

News Highlights.

- Vacuum packed teas from a bought —leaf factory are ready to make appearance at the Guwahati Tea Auction Centre (GTAC). Monkhooli Tea Company, based in Tinsukia, is offering the teas at the auction centre's sale number 26 on July 1, 2015. The advantage of vacuum packing is that it enhances the shelf life of tea, which helps to get better prices.
- Small tea growers, who contribute nearly 35 per cent of India's output, are dissatisfied with the issue of pricing of the teas grown by them. The Small Tea Growers sell their produce as green tea leaves to the Bought Leaf Factories (BLF) at around Rs.2 to Rs.3 per kg.
- The Small Tea Growers are feeling of the opinion that they are not getting a fair price for their labour and the Bought Leaf Factories are resentful of the recent directives on buying teas from the sector. It usually takes 4.5 kg of green leaves to make 1 kg of made tea. Around two lakh growers are affected if the prices are not right.
- During the last 100 years, the average temperature has increased by 1.3 degrees Celsius in Assam and annual rainfall has declined by 7.87 inches. Over the last 30 years, rainfall has become unpredictable. Higher temperature helps pests to infest the plant shoots. The farmers in turn have to use pesticides, which increases production costs and health. According to the research done by Tea Research Association, the solution lies in better water management according to the research done by Tea Research Association.
- According to the Federation of All India Tea Traders Association, excessive heat in May and
 early June has affected tea consumption in western India. In Maharashtra, consumption has
 declined amid dryness in the weather. However industry sources are hopeful of increase in
 consumption in the coming days with the onset of monsoon. Tea prices are likely to increase by
 10% in the coming months following increase in service tax, crude oil prices and packaging
 cost.
- According to the state Labour Minister of West Bengal, the state government will set up a board
 to be known as the West Bengal Tea Plantation Employees Welfare Board to look after the
 wellbeing of the employees. The wages of the employees have gone up and steps are on to reopen seven closed tea gardens.
- The small tea growers in Assam are happy as the Tea Board of India has accepted their long-standing demand to sell the organic tea varieties including the green tea manufactured by then



through Guwahati Tea Auction Centre (GTAC). This will help in getting over the monopoly of big-time tea companies in the tea auction chain in the country.

- There are over 1.18 lakh small tea producers in Assam who used to produce an average of over 82 million kgs of organic tea per year that accounts for about 31 per cent of the total tea produced in Assam, the biggest the producer in the country. Since the year 2009 these small tea growers have been selling the organic tea manufactured by them in the domestic as well as the international markets in Australia, Canada, Spain, Switzerland etc., on their own, outside the official tea auction chain in the country.
- Kenyan tea firms like Williamson Tea and Kapchorua Tea reported loss for the year to March 2015, following weak tone of the prices. Prices have declined during the year amid supply glut. Tea earnings, one of Kenya's main sources of foreign exchange has declined amid glut in the global market. According to official sources, prices have been weak through the year as large unsold tea stocks from other producers within Kenya have provided buyers with the unwelcome luxury of too much tea.
- The government of Vietnam has sanctioned a plan to privatiseprivatize the country's biggest tea exporter, state-owned Vietnam Tea Corporation (Vinatea). According to official sources, strategic investors will be offered a stake of 63.74 percent, other investors will be offered 31.86 per cent and employees will hold around 4.4 per cent. An initial public offering of \$17 million is likely to be carried out by September.






The above graph shows region wise production comparison, during the last two years and in the month of May in comparison with previous year. In the year 2014 (Apr –Mar), production increased by 6.5% to 1208.78 million kgs mainly on account of increase in production in Assam. In the current year in the month of May, production of tea in India declined by 11.8% to 91.41 million kgs. in comparison to the same period last year following lack of suitable temperature and rainfall in north India.



During the week good demand noticed for 8,542,152 kilos of tea on offer. Brighter DUST1s were higher USC10 to USC28, with mediums ranging between USC12 to USC34 higher and prices of lower mediums were USC14 to USC36 above last week's levels to lower. Prices of Brighter BP1's were higher up to USC18, prices of mediums were USC14 to USC30 higher and prices of lower mediums were firm up to USC20. Other varieties like Brighter Pdusts, Lower Medium PF1's noticed mixed tone during the week.

In the secondary catalogues, BP's and PF's noticed firm tone during the week. Well sorted clean coloury Fannings noticed firm tone and Dusts noticed positive tone during the week. Other Fannings noticed firm tone and BMF's noticed weak tone. There was good buying interest from Pakistan packers, Egyptian packers and Afghanistan. There was more interest from Yemen, other Middle – Eastern countries, Kazakhstan, other CIS countries and Sudan. There was good demand from UK, Kazakhstan and other CIS countries and less demand from Iran. There was some buying support from Russia and Somalia.

Tea prices at Bangladesh tea auction declined during the week amid good supply of new leaf in the market. The average price of tea during this week's auction was around USD 2.50/kg. Around 1.23 million kgs of tea was offered for sale and nearly 11 percent remained unsold.

There was good demand from blenders and some demand from loose tea buyers. 17,523 packages and 234 packages of CTC Leaf of old season noticed good demand. 4,696 packages and 1 package of old season on offer of CTC Dust noticed fair buying interest. In CTC Dust, good liquoring varieties noticed easy tone and medium levels noticed steady tone. Good liquoring Broken varieties noticed demand at lower prices. Good liquoring varieties in fannings noticed weak tone during the week. Good liquoring Dusts noticed easy tone during the week.

World tea production has been increasing over the years. With more medicinal value of tea being highlighted, the consumption is set to increase in the coming years. However in the previous year, global black tea output declined to 2019.13 mkg compared to 2027.5 mkg in 2013. India's production declined by 16.06 mkg to 1127.21 mkg. According to Indian Tea Association, consumption of tea is increasing at an annual rate of 3 per cent. In the current financial year in India, production of tea is likely to be more in the coming months following good rains in the tea growing regions in the months of April and May.

Overall Outlook and Recommendation:

In the domestic market, prices noticed firm tone except slight weakness at Cochin and Coimbatore auction centres. Quantity offered on sale increased during the week compared to previous week. Arrivals are increasing during the last few days amid favourable weather in the tea growing regions. The third flush of tea is expected in the market by next month onwards. Good demand from exporters and loose tea buyers supported the market. Prices are likely to notice range –bound to firm tone in the coming days.

In the global market, prices noticed firm tone except at Bangladesh tea auction centre. Tea prices declined at Bangladesh tea auction centre amid ample supply of the new leaf. Quantity offered on sale increased during the week compared to previous week. In Kenya, prices have declined amid supply glut in the market. Future offering of tea will decline in Srilanka and Indonesia. Prices are likely to notice firm tone in the near –term.

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
