

News Highlights.

- Farmers in Wayanad say that tea production is not remunerative for them as the production cost has almost doubled in recent times.
- According to sources at Tea Board, it is planning to bring small tea growers under single platform by formulating a single auction platform to facilitate the sale of produce.
- Global Tea output has increased slightly this calendar year in the first nine months following increase in output in Srilanka and Africa. In the first nine months of the calendar year 2014, production of tea has increased by 6.11 mkg to 254.59 mkg.
- The South Indian Tea Industry has asked for relief measures from the government amid falling tea prices.
- According to Tata Global Beverages, the green tea market in India is growing annually at around 50 per cent and is likely to be around Rs.400 crore by the end of 2014 -15.
- Jay Shree Tea and Industries Ltd. has reported around 34 per cent increase in net profit to approximately Rs.39 crores for the quarter ending September 30, 2014.
- The volume of tea to be offered at Sale No. 45 of Coonoor Tea Trade Association due to be held on Thursday and Friday declined by 4.31 lakh kg to 17.37 lakh kgs. compared to last week.
- With the prices of tea leaves declining, small tea growers in the state of West Bengal are having hand-to-mouth survival.
- According to Tea Board officials, Burundi's revenues from its tea exports declined 6
 percent in the first nine months to September from the same period a year ago due to
 higher volumes of the commodity on the global market

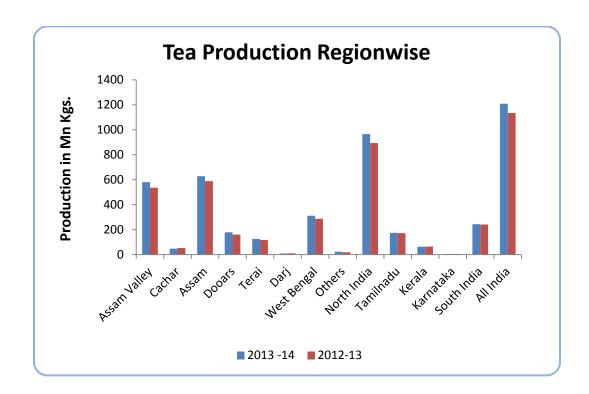

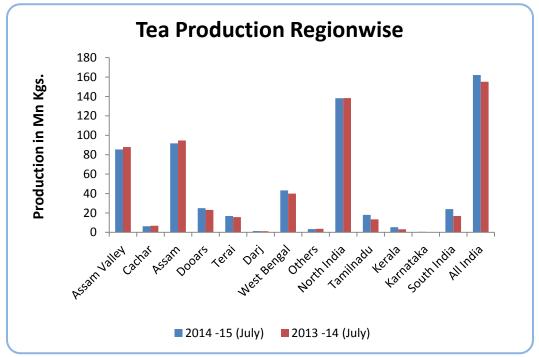

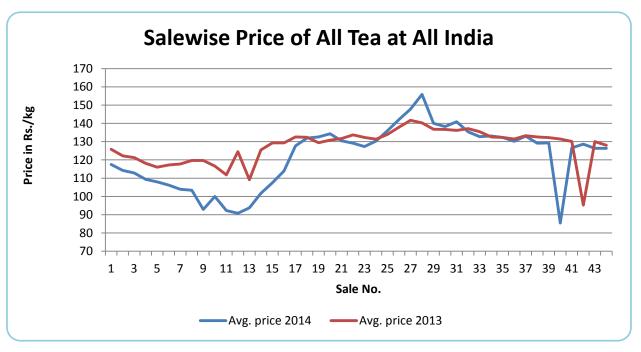
The above graph shows production comparison region wise during the last two years and in the month of May in comparison with previous year. In the year 2014 (Apr –Mar), production increased by 6.5% to 1208.78 million kgs mainly on account of increase in production in Assam. In the current year in the month of May, production of tea in India declined by 11.8% to 91.41 million kgs. in comparison with the same period last year following lack of suitable temperature and rainfall in north India.

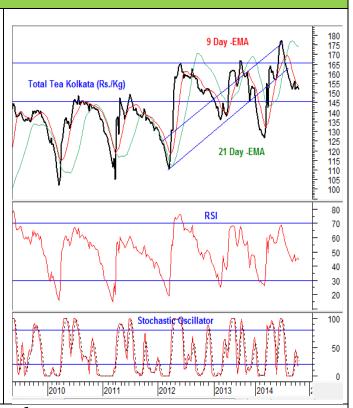


Tea – Technical Outlook

Technical Commentary:

Tea prices declined during the week. Breaking of prices below the support of 150 levels will denote weak tone of the market. Prices are holding below 9-Day and 21 –Day EMA supporting the overall weak tone of the market. Stochastic oscillator is steady in the oversold region supporting some recovery in the near –term.

The tea prices are likely to notice firm tone in the coming days. Buyers can purchase around 155 levels for their near –term requirement.

There was less demand for liquoring leafy teas.

In the leaf category, Better PEK/PEK1's and a few bolder types noticed less demand. In the Tippy catalogues, better made FBOP noticed easy tone and FF1's noticed steady tone during the week. The below best and plainer variety noticed firm tone during the week. There was selective buying from Middle –East and Russia.

Prices of Brighter BP1's noticed easy tone and were USC4 to USC26 lower, prices of mediums were USC2 to USC7 lower and prices of lower mediums were steady to USC14 lower. Other varieties like Brighter Pdusts, Lower Medium PF1's noticed mixed tone during the week.

In the secondary catalogues, BPs noticed easy tone and PF's noticed easy tone during the week. Well sorted clean coloury Fannings noticed firm tone and Dusts prices noticed easy tone during the week. Other Fannings and BMF's noticed weak tone. There was good buying interest from Sudan and Pakistan Packers. There was less demand from Yemen, other Middle –Eastern countries, Kazakhstan, other CIS countries and Russia. UK and Iran was less active during the week.

Tea prices at Bangladesh tea auction declined during the week amid higher supplies in the market. Demand for quality leaf lent some support to the market. The average price of tea during this week's auction was around USD 2.34/kg. Around 2.80 million kgs of tea was offered for sale and nearly 23 percent remained unsold.

There was good demand from blenders and some buying interest from loose tea buyers. 42,587 packages and 256 packages CTC Leaf of previous season noticed good demand. 6,034 packages and 633 packages of teas of old season on offer of CTC Dust noticed good demand around lower levels. In CTC Dust, good liquoring varieties were firm and medium levels noticed easy tone. Good liquoring Broken varieties noticed demand around lower levels. Good liquoring varieties in fannings also noticed withdrawals during the week. Good liquoring Dusts noticed firm tone during the week.
