

News Highlights.

- Tea Board has announced the average price for green leaf in various regions of Nilgiris. The average green leaf price has been calculated based on weekly auction average price of CTC teas pertaining to the region concerned. Thus, the Board has now announced the average green leaf price for last week for Kotagiri as `11.41 a kg (average CTC tea price: `70.22 a kg), Coonoor `10.84 (`66.69), Gudalur `10.42 (`64.14), Panthalur `10.36 (`63.73), Ooty `9.33 ` 57.42) and Kundah `7.42 (`45.65). Farmers have been advised to sell their green leaf tea based on this average price.
- A number of tea gardens in Assam is likely to be converted into wildlife mini-sanctuaries to protect its fauna and reduce cases of man-animal conflict. With natural habitat depleting fast, more animals have been taking shelter in the tea estates and a sustainable comprehensive management plan is required. Tea gardens host a number of animals and migratory birds.
- Arunachal Pradesh is likely to make a revolution in the tea industry as more and more farmers are opting for growing tea under a promotional scheme launched by the state government. The state government has been promoting tea cultivation under the Chief Minister's mission mode project (MMP). Officials at the Trade & Commerce department disclosed that assistance in the form of planting material 13,000 tea saplings and barbed wire for 1 hectare per beneficiary is being provided by the state government.
- Allocation of Rs. 5 crore has been announced in the recent budget for promoting tea cultivation in 2015-16. Similarly, 465 tea units were established in 2013-14 while in 2012-13, 285 units were established with financial assistance of Rs. 3 crore. According to official sources, the state government will closely work with Tea Board of India for technology guidance, technology transfer and extending marketing facilities.
- Tea lovers in the country will be able to enjoy Nilgiri tea premium tea grades, produced in Chinese and Japanese style from the leaves plucked at a height of over 7000 feet above mean sea level. These leaves will be plucked from Chamraj and Korakundah estates owned by the United Nilgiri Tea Estates Co Ltd. (Unitea). These teas packed in attractive containers are available for Indian consumers and have also many health benefits.
- According to the Assam government, electrification of 782 tea estates will be done in a phased manner as part of its plan to roll out people –centric measures in the coming days. Installation of separate meters for every household will be completed in a phased manner benefiting the residents of the tea estates.

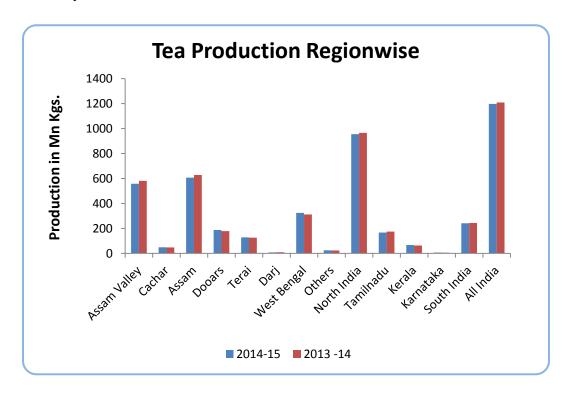

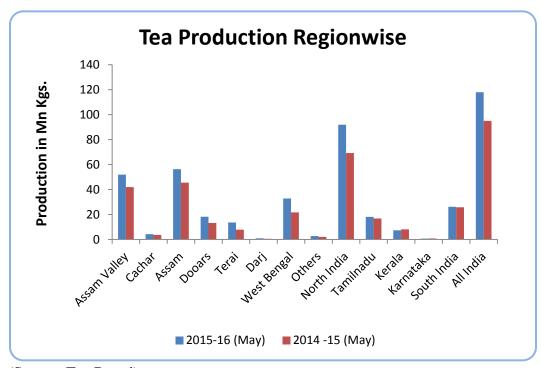

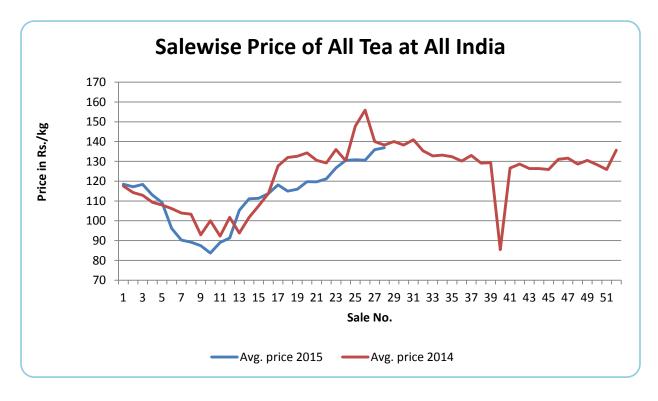
The above graph shows region wise production comparison, during the last two years and in the month of May in comparison with previous year. In the year 2014 (Apr –Mar), production increased by 6.5% to 1208.78 million kgs mainly on account of increased in production in Assam. In the current year in the month of May, production of tea in India declined by 11.8% to 91.41 million kgs. in comparison to the same period last year following lack of suitable temperature and rainfall in north India.

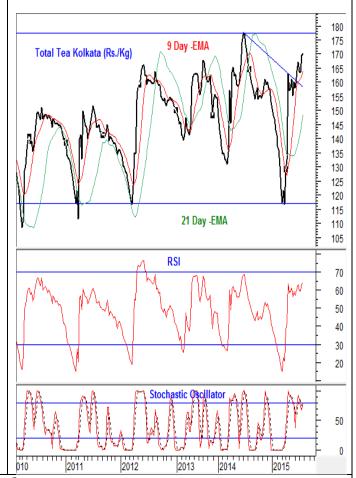
Tea – Technical Outlook

RSI is increasing in the neutral region supporting positive tone in the near – term. Prices are likely to continue the firm tone towards 200 levels in the coming days. Traders should consider buying on any near –term weakness.

The below best and plainer variety noticed easy tone during the week. With better quality tea expected in the coming weeks, demand is expected to improve in the coming days. There was fair buying interest from Turkey, Russia and Iraq.

Brighter DUST1s were USC2 to USC12 higher, with mediums USC2 to USC38 higher and prices of lower mediums were USC16 higher to USC10 lower. Prices of Brighter BP1's were USC12 to USC24 higher, prices of mediums were higher up to USC24 and prices of lower mediums noticed mixed tone and higher to lower up to USC5. Other varieties like Brighter Pdusts, Lower Medium PF1's noticed mixed tone during the week.

In the secondary catalogues, BP's and PF's noticed firm tone during the week. Well sorted clean coloury Fannings noticed easy tone and Dusts noticed mixed tone during the week. Other Fannings noticed firm tone and BMF's noticed steady tone. There was good buying interest from Afghanistan, Egyptian packers, Pakistan packers, UK, Kazakhstan and other CIS states. There was some demand from Yemen and other middle –eastern countries. Demand remained subdued from Russia, Sudan and Bazaar. Somalia was active around lower levels of the market.

Tea prices at Bangladesh tea auction declined during the week amidowing to higher supplies and less demand in the market around current levels. The average price of tea during this week's auction was around USD 2.50/kg. Around 1.70 million kgs of tea was offered for sale and nearly 2 percent remained unsold.

In the current year, global output of tea is likely to decline following output reduction in output in Kenya. Global tea production till date has declined to 566.55 million kg compared to 586.63 million kgs during the previous year. Output has declined following production decline in production in Kenya, the largest producer of black tea in the world. It's production has declined to 105.42 million kg compared to 152.05 million kg during the previous year. Production has also declined in other African countries like Malawi and Uganda. In North India and South India, production has increased by nearly 22% and 8% respectively till May 2015. Good rains in the beginning of July is are likely to support production of third flush of tea in North India.

Overall Outlook and Recommendation:

In the domestic market, prices noticed range —bound to weak tone. Quantity offered on sale increased during the week compared to previous week. Arrival of the new crop is lower following due to rain in certain tea growing regions. Arrival of third flush of tea has started in North India. Good rain in the beginning of July is likely to support production of third flush of tea. Buying interest was noticed from exporters. Good demand is expected for the third flush of tea in the near —term. Prices are likely to notice range —bound to firm tone in the coming days.

In the global market, prices noticed mixed tone. Prices firmed up in the Indonesian market and noticed weak tone in other markets. Quantity offered on sale declined during the week compared to previous week. Ample supply of new leaf weighed on prices at Bangladesh tea auction. Dry weather in Vietnam is likely to affect the crop to certain extent. Future offering of tea is likely to decline in Sri Lanka and increase in Indonesia tea auctions centers. Prices are likely to notice range —bound to firm tone in the near —term.

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
