previous season.



 According to Sugar Regulatory Administration (SRA), Philippines plans to import 250,000 MT of refined sugar including 1,50,000 of premium grade and 100,000 MT of raw sugar. The demand for sugar is increasing in the domestic market.

- As depicted in the above chart, there is a trendline breakdown, and it has broken 23% and 38% Fibonacci retracement level, next support is 50% Fibonacci retracement level.
- Decrease in open interest indicates prices went down on aggressive short selling and long liquidation.
- Market participants are recommended to wait for 50% retracement support level.

# ICE (Raw Sugar Exchange) Future Market Scenario (May'22 Contract) Technical Commentary:

- ICE raw sugar futures were moving in the channel, upper channel was acting as resistance and lower channel as support but there is channel breakdown on short selling and long liquidation.
- Market has broken 38% and 50% Fibonacci retracement level next support is 61% Fibonacci retracement level.
- Market participant are recommended to wait for buying near 61% Fibonacci retracement level.
