

News Highlights

- The Indian Tea Association (ITA) is promoting tea as a lifestyle beverage among youngsters. As a part of the program, promotional events will be conducted in many Class A and Class B cities in the next three to four years. In these events, benefits of tea will be highlighted and the various varieties of tea available in the market.
- Average price of tea declined to Rs.63/kg at the auction of Coonoor Tea Trade Association (Sale No. 34) amid lack of demand in the market. There were many withdrawals in the market and around 2.85 crore worth of tea remained unsold in the market. Better Liquoring CTC Leaf and Dust declined by Rs.4-5/kg, better mediums Rs.3-4/kg and plainer varieties declined by Rs.2-3/kg.
- The cumulative turnover at the auctions of Coonoor Tea Trade Association declined by 23.26 per cent compared to the same period previous year. Till July there has been 30 auctions and 3.26 crore kg was sold during the period compared to 3.43 crore kg during the previous year. The overall turnover declined to 252.94 crore from 329.62 crore during the same period in 2013.
- According to the industry sources at Tata Global Beverages Ltd. (TGBL) formerly known as Tata Tea, it is likely to venture into functional teas as per the needs of the customers for its future growth.
- Assam White Tea is likely to enter the global market, which is considered to be the monopoly of the Chinese. This tea is made from the unopened buds and young leaves of the tea plant. It is a specialty tea and the price ranges between Rs. 8000 -12000 per kg. It is produced mainly for export. This Assam White Tea named as 'Rujani' got good response within and outside the country at a recently concluded Hong Kong International Food Fair.
- Output of tea in Srilanka increased by 4.9% to 201.5 million kgs during January –July 2014 compared to the same period previous year.

Prices noticed weak tone during the period. Quantity offered on sale declined during the week compared to previous week except in the Dust category. In the Dust category there was fair demand. Select Best/Good Sorts noticed better demand and noticed steady tone. Other plainer varieties and Cachars declined with quality. There was active buying from Western India Buyers and Tata Global. Hindustan Unilever and Exporters lent some support to the market. Local buyers operated mainly on Dooars. In the Orthodox category, Clean Well Made Sorts and Select Tippy Sorts noticed steady to firm tone in accordance with quality. There was selective enquiry for Bolder Whole Leaf from North India. Prices are likely to be steady to weak in the coming days.






The above graph shows production comparison region wise during the last two years and in the month of May in comparison with previous year. In the year 2014 (Apr –Mar), production increased by 6.5% to 1208.78 million kgs mainly on account of increase in production in Assam. In the current year in the month of May, production of tea in India declined by 11.8% to 91.41 million kgs. in comparison with the same period last year following lack of suitable temperature and rainfall in north India.

The above graph shows the price comparison of All Tea at All India in 2013 and 2014. During the early part of the year (2014) in March and April, prices remained higher compared to previous year amid export inquiry in the market and quality is not up to the mark at this time of the year. Currently the average prices of all tea are slightly higher compared to previous year amid lack of availability of good quality tea in the market. This year there is not much good demand for rain flush tea in the domestic and global market. Prices have increased slightly during the week.


Tea – Technical Outlook

Technical Commentary:

Tea prices declined during the week and prices are below the uptrend channel as seen in the weekly chart. Prices are likely to move towards the support level of 155 as seen in the chart. MACD is declining in the positive territory supporting weak tone of the market. RSI is declining in the neutral zone supporting weakness in the coming days. Buyers are advised to wait for better levels in the coming days.

The tea prices are likely to decline in the coming days. Buyers can purchase around 160 levels for their near –term requirement.

In this week's auction, 7.40 million kgs of tea was offered for sale compared to 7.49 million kgs of tea during the previous week. There was good demand for Select Best teas during the week. Better western BOP's/BOPF's noticed steady tone during the week. High Grown and Mid Grown CTC's noticed weak tone and Low Grown CTC's eased during the week. There was good demand for liquoring leafy teas.

In the leaf category, Better PEK/PEK1's noticed mixed tone and a few bolder types noticed easy tone. In the Tippy catalogues, better made FBOP noticed firm tone and FF1's continued steady tone during the week. The below best and plainer variety noticed weak tone during the week amid lack of demand around current levels. There was active buying from Russia. There was not much demand from Syria, Iraq, Libya Saudi. Export demand from Ukraine remained subdued.

During the week improved demand noticed for 8,529,680 kilos of tea on offer following quality. Around 21.35% of the quantity offered on sale remained unsold. Brighter DUST1s declined by USC6 to USC16 with mediums USC2 to USC20 lower and prices of lower mediums were steady to USC5 lower during the week. Prices of Brighter BP1's were USC2 to USC28 lower, prices of mediums declined up to USC20 and prices of lower mediums were firm to USC20 lower. Other varieties like Brighter Pdusts, Lower Medium PF1's noticed steady to easy tone amid lack of inquiry during the week.

In the secondary catalogues, BPs noticed firm tone and PF's were steady. Well sorted clean coloury Fannings noticed steady tone and Dusts declined during the week. Other Fannings were lower and BMF's noticed good demand around lower levels. There was good buying interest from Afghanistan and Pakistan Packers. Egyptian packers were active around lower levels. There was less activity from Kazakhstan, other CIS countries, Bazaar and Russia. Demand remained subdued from Iran. Somalia purchased around current levels in the market during the week.

Average price increased to USDcts 166.59 instead of USDcts 166.00 during last week's auction. Average price of Orthodox variety increased to USDcts 166.28 and average price of CTC increased to USDcts 168.31. Secondary variety and Fannings noticed easy tone. Quantity sold increased to 88.09% during the period compared to 76.38% during last auction.

Tea prices at Bangladesh tea auction increased during the week amid good demand for quality leaf amid ample supplies. The average price of tea during this week's auction was around USD 2.40/kg. Around 2.21 million kgs of tea was offered for sale and nearly 22 percent remained unsold.

There was good demand for quality tea from local buyers and sales increased during the week. There was active buying from blenders and loose tea buyers were selective. 33,683 packages and 311 packages CTC Leaf of previous season noticed improved demand. 6,328 packages and 48 packages of CTC Dust of previous season noticed good demand around lower levels. In CTC Dust, good liquoring varieties were dearer and declined up Tk.5/kg in line with quality. Good liquoring Broken varieties noticed good demand and sold at a rate of Tk.192 –Tk.196. Good liquoring varieties in fannings also noticed fair demand. Good liquoring Dusts noticed weak tone and sold between Tk.185 –Tk.197.

World tea production has been increasing over the years. With more medicinal value of tea being highlighted, the consumption is set to increase in the coming years. However in the current year till May, production has declined in the major countries except Bangladesh and Malawi. According to Indian Tea Association, consumption of tea is increasing at an annual rate of 3 per cent. In the current financial year in India, production of tea has been affected in the months of April and May in North India following lack of suitable temperature and rainfall in the growing regions.

Overall Outlook and Recommendation:

In the domestic market, prices noticed mostly weak tone during the week except at Siliguri tea auction. Lack of availability of good quality tea weighed on prices. Heavy rains in the tea growing regions of the country have affected the quality of tea. Normal demand is slightly on the lower side at this time of the year. Quality is likely to improve from October onwards. Prices are likely to continue weak tone in the coming days except some recovery could be seen for good quality leaf tea.

In the global market, improved demand was seen for good quality tea. Output of tea in Srilanka increased this year during the period January –July. Global output is expected to be higher in the current weather amid expected favourable weather in the growing regions in the medium –term. Producers are focusing on different varieties of tea to increase their share in the global market. Prices are likely to be range –bound to weak in the coming days.

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
