

Wheat Domestic Fundamentals:

According to a Government official, the food ministry has proposed to halve the allocation of free rice and wheat to 2.5 kg per month but keep pulses at 1 kg. The food ministry has suggested tweaks in the free food grain plan, including a reduction in allocations, after the finance ministry indicated it is not keen on extending the scheme beyond November because of the strained fiscal situation. The food ministry has also proposed monthly extensions to the plan after reviewing the budgetary situation

According to traders, Prices of Wheat in Jaipur, Rajasthan, rose today because of an increase in demand from bulk buyers for Diwali, traders said. Arrivals were pegged steady at 5,500 bags (1 bag = 100 kg). At Indore in Madhya Pradesh, prices of wheat were unchanged because of steady demand. Arrivals were pegged steady at 3,000 bags (1 bag = 100 kg).

The effect of stopping the wheels of goods trains in Punjab will affect the sowing of wheat. The agriculture department has only 7% Urea and 71% DAP fertilizer stock left. If trains do not run in time, farmers will not get Urea and DAP fertilizer. In such a situation, farmers may face difficulties in sowing wheat this year.

On Sunday, the Punjab government approved Wheat Seed Subsidy Policy-2020-21 of the Agriculture Department to provide certified wheat seed at 50% subsidy to farmers in the Rabi season. A total of 1.85 lakh quintals of certified seed, with Rs 18.50 crore worth of subsidy, will directly benefit approximately 2.5 lakh farmers under the policy.

As the government looks to liquidate its mounting stocks of wheat, flour millers have advised it to lower the rate at which wheat is sold for open market operations by Rs 500 a quintal. It sells its good quality wheat at Rs 2,135 a quintal and luster loss wheat at Rs 2,080 a quintal. Flour millers are demanding a further reduction of Rs 500/quintal in this price as it has not been revised since last December.

The central government may soon announce to carry forward the scheme till March of giving ration to the country's poor people for free under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana. If Govt. increases the scheme till next year then prices are going to impact.

The trend of roller flour millers in the Punjab state is on the local purchase of wheat. Till now, the state's millers were buying wheat from Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan at low prices. Millers claim that more than 3 lakh tonnes of wheat have been sourced from other countries in Punjab since April, but now the FCI procurement has started increasing due to the rate competitiveness. Millers argue that the entire trend of wheat procurement will depend on government policies in the coming times.

According to the traders, there are low chances of any downward movement in wheat in the coming days as the impact of the Covid-19 is diminishing, and economic activity is improving. The scheme of free wheat and rice can be extended further, which will impact the prices from the current level, while prices in mandis are increasing now due to less supply from FCI and low arrivals in mandis.

International Market Update:

Prices of Australian wheat offered in Asia slid this week below Black Sea values for the first time in at least four years, with the country forecast to harvest a near-record crop. Australia Premium White (APW) wheat is being quoted at \$275 a tonne, including (C&F), compared with a similar quality of Black Sea wheat at \$285 a tonne. Price is likely to drop further as the crop looks good. For the first quarter, Asian wheat buyers will shift to Australia because Prices are cheaper, and the quality is good.

In Pakistan, Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) has decided to propose to the Cabinet Rs 1600 as minimum support price (MSP) for wheat crop for fiscal year 2020-2021.

Argentine farmers are expected to harvest 16.8 million tonnes of wheat this season, the Buenos Aires Grains Exchange said in its weekly crop report on Thursday, citing months of dry weather as its reason for cutting its previous 17.5 million tonne estimate. Argentine wheat is harvested in December and January, with most of each crop exported to neighboring Brazil.

The Ukrainian wheat market was slow with a low buying interest. Offers for 11.5% protein wheat FOB Ukraine Panamax
