

#### **News Highlights.**

- According to FAO, the Maximum Residue Level standards had a much larger effect on trade than import tariffs and cost –related disruption in supply might lead to increase in prices. MRL standards vary across countries and the impact is found to be more in tea trade.
- According to officials at the Tea Board, it is concerned about the rising cost of production
  and proper price realization of the product. Tea prices are steady to lower in southern India
  and it has increased slightly in northern India. Most of the members of the association
  produce tea of medium grade which with a reasonable market price is failing to match the
  increasing cost of production.
- Consumption of green tea is growing in the country amid increase in health awareness among people. Tata Global is planning to launch new green tea products and tap small towns. Green accounts for Rs.300 crore or 1.5% of total sales of about Rs.20,000 crore in India and consumption of green tea is growing by around 50% a year. Tata's Tetley green tea bags and packets have about 30% share of the green tea market in the country.
- The United Planters' Association of Southern India has asked the government for the removal of several levies imposed on tea plantations at a recent meeting of the association members. This is to save the sector that gives livelihood to 3.65 lakh workers and 70,000 small growers in south India alone.
- According to Tea Board officials, Burundi's revenues from its tea exports declined 6 percent in the first nine months to September from the same period a year ago due to higher volumes of the commodity on the global market.

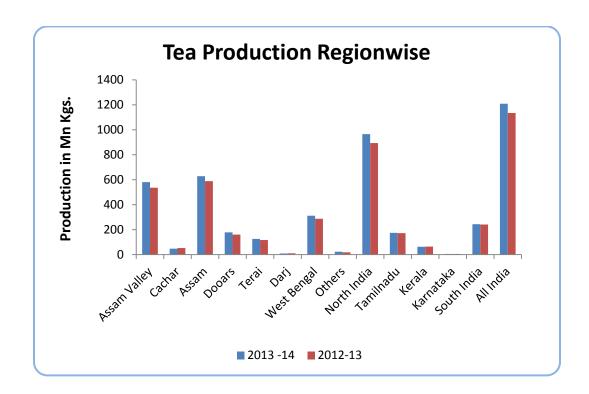

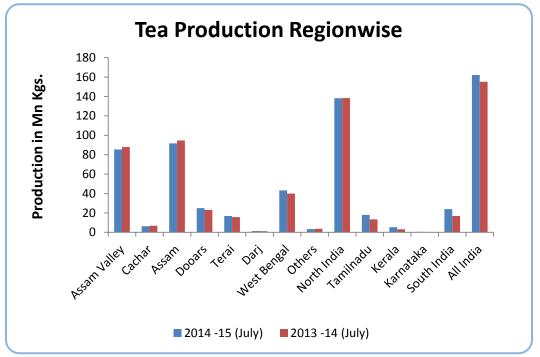

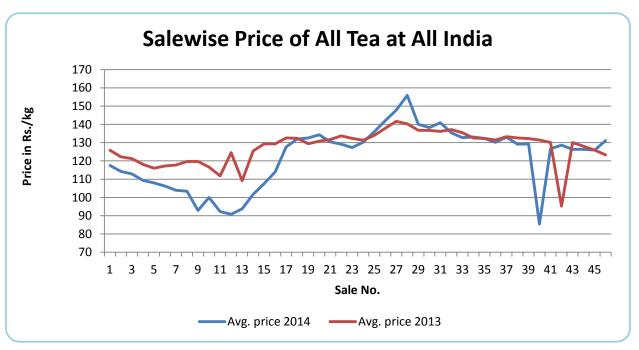
The above graph shows production comparison region wise during the last two years and in the month of May in comparison with previous year. In the year 2014 (Apr –Mar), production increased by 6.5% to 1208.78 million kgs mainly on account of increase in production in Assam. In the current year in the month of May, production of tea in India declined by 11.8% to 91.41 million kgs. in comparison with the same period last year following lack of suitable temperature and rainfall in north India.

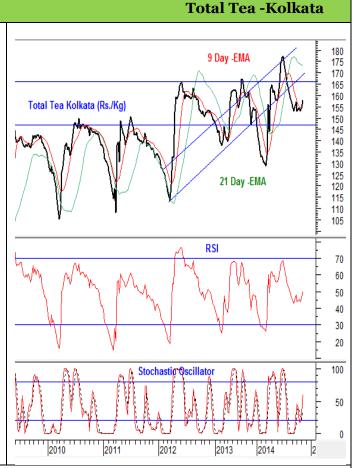


## **Tea – Technical Outlook**

Tea prices continued positive tone during the week. Prices are holding below the uptrend channel in the weekly chart. Prices are in between 9 – Day and 21 –Day EMA supporting sideways to firm tone in the medium – term. Stochastic oscillator is increasing in the neutral region supporting firm tone in the coming days.

The tea prices are likely to continue firm tone in the coming days. Buyers can purchase around current levels for their near –term requirement.

Tea prices at Bangladesh tea auction increased during the week amid good demand in the market. Demand for quality leaf lent some support to the market. The average price of tea during this week's auction was around USD 2.34/kg. Around 2.80 million kgs of tea was offered for sale and nearly 22 percent remained unsold.

There was good demand from blenders and some buying interest from loose tea buyers. 41,828 packages and 341 packages CTC Leaf of previous season noticed good demand. 6,220 packages and 60 packages of teas of old season on offer of CTC Dust noticed good demand around lower levels. In CTC Dust, good liquoring varieties were firm and medium levels noticed easy tone. Good liquoring Broken varieties noticed demand around lower levels. Good liquoring varieties in fannings also noticed certain withdrawals during the week. Good liquoring Dusts noticed firm tone during the week.
