

Wheat Domestic Fundamentals:

According to the Uttar Pradesh government, this time the state government has achieved a new record of wheat procurement. According to the state government, in the last 12 days, one lakh m from the farmers. Tons of wheat have been purchased. The government said that in view of the Corona crisis many new initiatives have been taken this time.

According to the Uttar Pradesh government, this time the Rajasthan government has achieved a new record of wheat procurement. According to the state government, in the last 12 days, 1 lakh MT of wheat has been purchased from the farmers. The government said that in view of the Corona crisis many new initiatives have been taken this time.

Haryana Government on Monday halted the wheat procurement process in 18 mandis of six districts of the state as these were full of procured wheat which was yet to be sent for storage, leading to a space crunch. The process in these mandis will remain suspended for the next 24 hours, as arrangements are being made to set up additional procurement centres. The state government has instructed farmers not to bring their crop to mandis till these centres are functional.

Procurement of wheat has recently commenced in Rabi Marketing Season (RMS) 2021-22 in Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Uttrakhand, Chandigarh, Delhi and Gujarat at MSP, Till April 11, a quantity of 29.24 lakh tonnes of wheat has been procured benefitting 3,30,046 farmers with MSP value of Rs. 5774.20 crore,"

Haryana Govt on Monday ordered to stop the purchase of wheat in 18 mandis of the State for 24 hours due to excess arrival of wheat in these mandis. The decision was taken in a review meeting regarding ongoing rabi procurement season 2021-22 held under the CM Manohar Lal Khattar at his residence here. The farmers of the other states are already barred from entering mandis in Haryana till further orders. For this, the Director General of Police has been directed to set up checkpoints at state borders.

Possibility of hailstorm with heavy rains at many places from Jammu and Kashmir to Uttarakhand. Heatwave is likely in the southern districts of Rajasthan, Vidarbha, Gujarat, and Madhya Pradesh. Light rain is accompanied by dust storms in Punjab, Haryana, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, and South. Madhya Pradesh may receive rain at the end of the week

As per trade sources, India has exported around 3.70 lakh tonnes Wheat in the month of February-2021 at an average FOB of \$263 per tonnes, higher this year and the major destinations were Bangladesh, Malaysia, Oman, Qatar and Nepal. Exports are likely to be at higher side as other countries are providing wheat at higher prices. High export will be going to support the domestic market in near term.

Due to rising COVID-19 cases and late crop maturity, wheat procurement in Punjab has been rescheduled few days late from April 10 following the state government's request, according to the Union Food Ministry. In Haryana Wheat procurement is going to start from April 1. Under the farmer movement, the state government is looking very serious about purchasing crops this year.

International Market Update:

Wheat prices fell across all major exporting countries since last month's WASDE with improved winter wheat conditions in several key production regions. Furthermore, some importers are delaying purchases awaiting the upcoming harvest in anticipation of lower new crop prices. The biggest reduction over the past month has been for Russia, where crop prospects have improved, and export quotes have eased amid the current export policies, including the announcement of floating taxes for the new crop year. Its quotes are currently the most competitive. EU quotes have also eased and remain slightly above Russia. Argentine quotes have fallen modestly with slowing farmer sales. Australian quotes have edged somewhat lower with new supplies but remain supported by strong demand from Asian markets. Quotes from Canada are currently the highest among major suppliers.

Argentine farmers are expected to plant over 7.0 million hectares of wheat in 2021/22, up 4% compared to 2020/21, announced the agriculture ministry. The ministry also predicted that farmers could export as much as 14.0 MMT of wheat in 2021/22.

Farmers in Ukraine are nearly a month behind their planting schedule that usually begins at the end of February. Snow and wet conditions kept farmers out of their fields until the end of March. Russian wheat farmers are also delayed but only by about ten days. One analyst put planting 70% behind the same time last year but added that he is optimistic farmers can catch up. SovEcon raised Russia's wheat production forecast to 79.3 MMT. Ukraine's economy minister said Ukraine will not reach its 17.5 MMT wheat quota this season following slower than expected wheat exports. He noted that
