

News Highlights

- According to the Tea Board, production of tea in India increased by 3.3 percent in June to 141.32 million kgs compared to the same period previous year. This was mainly due to plucking gaining momentum in the southern states of Tamil Nadu and Kerala. India is the second largest tea producer and exports CTC grade tea to Egypt, Pakistan, UK and orthodox grade to Iran, Iraq and Russia.
- At Sale No: 31 of Coonoor Tea Auction, prices remained around Rs.66/kg same as last week and this is the lowest price of the year till date. Around 27 percent of the quantity offered on sale remained unsold in the market amounting to Rs. 3.46 crores (5.18 lakh kgs. of tea). Prices ranged between Rs.43-48/kg for plain leaf grades and Rs.100-160/kg for brighter liquoring sorts. The prices ranged between Rs.45-49/kg for plain dusts and Rs.120-175/kg for brighter liquoring dusts.
- According to officials of Darjeeling Tea Association, Nepalese tea is entering India through porous border. It is mandatory for tea imports from Nepal to be registered. However retailers feel that it is difficult to differentiate between Nepal tea and Darjeeling tea. The cost of Darjeeling tea is around Rs.340/kg and Nepal tea is around Rs.100/kg less. Darjeeling produces annually 8.5 -9.0 million kgs tea annually in its 87 estates.
- In the current calendar year, India is leading global shortage of black tea production. In the first half of the calendar year, the global black tea production has declined to 871.91 million kgs. compared to 891.69 million kgs. during the same period previous year. Of this India accounts for a shortage of 17.83 million kgs. following decline in North Indian production by 22.27 million kgs.
- According to tea marketers, output of tea increased by 4.6 percent to 31.9 million kgs compared to 30.5 million kgs in 2013. The marginal increase in production was noticed in the tea growing regions of Rift Valley following right rainfall condition.
- The health benefits of green tea have pushed up the sales in the urban areas of Nepal. According to trade sources, the consumption of green tea is growing 10-15 percent annually. Green tea is being publicized for healthier skin, building a stronger immune system, assisting hair growth, weight loss and is also effective against diseases like high blood pressure, diabetes and cancer.

Prices declined during the week amid higher offerings and lack of demand. In the CTC category, there was good demand for Best variety and less for other varieties. Tata Global and Western India buyers were active. There was fairy enquiry from exporters and Hindustan Unilever Limited. The local buyers purchased Selective Dooars. In the orthodox category there was fair demand. Well made and Tippy Sorts were steady to lower. There was some demand from exporters and local buyers bought secondary brokens. The rain flush tea arriving in the market is not up to the mark. Prices are likely to be range –bound to weak in the near –term.

Prices noticed mixed tone at Cochin tea auction. Prices of dust category declined amid higher offerings and lack of good quality tea. Prices of orthodox category increased amid lower offerings and some demand for good quality leaf. More than 70% of the quantity offered was sold in the market. Tata Global, AVT, Kerala Civil Supplies are the main buyers. In the CTC dust category, loose tea traders and upcountry buyers remained subdued in the market. 



Prices continued positive tone during the week. Quantity offered on sale increased during the week except for orthodox leaf variety. Demand in the local and export market lent some support to the market. Heavy rains in the last few days might affect the quality of tea in the near –term. Volumes have been increasing at the auction during the last few weeks. Prices are likely to be range –bound to weak in the near –term.





The above graph shows production comparison region wise during the last two years and in the month of May in comparison with previous year. In the year 2014 (Apr –Mar), production increased by 6.5% to 1208.78 million kgs mainly on account of increase in production in Assam. In the current year in the month of May, production of tea in India declined by 11.8% to 91.41 million kgs. in comparison with the same period last year following lack of suitable temperature and rainfall in north India.





The above graph shows the price comparison of All Tea at All India in 2013 and 2014. During the early part of the year (2014) in March and April, prices remained lower compared to previous year amid lack of export inquiry in the market and also quality is not up to the mark at this time of the year. Currently the average prices of all tea are slightly higher compared to previous year amid demand in the market for good quality tea. This year there is not much good demand for rain flush tea in the domestic and global market. Prices have recovered slightly during the week.


Tea – Technical Outlook

Technical Commentary:

Tea prices continued weak tone during the period. Prices are holding within the uptrend channel and are likely to recover in the coming days. Prices are holding below 9 –Day and 21 –Day EMA supporting some weakness in the coming days. Stochastic oscillator is declining in the neutral region supporting some weakness in the near –term. Buyers can look for better levels in the coming days.

The tea prices are likely to decline in the coming days. Buyers can purchase around 170-175 levels with the target of 200 levels.

In this week's auction, 7.36 million kgs of tea was offered for sale compared to 7.7 million kgs of tea during the previous week. There was good demand in the market around current levels. Better western BOP's/BOPF's noticed improved demand during the week. High Grown and Mid Grown CTC's noticed mixed tone with much quantity remaining unsold amid lack of bids and Low Grown CTC's were dearer during the week. There was good demand for liquoring leafy teas.

In the leaf category, Better PEK/PEK1's were mostly firm and a few bolder types noticed steady tone. In the Tippy catalogues, better made FBOP declined and FF1's continued steady tone during the week. The below best and plainer variety noticed easy tone during the week amid lack of demand. There was active buying from Russia and the tea bag sector. There was not much demand from Ukraine and Syria. Export demand from Turkey, Iraq, Libya, and Saudi Arabia lent some support to the market.

During the week fair demand noticed for 7,163,335 kilos of tea on offer following quality. Around 16.33% of the quantity offered on sale remained unsold. Brighter DUST1s were USC3 to USC20 easier with mediums USC3 to USC20 lower and prices of lower mediums declined USC2 to USC6 during the week. Prices of Brighter BP1's increased USC12 to USC26, prices of mediums were USC16 to USC20 lower and prices of lower mediums were up to USC24 higher. Other varieties like Brighter Pdusts, Lower Medium PF1's noticed firm tone amid good demand during the week.

In the secondary catalogues, BPs noticed firm tone and PF's were dearer. Well sorted clean coloury Fannings and Dusts noticed firm tone. Other Fannings were steady and BMF's noticed good demand. There was good buying interest from Kazakhstan, CIS countries, Egyptian packers, Yemen and other middle –East countries. There was less activity from Afghanistan and Bazaar. Demand remained subdued from Russia. Somalia purchased around lower levels in the market during the week.

Market offerings increased to 11,200 paper sacks from 7,100 paper sacks. There was good demand in the market around current levels. Average price increased to USDcts 163.65 instead of USDcts 160.90 during last week's auction. Average price of Orthodox variety increased to USDcts 163.93 and average price of CTC declined to USDcts 162.55. Secondary variety noticed easy tone and Fannings were steady. Quantity sold declined to 76.04% during the period compared to 86.58% during last auction.

Tea prices at Bangladesh tea auction declined during the week amid highest offering of the season till date. Strong demand for quality leaf limited losses. The average price of tea during this week's auction was around USD 2.50/kg. More than 2.00 million kgs of tea was offered for sale and nearly 28 percent remained unsold.

There was fair demand from blenders and some buying interest was noticed from loose tea buyers. There was improved demand in the market and prices declined amid higher offerings owing to Eid holidays during the previous weeks. 31,946 packages and 512 packages CTC Leaf of previous season noticed fair demand. 5,889 packages and 20 packages of CTC Dust of previous season noticed fair demand around lower levels. In CTC Dust, good liquoring varieties were slightly easy and declined by Tk.5 –Tk.10 in line with quality. Good liquoring Broken varieties noticed good demand and sold at a rate of Tk.192 –Tk.197. Good liquoring varieties in fannings also noticed fair demand and sold at a rate between Tk. 190 -195. Good liquoring Dusts noticed good demand from loose tea buyers.

World tea production has been increasing over the years. With more medicinal value of tea being highlighted, the consumption is set to increase in the coming years. However in the current year till May, production has declined in the major countries except Bangladesh and Malawi. According to Indian Tea Association, consumption of tea is increasing at an annual rate of 3 per cent. In the current financial year in India, production of tea has been affected in the months of April and May in North India following lack of suitable temperature and rainfall in the growing regions.

Overall Outlook and Recommendation:

In the domestic market, prices noticed weak tone in north India and improved slightly in south India. Quantity offered on sale increased during the week and there were much withdrawals in the market. The rain flush tea arriving in the market is not up to the mark. Export demand is sluggish amid lack of availability of good quality tea and higher production in Bangladesh and Srilanka.

In the global market, future offerings are expected to increase in Srilanka and Indonesia. Weather remains favourable in the tea growing regions. It is mostly drier in Srilanka, Indonesia and weather is cool in Kenya and Malawi. Prices are likely to decline in the medium –term and buyers can look for better levels in the coming days.

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
